**STATEMENT BY LT.GEN. BERNARD JANVIER, FORCE COMMANDER OF
UNITED NATIONS PEACE FORCES**

Last night at 2200 hours air strikes against Bosnian Serb targets were suspended for 72 hours. This suspension was agreed between NATO and the United Nations following an offer by Serb leaders conveyed to me by the US Assistant Secretary of State, Mr. Richard Holbrooke. The offer consisted of a framework agreement which satisfies the conditions set in my letter to General Mladic of 3 September. The temporary suspension of air strikes will allow Bosnian Serb forces to fulfil these conditions in safety. Provision has also been made in the framework agreement to progress from a local cease fire around Sarajevo to a broader cessation of hostilities throughout Bosnia-Herzegovina.

The framework agreement was drawn up by Serb leaders in Belgrade. It was signed by Dr. Karadzic, Professor Koljevic, Mr. Krajisnik, and General Mladic, and it was witnessed by President Milosevic of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. I am grateful to Mr. Richard Holbrooke and his colleagues for their tireless efforts to assist the Serbs in taking this important step towards peace.

During this 72 hour suspension we expect to see a complete cessation of all offensive operations within the Sarajevo exclusion zone, and a start towards withdrawal of heavy weapons beyond the limits of the exclusion zone. All heavy weapons should be withdrawn within 6 days.

In addition, during the first 24 hours we expect to see unimpeded access to Sarajevo by road, including the Kiseljak and Hadzi routes, for UNPROFOR and humanitarian traffic. Sarajevo airport should also be open for unrestricted use by UNPROFOR and humanitarian traffic within the next 24 hours.

On Sunday evening, after air strikes have been suspended for 72 hours, Admiral Smith and I will assess the degree to which the Bosnian Serbs have complied with the terms of the framework agreement. If they are deemed to have complied, the suspension of air strikes will be extended for a further 72 hours, to permit complete relocation of Bosnian Serb heavy weapons beyond the limits of the Sarajevo exclusion zone.

If there are clear indications that the Bosnian Serbs have not complied with the terms of the agreement which their leaders have signed, then the air strikes may recommence at any

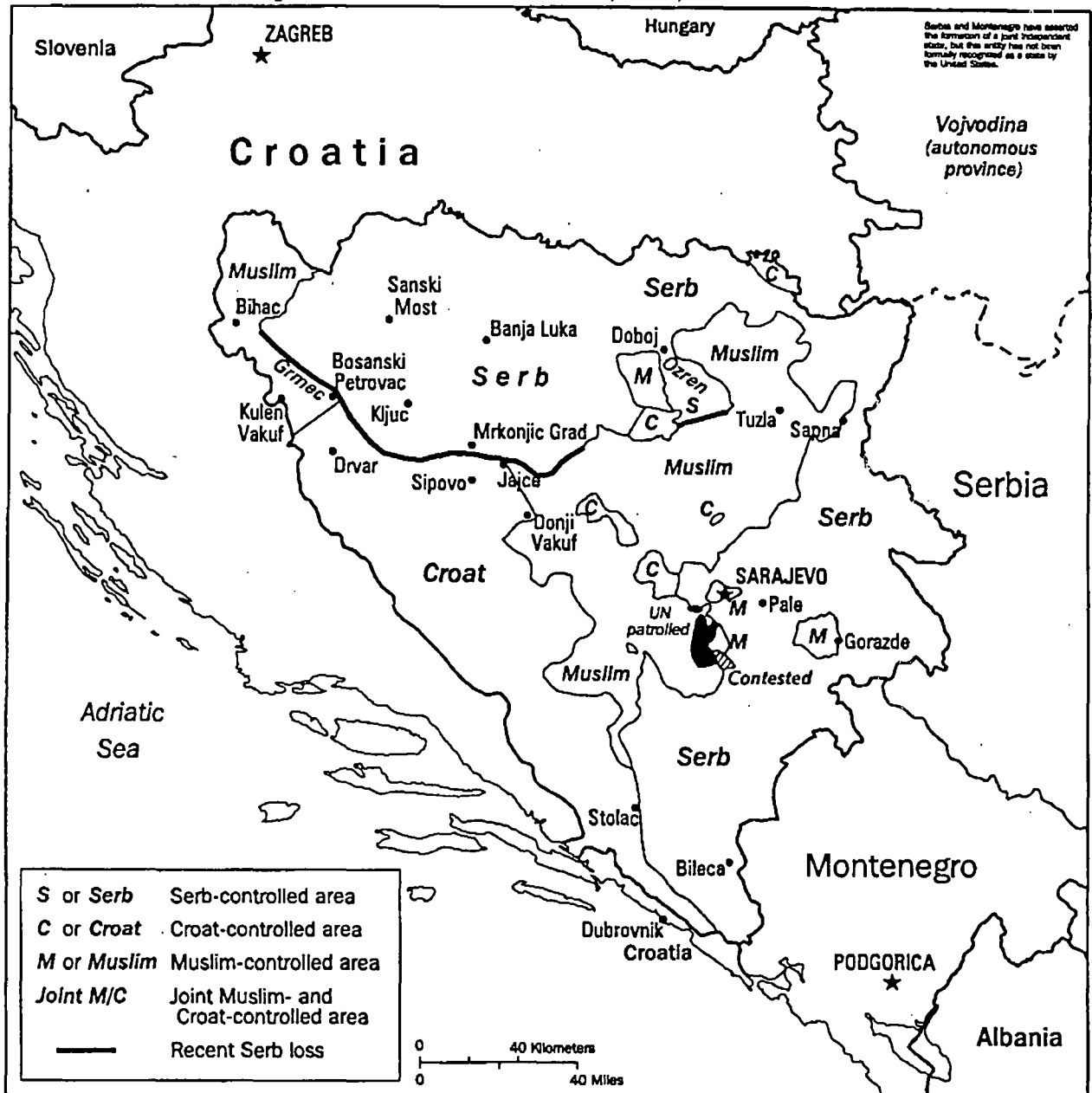

stage. The Bosnian Government has stated that it will refrain from all offensive operations within or from the Sarajevo exclusion zone.

Let me close by saying that this has been a difficult time for both the UN and NATO. Soldiers and airmen have put their lives at risk for peace, and will continue to do so. Aerial reconnaissance, combat air patrol and suppression of air defence missions will continue to be flown during the suspension of air strikes. NATO will continue search and rescue efforts for the downed pilots, and if necessary we will not hesitate to call for close air support missions to protect UN troops. Throughout this critical period, the close cooperation between NATO and the UN has been a source of strength in our common pursuit of a peaceful solution, acceptable to all the parties.

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MILITARY IMPLEMENTATION FORCE

-- Our thinking about the military implementation force (which we are calling the IFOR) is tentative.

- Obviously, anything we discuss could change in the light of developments in the peace process and after consultations with our allies and in the Security Council.

-- The military force will be one component of implementing the peace settlement.

- We expect that there will be a need for political implementation, economic reconstruction and financial assistance.

-- We anticipate a NATO-led and -staffed implementation force.

-- On this point, our position is settled: if NATO is to implement the peace settlement, NATO must have exclusive command and control over the military aspects of implementing the peace settlement. This will be true even if non-NATO forces assist in implementing the settlement.

- There will be no dual key.

-- The implementation force, we anticipate, might be authorized by the parties to the peace settlement.

- We probably would welcome the Security Council's approval of its operations. We do not now believe that the IFOR will be a U.N. peacekeeping operation.

-- It would probably be charged with enforcing the terms of the peace settlement, impartially and with whatever force its commander deems necessary, including overwhelming force.

- This might include such tasks as facilitating the withdrawal of forces to agreed separation lines; quelling violence in violation of the settlement; and facilitating as appropriate other international activities to implement the settlement.

- The force will of course defend itself assertively.

- 2 -

-- It is too soon to discuss the size of the force.

- We anticipate that it will be smaller than the force estimates to implement the Vance-Owen plan (up to 50,000) or to withdraw UNPROFOR.

-- The President has committed to provide U.S. ground forces as necessary to implement the peace settlement.

-- We have given some thought to the role of U.N. forces in implementing the peace settlement.

- UNPROFOR's mandate would be over once the peace settlement is endorsed. We would expect the Secretary General, perhaps with the Council's approval, to withdraw UNPROFOR troops not helping to implement the settlement.

- Many UNPROFOR troops might remain in Bosnia, however. UNPROFOR forces from NATO member states (especially the RRF) would presumably join the implementation force.

- It is also possible that some non-NATO forces now in UNPROFOR would have a role in implementing the peace settlement.

-- We anticipate that the implementation force would start its work quickly upon endorsement of a peace settlement.

- The peace implementation force should help ensure that the sides comply with the settlement. We do not anticipate that it will wait for signs of voluntary compliance before deploying.

- For example, RRF troops might deploy immediately to zones of separation agreed in the settlement, in order to start the implementation of the settlement without delay.

- Other forces would arrive in theater as quickly as possible. This should be a matter of weeks, not months.

-- We expect that there may be a role for some non-NATO forces in implementing a peace settlement.

- Our thinking on this is tentative and will evolve considerably as we learn more about the outlines of the peace settlement and about other states' views.

- We are, however, working on this actively to see what role non-NATO forces might play.

- I should emphasize again that exclusive NATO command and control would be essential.

-- We are working through the potential, practical difficulties associated with the plan. For example, it may be difficult to move a large peace implementation force into Bosnia just as UNPROFOR is leaving.

- Of course, the more UNPROFOR troops that remain to help implement the peace force, the smaller the logistical problem will become.

- I would appreciate your views on how many UNPROFOR troop contributors might be interested in remaining.

-- PROCESS: We will begin consulting in New York, Brussels, and with troop contributors as we learn more about the likely peace settlement.

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**STATEMENT ATTRIBUTABLE TO A SPOKESMAN FOR THE
SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE
UNITED NATIONS**

Following an agreement signed in Belgrade today by Bosnian Serb military and political leaders, in which they committed themselves to withdraw their heavy weapons from the 20km exclusion zone around Sarajevo, NATO and United Nations military commanders have judged this to be an appropriate response to the demands by the United Nations. Consequently, they have announced a three-day suspension in NATO air operations in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

At the end of this three-day period, NATO and UN commanders will assess the level of Serb compliance with their undertakings. Failure to comply, or attacks on the other safe areas, will lead to the resumption of air operations.

During the suspension, and on the basis of a similar commitment by the Serbs, humanitarian convoys will travel to Sarajevo on two roads through Serb territory that hitherto have been closed.

It is also expected that Sarajevo airport will shortly be re-opened without restrictions.

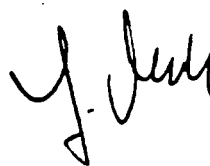

A Framework for A Cessation of Hostilities Within the Sarajevo TEZ

In an effort to further the American peace initiative, the Republica Srpska has agreed to the following framework for the immediate cessation of hostilities in the Sarajevo TEZ:

1. In the context of a cessation of hostilities, the Army of the Republica Srpska would cease all offensive operations within the Sarajevo TEZ and begin immediately to relocate substantial amounts of its heavy weapons beyond the limits of the Sarajevo TEZ with the aim of a complete relocation of heavy weapons within 144 hours.
2. NATO would suspend bombing for 72 hours to facilitate initiation of a cessation of hostilities within the Sarajevo TEZ.
3. The Government of the Republic of Bosnia-Herzegovina has stated that it will refrain from all offensive operations within or from the Sarajevo TEZ. It would be asked to present to UNPROFOR a listing of a substantial number of its heavy weapons locations within the TEZ, and thus enable UNPROFOR to monitor these weapons with the aim of complete monitoring of all BiH heavy weapons within the Sarajevo TEZ.
4. Within 24 hours of the beginning of the bombing suspension, unimpeded road access would be opened to Sarajevo, including the Kiseljak and Hadzi routes, for humanitarian traffic for all sides and UNPROFOR traffic.
5. Within 24 hours of the beginning of the bombing suspension, the Sarajevo airport would be opened for unrestricted use by humanitarian traffic for all sides and UNPROFOR traffic.
6. At the 72 hour point, the UN and NATO military commanders would assess compliance with the foregoing requirements. If the heavy weapons relocation has been judged in compliance with the provisions of this agreement, the NATO ~~heavy~~ air campaign would continue to be suspended for another 72 hours until the relocation has been completed.
7. Within 24 hours following the UN and NATO commanders' concurrence as to compliance, the commanders of the Army of the Republic of Bosnia-Herzegovina and the Army of the Republica Srpska would meet with the UNPROFOR commander to formalize the cessation of hostilities agreement within the Sarajevo TEZ and to discuss the extension of a cessation of hostilities country-wide within the context of the overall momentum toward a peace agreement.

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9. Any attack concerning Sarajevo, or other non-compliance would be subject to investigation and resumption of air operations.

1. Heavy weapons are defined as artillery greater than 100mm, mortars greater than 82mm and tanks.

3. Within 12 hours of the initiation of this agreement, both sides would provide to Commander, UNPROFOR their plans for compliance. Commander, UNPROFOR would make arrangements to insure verification of the agreement.
