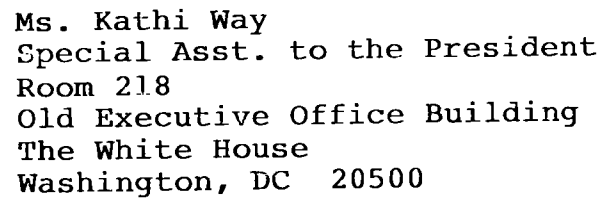

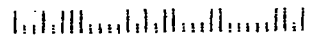

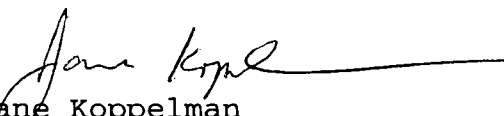
Dear Kathryn:
