Thanks. You should bring copies to pass around to the meeting tomorrow. I think it would also make sense for you to be prepared to explain what we have done in the past year -- the basic premise we began with (i.e., seeking industry agreement to the four-point plan of doing an inventory, an energy review, a target and a plan to achieve the target); which industries we've met with at CEO level or below; what the basic status is with each of these industries, including where THEY think the ball is and what expectations they have; what additional industries, if any, are ripe to meet with; what other meaningful dialogue we've had with companies that falls outside the sector by sector approach.

I would envision opening the meeting up and then turning to you for the above short update. You could obviously talk for 20 minutes about the points listed above, but I have in mind no more than 5 minutes. Something designed to let people (including Frank, George, etc.) know what's gone on and where we stand.

I'd then like to turn our focus to (1) my sense that last year's paradigm doesn't work; and (2) development of a new paradigm going forward.

One thing I think we need to understand in evaluating current EOs is what are the principal things already required of federal agencies in existing EOs. Not that those elements should be incorporated in the current EO, but rather that we have in memo form what the existing federal energy Orders already require. You or Jim may have already done this -- it relates to my insistent requests in the fall from Jim to tell me, simply, what the new proposed EOs are supposed to do. But if you don't have this kind of thing, I think we need it. I think it should be organized topically, rather than by EO. For example:

'The Executive Branch is required to reduce its overall energy use by x% by y date. (EO 129XX)

Federal buildings have their own requirement to do xyz. (EO ____)

Agencies are required to do this on ESPCs or that on water conservation, sustainable design, etc.'

Without this, it's very hard to evaluate the pros and cons -- and the ambitiousness or lack thereof -- of what we're proposing now. tds

Maybe there is a way to focus just on the clean-energy increment and possibly get somewhere with the kind of idea Nitze suggested (i.e., persuading the Chinese to count the environmental benefits as equivalent to points off their interest rate -- I admit this one sounds far-fetched) or something else. That is, if the Chinese were getting whatever super Japanese rate they can get to finance up to the conventional cost, maybe we could be offering something that came on top of that to help cover the increment. And, although other things being equal, the Chinese might not be interested, maybe, if this were cranked up to a Presidential or VP level, they'd reason that this would be a pretty good way to make the U.S. happier on climate change and sweeten things just a little bit on the relationship generally.

Incidentally, as we were walking out, Jeff Glueck was noodling around an idea that would involve setting up a special corporation that would put up the up front incremental cost in exchange for the Chinese paying, on, say, a monthly basis, the amount of the fuel savings that they'd realize from the more efficient technology. I asked him to write this up in a short note to me.

There's big ghg savings in those Chinese hills and a potential big down payment on meaningful participation -- we shouldn't give up on this yet.

"Climate disaster map pinpoints no-go areas for insurers

By Nick Nuttall, Environment Correspondent in Buenos Aires

"Vast areas of the world are becoming uninsurable as global warming triggers devastating and costly rises in sea levels, as well as droughts, floods and increasingly violent storms.

"Experts fear that some nations, especially those in the Caribbean, parts of Asia and the Pacific, face greater economic hardship. They believe insurance cover, vital for attracting inward investment to develop tourist resorts and protect homes and businesses, will become prohibitively high. In some areas it may disappear entirely as insurers protect themselves from multibillion-pound claims.

"The increasing concern (...) has been heightened by the first map to pinpoint regions where natural and man-made climate change will hit hardest.

"The climate disaster map, which is circulating among the world's major insurance firms, has been compiled by scientists and researchers at Munich Re, one of the world's largest re-insurance companies.

"Dr Anselm Smolka, of Munich Re, said the map, which couples the impacts of climatic events caused by El Nino with those predicted to result from more atmospheric greenhouse gas concentrations, was plotted using information from the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change and centres such as the Max Planck Institute.

"Dr Julian Salt, a disaster assessment expert with the Loss Prevention Council, which advises the Association of British Insurers, said yesterday that the new research was "concentrating the minds" of insurers worldwide.

"It shows where there is increased risk on top of all the natural hazards. We are fast approaching the situation where some parts of the world are becoming uninsurable," he said. The map shows where rising sea levels and more frequent storms may swamp islands in the Caribbean, Indian Ocean and the Pacific and where reductions in rainfall, such as over the grain-growing areas of the US, can be expected. (...)

"Dr Salt said that publicly insurers will reject suggestions that insurance may be removed or premiums will rise. Privately, however, these "politically charged" options are being considered, he said.

"He said that in countries such as the Maldives, vulnerable to increased storms and rising sea levels, global warming could affect tourism, the primary industry.

"Andrew Dlugolecki, a key member of a UN Environment Programmers insurers' initiative, said there was an urgent need for new, imaginative ways of covering vulnerable regions and nations.

"%I am quite certain that there are some areas which will be unprotectable and may disappear. A major problem is brewing,% he said."

Outreach:

The Center for Strategic and International Studies held a workshop of their Strategic Energy Initiative to explore the role of the environment, particularly climate change, on energy suppliers. BP's Charlotte Grezzo presented a powerful overview of their internal effort to reduce emissions using the Kyoto mechanisms, and Dirk Forrister reviewed the Administration's policy priorities.

Note: CSIS also wants to explore convening a high-level dialogue with CEOs, Senators and Administration officials to discuss strategic issues related to climate change.

The International Federation of Industrial Energy Consumers convened a workshop to explore credit for early action. They issued a 10 point set of principles that they will use with the Congress. They offered a draft copy to the Task Force for our consideration.

Our interagency team continued in technical discussions with the electric power industry on what the "business as usual" trends are for the industry with the new clean air rules and potential climate goals.

We also met with the cement industry to develop a strategy for bolstering use of blended cements that are less carbon intensive.

The Natural Gas Supply Association expressed in opening a dialogue with the Administration on voluntary action. This group includes all of the major natural gas producers. They are working on a set of principles for a credit for early action bill.

MEETING THE CHALLENGE OF GLOBAL CLIMATE CHANGE MARCH 1999

Global climate change is one of our greatest environmental challenges. There is a broad scientific consensus that the problem is real and that the threats it poses -- such as increasingly frequent and severe storms and droughts, potential increases in respiratory and infectious diseases, and rising sea levels -- are too serious to ignore

The Clinton Administration is working hard at home and abroad to meet the challenge of climate change. Domestically, we are working to implement the President's balanced plan of win-win initiatives to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Internationally, we are working with the international community to complete the unfinished business of fleshing out key provisions of the Kyoto Protocol and to encourage the meaningful participation of developing countries in efforts to address global warming.

THE SCIENCE OF CLIMATE CHANGE

Greenhouse gases trap heat from the sun to keep the Earth's temperature an estimated 60 degrees Fahrenheit (F) warmer than it would be absent such gases, thus sustaining our existence on the planet. As a result of the burning of fossil fuels and deforestation, the concentration of carbon dioxide, or CO₂ (the principal greenhouse gas), has increased 30% since preindustrial times. If we continue on a business-as-usual trajectory, this concentration is expected to reach almost twice current levels by 2100 -- a level not seen in 50 million years. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), which represents the work of more than 2,000 of the world's leading climate scientists, estimates that this will lead to an increase global temperature of 2 to 6.5 degrees F. By way of comparison, the last ice age was only about 9 degrees F colder than today.

Over the past year, new data from tree rings, ice melts, boreholes, and satellites have reinforced the broad scientific consensus that human activities are disrupting the Earth's climate. Studies have shown that the 20th century has been the warmest century in the past 1200 years; the 1990s have been the warmest decade in that period; and that 1997 and 1998 have been the warmest years since reliable instrument records began 119 years ago.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE

Scientists predict a range of likely effects from global warming:

- **Human health.** Warmer temperatures are projected to increase fatalities from heat stress and expand the geographic ranges for diseases like malaria and dengue fever. Additional smog caused by warmer temperatures is expected to increase the incidence of asthma and other respiratory illnesses, particularly among children and the elderly.
- **Extreme weather.** As temperatures increase, so does the rate of evaporation. This acceleration of the hydrologic cycle is projected to increase the frequency and intensity of extreme weather events such as floods and droughts. Last year's El Nino offered us a window on the type of extreme weather that global warming may bring -- from droughts and fires in Florida, Texas, Mexico and Indonesia to devastating floods in China and

Bangladesh.

- **Sea level rise.** Scientists project that the sea level will rise by an additional 6 to 37 inches by 2100, threatening to wipe entire islands and even nations off the map. A 20-inch rise could inundate 7,000 square miles of the U.S. coastline, with Florida and the Gulf Coast at greatest risk.
- **Agricultural impacts.** Changes in growing seasons, water availability, soil moisture, and precipitation are expected to cause significant regional shifts in food productivity, with decreased production in many of the world's poorest regions. Water supplies and water quality may also be affected, posing threats to irrigation, fisheries, and drinking supplies.
- **Damage to ecosystems.** During the next century, the geographical range of forests is expected to move several hundred miles north at a pace that exceeds the ability of many tree species to migrate. The Northeast United States may lose its beech trees and sugar maples. Western conifer forests will likely shrink.

PRESIDENT CLINTON'S DOMESTIC PLAN

In October 1997, President Clinton outlined an environmentally and economically sound plan for reducing U.S. greenhouse gas emissions. The plan emphasizes win-win initiatives designed to cut emissions while increasing energy efficiency and creating new opportunities for economic growth.

- **Tax incentives and R&D.** The President's plan includes the **Climate Change Technology Initiative** -- a vigorous program of tax incentives and investments aimed at increasing energy efficiency and spurring the broader use of renewable energy. The FY 1999 appropriations for these programs totaled over \$1 billion and represented a 25% increase over the prior year. The President's FY 2000 budget proposes a still more accelerated effort.
 - The **tax incentive package** contains \$3.6 billion over five years (\$383 million for FY 2000) for consumers who purchase energy efficient products and for producers of energy from renewable sources. Highlights include: a tax credit of up to \$2000 for energy efficient new homes; a 10-20% credit for selected energy efficient products for homes and buildings; a credit of up to \$2000 for rooftop solar systems; a credit of up to \$4000 for qualifying electric, fuel cell or hybrid vehicles; extension of the current 1.5 cents/kilowatt hour credit for the production of electricity from wind and biomass; an expansion of the biomass credit to cover additional sources; and a 1.0 cent/kilowatt hour credit for cofiring coal and biomass in power plants.
 - The **investment package** contains nearly \$1.4 billion in FY 2000 to research, develop, and deploy clean energy technologies. This represents a 34 percent increase over the amount appropriated in FY 1999. Highlights include: increased funding for the *Partnership for a New Generation of Vehicles*, a government-industry effort to develop cars that get up to three times the fuel efficiency of today's cars; the *Partnership for Advancing Technology in Housing*, which aims to improve the energy efficiency of new homes by more than 50 percent and to retrofit 15 million existing homes to make them 30 percent more energy efficient within a decade; and research partnerships for key renewable energy technologies,

such as solar, wind, bioenergy, photovoltaics, and geothermal energy.

- ***Clean Air Partnership Fund.*** The President's FY 2000 budget also proposes \$200 million for the creation of a new Clean Air Partnership Fund to support state and local efforts to reduce both greenhouse gas emissions and ground-level air pollutants. The Fund will help finance projects that go beyond legal requirements and enable communities to achieve clean air goals sooner. It will also stimulate cost-effective pollution control strategies, spur technological innovation, and leverage substantial non-Federal investment in cleaner air.
- ***Industry consultations.*** The President's plan also involves building partnerships with key energy-intensive industries to develop sector-by-sector initiatives to cut emissions. These partnerships are identifying opportunities for working together to remove barriers to the development and widespread use of energy efficient technologies and practices.
- ***Electricity restructuring.*** Another core element of the President's plan involves restructuring the electricity industry by introducing competition that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions while saving consumers millions on their energy bills. The Administration's restructuring proposal would provide a profit incentive for generators to produce more electricity with less fuel and to improve energy efficiency. It also includes a renewable portfolio standard to increase the use of electricity from renewable sources and a Public Benefits Fund to spur greater investment in energy efficiency and renewables.
- ***Federal energy use and procurement.*** The President's plan seeks to substantially reduce the Federal government's own greenhouse gas emissions by improving the energy efficiency of Federal facilities and activities and reforming procurement practices. These actions are important in their own right, since the Federal government is the nation's largest single energy user, but they also set an important example for the private sector.
- ***Credit for Early Action.*** The Administration is working closely with industry and Congress on legislation to reward companies taking early, voluntary action to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions or increase carbon sequestration.
- ***Domestic emissions trading.*** The President has proposed a domestic emissions trading system to begin by 2008 so that we can achieve our emissions target at the lowest possible cost. The U.S. has used emissions trading successfully to reduce the pollution that causes acid rain -- exceeding environmental objectives at about 50% the expected cost.
- ***Scientific research.*** The Administration is continuing its strong support for the U.S. Global Change Research Program. This program provides a sound science foundation for policy decisions as it furthers our understanding of human and naturally induced changes in the Earth's environment and assesses the likely consequences of global warming. A new research project, the *Carbon Cycle Initiative*, will seek to deepen our understanding of carbon "sinks," such as forests and farmlands.

DIPLOMATIC AGENDA

Thanks largely to U.S. leadership, the international climate change agreement reached at Kyoto,

Japan in December 1997, combines strong environmental targets with flexible, market-based mechanisms that will allow nations to meet their targets in a cost-effective manner.

- ***Emissions targets.*** The Kyoto Protocol's emissions targets include a multi-year time frame (2008-2012), giving our economy and our technologies more time to adapt; differentiated targets for developed countries; coverage of all six greenhouse gases; and inclusion of so-called carbon "sinks" – so that nations can receive credit for activities that absorb carbon dioxide, such as afforestation, reforestation, and better forestry and agricultural conservation practices.
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At the November 1998 UN climate change conference in Buenos Aires, the parties agreed to a two-year timetable for filling in the key details of the Kyoto Protocol in areas such as emissions trading. Buenos Aires also saw a significant breakthrough on the issue of developing country participation as Argentina and Kazakhstan announced their intention to take on binding emissions targets for the 2008-2012 time period.

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CONCLUSION

For the past 25 years, efforts to protect the environment, whether by cleaning our air, our water, or eliminating acid rain, have been repeatedly assailed as a threat to our economy. Yet today we have the cleanest environment in a generation and the strongest economy in a generation. President

Todd,

We have been making steady progress on our project involving small island nations. Bill Richardson is quite keen on it, and we had a good conversation recently with George Frampton and David Sandalow.

David raised the concern that a White House event might have the opposite effect on these nations from the one we intend - i.e., that they would feel the need to posture against the United States to show they weren't being bullied or bribed.

We do not believe that would be the case, but to be sure, we reconfirmed through a well-placed UN connection that several nations would be willing to move away from the G-77 on the issue of emissions reductions if the White House were to reach out to them. We are trying to arrange a discussion between Bill Richardson and several key ambassadors in the very near future to confirm this face to face.

It seems to us that it would be quite helpful if Bill Richardson could have in his pocket for that meeting some options for dates in September for an event with the White House if all of this could be properly choreographed. If we are to work with other heads of state, advance planning is essential. We realize the difficulty of committing to anything so far in advance,

however. What is your advice? Could we at least indicate a block of dates when such an event would be possible (or impossible) based on what is known about the President's schedule?

These look quite good. I have a few interlineal edits, which I'll give you at the staff meeting. A few other points:

1. Second paragraph of Science -- I don't think it's right to say broad consensus says human activities are currently disrupting climate. Broad consensus would say buildup of CO2 will do this and may be doing it already; but I think there is more doubt about whether it is in fact happening now. This certainly was true a year ago. Conceivably the broad consensus has moved. But I am skeptical about making this statement unless it is rock solid because it can divert us into a somewhat off-the-point discussion about whether it is happening right now as distinguished from view that it is clearly coming. I'd like Rosina's input here.
2. On impacts, the damage to ecosystems point. It sounds like this is happening whether we do anything about climate change or not. Is that what you mean? Makes it seem like it's too late to do anything.
3. We need a bigger emphasis on the bioenergy side of our domestic package -- should give this bigger play probably in investment paragraph.
4. Domestic emissions trading bullet -- This is written as if POTUS promised this irrespective of whether we get a ratified treaty. I don't think we should put it that way.
5. In scientific research bullet -- the carbon cycle initiative ought to get moved up to the investment package paragraph.
6. Last paragraph of diplomatic section -- should add CDM, sinks and compliance to end of first sentence -- after checking final Buenos Aires Decision regarding the Plan of Action to make sure that those items are covered.

Questions for Second Panel

For UMW Representative

1st set of questions:

You have expressed some concern about job losses in the coal mining sector. To provide some context for these job losses, could you provide an estimate of the peak coal mining employment over the past 30 years? [246,000 employed in 1978; from EIA]

-- If no answer, follow: Wasn't coal mining employment at its peak in 1978 with about 250,000 jobs?

What is coal mining employment today? [80,000 estimated by EIA]

--If no answer, follow: Isn't coal mining employment now about 80,000, or about one-third the level of just two decades ago?

How many short tons of coal were produced 20 years ago when coal mining employment was at its peak? [670 million short tons; from EIA]

How many short tons of coal were produced last year? [1125 million short tons estimated by EIA]

So then let me get this straight -- coal mining employment has fallen by two-thirds while coal production has increased by two-thirds over the past 20 years? Since coal output has continued to grow, this appears to be the case of significant gains in productivity, and not the result of environmental regulations.

2nd set of questions:

Are you familiar with the energy forecasting work undertaken by Jay Hakes' staff at the Energy Information Administration?

Do you believe the Energy Information Administration does a credible and unbiased effort in forecasting our energy sector?

Would you believe EIA energy sector forecasts more than any other?

In the economic analysis you have referred to in your testimony today, you claim substantial job losses. In your analysis, the coal sector loses approximately 29,000 jobs in 2010 as a result of the Kyoto Protocol. So I can better understand these job losses, could you please explain your coal sector forecast? Specifically, why does the unbiased Energy Information Administration project coal sector employment to be 62,000 in 2010 without the Kyoto Protocol, while you claim employment will be nearly 80,000? It appears that a majority of the jobs that you claim will be lost because of the Kyoto Protocol aren't even projected to exist in the first place.

Does your analysis account for international emissions trading? [no]
