RE: Kosova and sanctions

Thank you for coming to the Hill to brief me on U.S. policy toward Kosova and Albania. I think this was a valuable meeting which helped broaden my understanding of U.S. policy toward the region. I hope that you found the meeting equally useful.

I would like to call to your attention an issue which has arisen regarding U.S. policy on sanctions against Serbia. As you stated in our meeting, at least some of the sanctions against Belgrade should remain in place until conditions in Kosova improve. I firmly agree with this position.

Your statement reflects the long-standing policy of the United States. For example, on February 11, 1994, Under Secretary of State Peter Tarnoff stated that "because of the situation in the Krajina and the unsettled conditions in Kosovo, some of the sanctions regime should remain in place until there is a final settlement in those two areas. . . ." In a hearing of the Foreign Affairs Committee on February 24, 1994, Secretary of State Christopher specifically endorsed those comments. He added, "I think that sanctions should not be lifted focusing solely on Bosnia but the focus should be on the broader need to prevent a spread of the conflict to other areas as well."

However, in prepared testimony for an October 5, 1995 hearing of the Subcommittee on Europe and the Middle East on the situation in Kosova, Ambassador Robert C. Frasure, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European and Canadian Affairs, countered that "we have not linked economic and trade sanctions to Kosovo, but we do agree that full normalization of relations with Serbia should not resume until an equitable solution is reached." Similarly, in a letter on September 7, 1994, Assistant Secretary Wendy Sherman, commenting on the Kosova Peace and Democracy Act, a bill I introduced which conditions the lifting of sanctions upon improvements in Kosova, stated that "the Department of State

opposes full normalization of relations with the "FRY" until the situation in Kosovo has been resolved."

I am deeply concerned that there is now confusion in U.S. policy regarding the principle of conditioning the lifting of sanctions against Serbia upon conditions in Kosova. In additional questions I submitted to the State Department following the Kosova hearing, I inquire about this discrepancy in our policy.

I would greatly appreciate if you could contact the relevant players at the State Department to clear-up this apparent confusion. I believe that the State Department's answers to my supplemental questions provide a suitable opportunity for State to clarify its position.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me or my staff.

Thanks again for taking the time to meet about these important subjects.

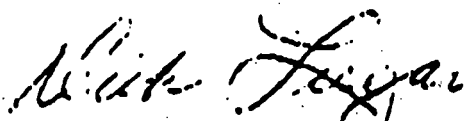

This strategy, like the strategy of lifting the arms embargo raises serious questions which merit your review. How would our NATO allies react to such a proposal? How would the factions in Bosnia likely react? Would such an approach be enforceable? Could we find economic incentives to make the proposal attractive to the factions?

If feasible, we believe a proposal along these lines could garner broad support in the Congress and could set the stage for renewed efforts to develop a negotiated settlement of the Bosnian crisis. We know that the lifting of the arms embargo has met with significant implementation obstacles. A build-down policy may have similar disadvantages. We therefore urge you to conduct an immediate policy review of such a strategy to assess its merit.

As you consider this alternative approach to the current legal requirement for the President to request a multilateral lifting of the arms embargo, we would also appreciate your assessment of the outcome of compliance with current law, in view of the recent changes of policy by the governments of Serbia and Bosnia-Herzegovina.

Dear Sam:

I am pleased to respond to your letter of September 30, 1994 asking me to review the military impact of a build down strategy.

You present an intriguing concept. Bosnia build down is a conceptual breakthrough that captures the moral high ground on this issue--namely, that there is another way to level the battlefield. Rather than increase arms through lifting the embargo, we may be able to reduce the number of available weapons through a regulated process.

Indeed our current Bosnia policy might be seen as the first phase of a build down strategy. Our commitment to robust enforcement of the exclusion zones and our effort to seal the border between Serbia and Bosnia-Herzegovina represent the first steps in an arms reduction process. An interagency team is working to develop a phased strategy that would move from these early steps to a more comprehensive build down of all heavy weapons, including tanks, artillery, and heavy mortars. Obviously, we will need to address a number of difficult questions about verification, enforcement, assurances against circumvention, and economic incentives that might make the proposal more attractive. We are confident that we can find solutions to these problems, and we will keep you informed as we proceed. We are extremely grateful to you and Dick Lugar for developing the concept and bringing it to our attention.

You asked for our assessment of the outcome of compliance with the current law. We intend to abide fully by the intent of the law. If the Bosnians Serbs have not accepted the Contact Group's proposal by October 15, the President intends within two weeks of that date to introduce and support a UN Security Council Resolution to terminate the arms embargo on Bosnia-Herzegovina. We are considering various formulations of the lift resolution that would delay implementation for six months, as President Izetbegovic proposed at the United Nations last week.

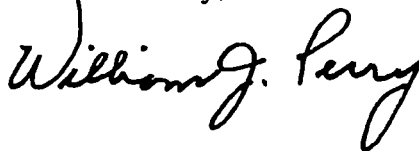
With respect to the limitation on the use of funds in Section 1404(f)(2), we are reviewing our rules of engagement and will make any changes necessary to comply with the law. We also intend fully to maintain the arms embargo on Serbia and to that end will continue our operations in the Adriatic. In his statement on signing the bill the President noted that it would not affect the

US government's ability to participate in activities in the Adriatic needed to enforce sanctions against Serbia.

The President has also agreed that if no UN resolution on multilateral lift is passed within a reasonable period of time, he will consult with the Congress on next steps, to include the possibility of unilaterally lifting the embargo. In our view, this step should be considered after all other remedies are exhausted. The consequences of unilateral lift are perilous: Americanizing the conflict, as well as prolonging and intensifying it; precipitating an arms race; souring relations with our NATO and UN allies; undermining the partnership we are building with Russia; causing retaliatory attacks on UNPROFOR and the collapse of its mission; and in the end not offering any guarantee of ultimate success on the battlefield.

We appreciate your willingness to work with us in finding a solution to the complex and seemingly intractable problem of bringing peace to Bosnia. You have my assurance that we will consult regularly and work with you at every opportunity.

Dear Bill:

We are writing to ask you to conduct an expedited policy review of the military impact of a build down strategy as an alternative to the lifting of the United Nations Arms Embargo on the government of Bosnia Herzegovina.

As you know, there is strong support in the Congress for reducing the disparities in defense capability among the parties involved in the conflict in Bosnia. Some members of Congress have supported a unilateral lifting of the embargo, others have favored a multilateral lifting that would involve our NATO allies who have troops on the ground with the UNPROFOR forces.

All versions of the lift strategy have the downside that the introduction of more arms, especially heavy armament, could increase the level of violence in Bosnia and thus run counter to the widely shared objective of ending the military conflict. Our allies have been particularly concerned about this prospect, and have stated their intention to withdraw their troops from UNPROFOR if the arms embargo on the Bosnian government is lifted. They are convinced that such a move would lead to a significant increase in violence in Bosnia including Serbian attacks on allied troops.

The recent change of policy by the government of Bosnia Herzegovina regarding the timing of a lift of the arms embargo, and the recent closing of the Serbian-Bosnian border has provided the opportunity for a new US approach which could lead to the leveling of the field in Bosnia we have sought, while also leading to a reduction in violence. This new approach would be to eliminate the heavy equipment held by all sides in Bosnia in a step by step process. We feel this approach warrants a serious and comprehensive review at the highest levels within the Department of Defense.

The build down concept is the flip side of the idea of lifting the arms embargo on the Bosnian government. The idea would be to level the ground by eliminating all or most of the heavy equipment on both sides by either destroying it or removing it from Bosnia. This could apply to all tanks, artillery, and

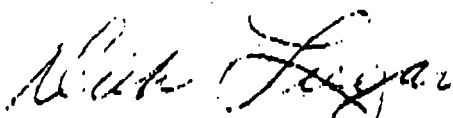

This strategy, like the strategy of lifting the arms embargo raises serious questions which merit your review. How would our NATO allies react to such a proposal? How would the factions in Bosnia likely react? Would such an approach be enforceable? Could we find economic incentives to make the proposal attractive to the factions?

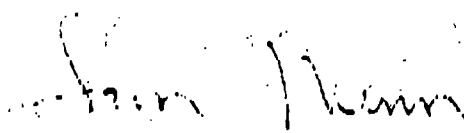
If feasible, we believe a proposal along these lines could garner broad support in the Congress and could set the stage for renewed efforts to develop a negotiated settlement of the Bosnian crisis. We know that the lifting of the arms embargo has met with significant implementation obstacles. A build-down policy may have similar disadvantages. We therefore urge you to conduct an immediate policy review of such a strategy to assess its merit.

As you consider this alternative approach to the current legal requirement for the President to request a multilateral lifting of the arms embargo, we would also appreciate your assessment of the outcome of compliance with current law, in view of the recent changes of policy by the governments of Serbia and Bosnia-Herzegovina.
