At Shirley Sagawa's suggestion I am writing to request a meeting with you and appropriate members of the Office of National Service Staff and the Boards of Directors of the National Association of Foster Grandparent Program Directors, the National Association of Senior Companion Project Directors, and the National Association of Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) Directors.

These three national boards meet regularly in Washington each fall to conduct Association business, to interact with ACTION staff, and to visit elected officials on Capitol Hill. In this milestone year of change, the Directors are most interested in meeting ONS staff, having ONS staff meet them, receive briefings from you on what changes can be expected with the development of the new Corporation, and together explore ways that the National Associations can be helpful in working with you.

This year the Boards of the National Association of Foster Grandparent Program Directors and the National Association of Senior Companion Project Directors will be meeting jointly in Washington early during the week of September 12, and the National Association of RSVP Directors will meet the following week. The FGP and SCP Directors expect to meet with ACTION staff at the ACTION Agency Tuesday afternoon, September 14, and the RSVP Directors will meet at ACTION Tuesday afternoon, September 21.

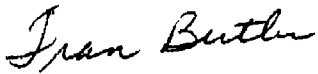
We would very much like to meet with you and ONS staff Tuesday morning, September 14, for FGP and SCP, and Tuesday morning, September 21 for RSVP. We would be pleased to come to your offices for these meetings. I am entirely sympathetic to your need to support the goals of national service through creation of an integrated and efficient organization that is housed in efficient and functional premises. In addition, I personally toured the 1100 Vermont Building and agree that it is problematic and certainly less than ideal for your use and the culture you hope to create.

However, there is confusion about the economics of various alternatives.

- o ACTION is indeed paying \$36/sf but GSA, as the actual tenant in the 1100 Vermont Building, is paying \$31/sf.
- o The \$31.00 in the housing alternatives I sent you is what the government (ie. taxpayer) pays the landlord. For a variety of reasons (that we are changing) ACTION pays the GSA \$36.00. All of my analysis is done on the basis of real rent cost to the government. New space in Option (1) will cost the government \$35.00 - If our new initiatives are successful we will only charge ACTION \$35.00. Another option will cost the government \$31.00 - again if we only charge ACTION \$31.00 - then there would be a "savings" to ACTION of \$5.00 but not to the taxpayer.
- o While it is true that private sector landlords will frequently provide a "full" build-out, it is typically reflected in the rental rate. Nevertheless, current GSA policy provides a "standard" - value build-out to all tenants and, to support appropriate oversight, requires agencies to fund "over-standard" or excess improvements from their own funds.



- o ACTION does indeed have the right to terminate its lease. Like all Federal agencies, they can elect to relocate upon 120 - days notice. GSA however remains obligated to the landlord at 1100 Vermont 2 through 1999. The 4-month period of vacancy is not actually a lease-up interval but the time required to reconfigure and build-out the space for a new tenant.
- o There also seems to be a misunderstanding about GSA's role and current process. It is not technically possible at this time for you to lease space using a private broker and we (or you) would not have been able to enter directly into negotiations with the landlord of the preferred buildings. Competition statutes require that we advertise to fulfill your requirement.

Eli, it was my direction that we not lease any net, new square footage that actually halted the advertisement for your requirement. I was looking at this transaction from the perspective of the government as a whole and the economics of trying to continue to occupy ACTION's current premises seemed persuasive to me.

There may be one or two other alternatives that we could explore and I'd like to suggest that we meet on Friday if your schedule permits.
