PRESIDENT CLINTON UNVEILS PRINCIPLES FOR MEDICARE REFORM AND UNDERSCORES
NEED TO DEDICATE THE SURPLUS TO MEDICARE
February 3, 1999

Today, in his speech to the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), President Clinton will underscore the need to dedicate 15 percent of the budget surplus to secure the Medicare Trust Fund until 2020. He will stress his preference for bipartisan Medicare reform that is necessary to modernize Medicare and achieve additional savings to strengthen the program, and will outline four main principles that he believes any such plan should meet. The President will:

Highlight the Need to Dedicate Budget Surplus to Strengthen Medicare. The President will highlight the fact that, while we need reform to improve competition and efficiency in the Medicare program, these reforms will not produce savings that are sufficient to significantly extend the life of the Trust Fund. In fact, if reductions in growth alone were used to extend the life of the Medicare Trust Fund, spending growth per beneficiary would have to be limited to 2.8 percent per year -- in every year -- to get to 2020. This rate is over 60 percent below projected private health insurance spending per person (7.3 percent). Moreover, since this growth rate is below general inflation, the value of Medicare spending per beneficiary would erode. These projections help explain why virtually every independent health analyst agrees that Medicare cannot be significantly strengthened without adding outside financial support such as the surplus.

Unveil Principles to Guide Medicare reform. The President will outline principles that he will use to evaluate any Medicare reform proposal. Any broad-based reforms should:

- Dedicate Surplus to Secure Medicare until 2020. One of the fundamental goals of Medicare reform is to put the program on stronger financial footing to better prepare it for the demographic and health challenges of the next century. These challenges cannot be addressed solely through making the program more efficient, transferring current liabilities out of the Trust Fund, or increasing payments. The President is proposing to use 15 percent of the projected surpluses over the next 15 years to secure the Medicare Trust Fund until 2020 as part of broader reforms to further strengthen the program.

- Modernize Medicare and Make It More Competitive. Medicare should adopt the best management, payment, clinical and competitive practices used by the private sector, to help maintain high-quality services and keep spending growth in line with the private spending. Moreover, strong and effective Federal administration of Medicare should be assured.
- Guarantee Defined Set of Benefits Without Excessive New Costs to Beneficiaries. Beneficiaries should still be entitled to an adequate set of health benefits. A modernized, well-defined benefits package is needed to assure that health plans compete on cost and quality rather than price. Reforms should also maintain or strengthen protections for low-income beneficiaries, assure that any new cost burdens are not excessive, and assure that beneficiaries have access to a viable traditional Medicare program.
- Use Savings from Reform to Help Fund a Prescription Drug Benefit. Millions of Medicare beneficiaries have no or inadequate coverage for their medications, limiting their access to needed treatments. In fact, over half of Medicare beneficiaries pay more than \$500 per month for prescription drugs and one in 10 pay more than \$2,000. Prescription drugs have become an essential part of treatments and cures, and are expected to play an even greater role in health care in the next century. The President believes that additional savings from making Medicare more efficient should be used to help finance a long-overdue prescription drug benefit for all Medicare beneficiaries.

A PROCLAMATION

Thanks to the dedicated efforts of scientists and researchers and the strong support of the American public, today we stand at the threshold of a new frontier in the prevention and treatment of heart disease. And in coming years, Americans will reap even greater benefits from our ongoing commitment to heart research.

Already, research has profoundly altered scientists' understanding of heart disease, revealing that the likelihood of heart disease is increased by risk factors such as smoking, high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol, diabetes, obesity, physical inactivity, and a family history of early heart disease. Armed with this knowledge, millions of Americans have been able to take steps to reduce their risk of illness. Thanks to scientific discoveries, those already afflicted with heart disease now have access to lifesaving therapies and procedures such as clot-dissolving drugs, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, defibrillation, and balloon angioplasty.

Even greater advances lie ahead. Fields on the verge of delivering major innovations include molecular genetics, gene therapy, biotechnology, immunology, and epidemiology. The next breakthroughs will include better noninvasive diagnostic tools that can help physicians examine the heart and blood vessels without surgery; an implantable mechanical device that can restore heart function to those suffering heart failure; and a drug that can promote the growth of new blood vessels to body tissues and organs with poor circulation.

But technology is not a panacea. Despite the great gains we have made, heart disease remains the leading cause of death in the United States, and millions of Americans have at least one risk factor for heart disease. Moreover, recent data have shown a slight rise in the death rate for stroke and a slowing in the decline of the death rate for coronary heart disease. Some cardiovascular

conditions, such as heart failure, as well as two key heart disease risk factors, obesity and physical inactivity, are on the increase among Americans.

We must work together to make all Americans aware of the information science has given us regarding controllable risk factors for cardiovascular disease. It is particularly important that we reach out to African Americans, Hispanic Americans, other minority communities, and women, who often are at high risk for heart disease and stroke, and ensure that they have access to the resources and information they need to guard against these afflictions. We must also encourage families to teach their children the importance of adopting healthy lifestyle practices early and maintaining them into and throughout adulthood.

The Federal Government continues to play a vital role in improving the cardiovascular health of Americans by supporting research and public education through the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute of the National Institutes of Health. The American Heart Association, through its research and education programs and its broad network of dedicated volunteers, also plays a crucial part in bringing about much-needed advances.

As Americans look ahead to a new century and a new millennium, we should use the momentum of past heart research as a springboard to even greater gains. In recognition of the importance of the ongoing fight against cardiovascular disease, the Congress, by Joint Resolution approved December 30, 1963 (77 Stat. 843; 36 U.S.C. 169b), has requested that the President issue an annual proclamation designating February as "American Heart Month."

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM J. CLINTON, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim February 1999 as American Heart Month. I invite the Governors of the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, officials of other areas subject to the jurisdiction of the United States, and the American people to join me in reaffirming our commitment to combating cardiovascular disease and stroke.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this third day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and ninety-nine, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and twenty-third.

MR. LOCKHART: I have no announcements to make, so we'll go right to questions.

Q Joe, why is it in your view unconstitutional for the finding of fact? I don't understand how -- what your defense is that it would be unconstitutional for the Senate to engage in a finding of fact during the impeachment process.

MR. LOCKHART: Because the Constitution clearly lays out for the Senate what their constitutional role is, which is to either convict and remove, or acquit. And that's by a two

-thirds margin.

Adding at this late date and time some other political maneuver to try to do something short of that I think raises some serious precedent questions about how we'll move forward in the future.

Q But there's nothing in the Constitution that would prohibit such a process.

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I think most constitutional scholars that have spoken on the subject have been very clear. You've got people who have not been all that friendly, from Robert Bork to Robert Dole, friendly to the White House -- or not friendly to the White House, as the case may be -- who have made it very clear that they think this is going around the Constitution. And I think it's understandable as people work toward trying to figure out a way to bring this process to an end, which we wholeheartedly support, but in the rush to do that and as they move toward the exits they shouldn't try to trample on the Constitution in the process.

Q Can I follow up on that? Are you saying that if they take some -- you object to some kind of vote if it would be followed by an up or down vote on impeachment?

MR. LOCKHART: Our constitutional objection is to say that there is no place for this within the context of impeachment. If they were to take some vote like this after the impeachment process was over, and whatever you call it -- finding of fact, or censure -- that's something that the Senate certainly has the right

to do and we wouldn't object to.

Q Joe, it seems that what's motivating a lot of these senators was the pep rally after the impeachment vote in the House of Representatives, that the President would do something similar this time, say he's vindicated and declare BOTTOM EVEN MORE #50

victory, and they don't want him to do so. That's why they're looking for some formula to avoid that. What can you say to assure them that you're not going to do that again?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, again, I think you've got to take some of this with a grain of salt. There was a lot of talk

during the House process about, well, if the President only said that he was sorry, this would all go away. And as the President addressed that issue, then the excuse for why this needed to stay around became something else.

And I'd also remind you of the context of that day and why we thought that that event was an appropriate event. We had gone through a very partisan impeachment process where the President was impeached despite the pledge from the House Judiciary Committee Chairman that he wouldn't move forward unless he had bipartisan support on almost a straight party line. And immediately following that vote -- in fact, preceding that vote, as it became clear where the votes were, you had the House Republican leadership beginning the drum beat for, now that the President has been impeached he must resign. And we thought it was important, and I think House Democrats thought it was important, to show that this had been a partisan process and that Democrats were not going to stand by while Republicans somehow tried this bait and switch, tried to employ this bait and switch strategy to force the President out. It just wasn't going to happen.

But let me --

Q Would it be appropriate to do something like that following a vote on impeachment, though?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I think, as I've just explained, given the context of what was going on that weekend, we thought it was important to show that Democrats recognized that this was a partisan vote --

Q Are you saying you would not do it, following a vote on impeachment, you would not --

MR. LOCKHART: Oh, you mean in the Senate? I'm sorry,

I thought you were still referring to the House. Listen, I think -- and, again, while I may question the motives of those who keep raising this, it's a legitimate question. Let me try to give you some sense of the feeling here in this building.

I think there will be a certain sense of relief here at the White House if this process were to end quickly and go away. But I don't think that there is anybody here who thinks anything out of this process constitutes a victory. This has been a process that has not been good for anyone who has been involved in it, and that includes the White House. And I think anyone who believes that it would go beyond relief needs to spend some time inside with the people here who have worked -- both the people who work so hard on the policies that we think have moved this country to where we are now, and those who have had to work on this issue for the last 13 months.

So while I think there will be some sense of relief, I don't necessarily buy into the proposition that there will be anything else. And again, you all will have to decide for yourself if our reactions are appropriate afterwards. But I don't think that there will be anything that will happen here that will give anyone any pause on the Capitol.

Q You're suggesting that the President would not claim exoneration, then?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I think the President's legal filings, the presentations that his lawyers have made in the TOP ODD - \p -

House and Senate have been very clear about how these allegations are not supported by the facts, and that won't change. But I don't think the President, if you look at everything he said over the year, is not going to continue to take responsibility for the inappropriate nature of his behavior, and that will last forever.

Q Will he do that again tomorrow at the prayer breakfast? Will he address this subject at all, as he has at previous --

MR. LOCKHART: Generally, I don't know of any specific intent he has -- these are very personal remarks the President makes. When we talked about this yesterday, he was still working through what he wanted to say. But I don't think there will be any particular intent to go in that direction this year.

Q Joe, will the President promise, however, not to gloat beforehand? (Laughter.)

MR. LOCKHART: You have -- I now declare in a post

-impeachment era, this a gloat

-free zone.

Q Joe, there's been some movement away from this, at least the language of the finding of facts thing, and toward

something more closer to the censure the President -- at least the White House has indicated the President would accept. Now, Mr. Clinton has said that he did not try to be forthcoming in his testimony. Some of the language that's being bandied about in the Senate proposal suggests that the President attempted to delay or impede through his testimony. Would he take issue with language like that?

MR. LOCKHART: I think I've been pretty clear on this subject. I'm not going to try to litigate or negotiate or mediate on language and censure. That's something for the Senate to do on their own. I will reiterate, though, that whatever the language is, it is not appropriate in our view, from a constitutional point of view, to be done in the context of impeachment. Post

-impeachment, that's a different subject. And, frankly, you all have to remember that pre

-impeachment we argued that this was something that we thought was appropriate for the House to take up, but the Republican leadership, on a party line vote, refused to allow a censure vote to go to the floor. And we'll never know what would have happened in the House if that had happened. We just will never know because they didn't allow that vote.

Q Does the President have a right as a human being to be relieved when after one year of this kind of thing that he would be a little happy about it? Why should people resent that?

MR. LOCKHART: Again, I think I used the word "relief," and I believe that not only the President, the White House staff here, the administration, but the American public are ready to put this behind us. Again, I'd suggest that some of the posturing on this subject that you hear has to do, if you go back and look over the last four or five months as sort of the shifting sands, has a little bit to do with supporting a political argument and less with real concern about what might happen down here. I'm sure that there are some legitimate people who may, for whatever reason, disagree with some of the decisions we make here, and may take issue with things we do here, but there's been an awful lot of politics underpinning a lot of the statements over the last five or six months about why this process needs to keep going forward. There always seems to be an available and convenient excuse for why -- if we just take another couple of weeks on this, things will work out right and things will balance themselves out.

Q Joe, was the President briefed, either by the White House lawyers or his personal lawyers, on the testimony of Monica Lewinsky or Vernon Jordan?

MR. LOCKHART: He had a very short conversation with one of the lawyers involved in Monday's deposition. I think if anything, he just got a passing conversation. I don't think he has spoken to any of the lawyers yet about Tuesday's -- Mr.

Jordan's testimony; certainly hasn't gotten anything on it today, because I think today's just broke.

Q With the House managers' depositions now completed, will the White House call for its own witnesses or ask for a period of discovery, or are you now in a position to press to closure?

MR. LOCKHART: We have a couple more steps in the process. I think the Senate has to come back tomorrow and make some decisions on admitting the videotape to the record and in what way they'll do that, and calling live witnesses and in what way they'll do that. And we -- as the procedure was laid out -- have the ability dictated by the procedure to wait until that process is done. And we'll reserve our right and reserve our decision until that point.

Q Joe, the Senate Democratic leader, Tom Daschle, today said that it would be his preference as far as the videotapes being played on the Senate floor, either show them all so they get the full context, or show none of it. He doesn't like snippets, in his words, just being played. Is that view shared by the White House?

MR. LOCKHART: In part, yes. I think our view is that we don't believe that the videotapes need to be released at all. It's hard for us to understand -- and we certainly understand, especially those of you in the broadcast part of journalism who would want to see and hear them, but we don't know that it serves the public interest, the national interest. I think there are some numbers out this morning that shows the vast majority of the public has no interest in these being released. We've seen what has happened in the past where depositions and videotapes have been released -- it's created sort of a frenzy. We don't think that needs to be repeated. We don't know that it adds anything to the record.

But I think Senator Daschle raises a good point, which is if the majority decides that they do need to be released, this is not something that they should be able to do when the context for which they're used can be subject to question. We've had too many incidents I think over the past year or so where statements are made or briefs are filed or referrals are filed that make statements and assertions that when you look at the underlying facts and the complete record, they can't be supported.

So I think our preference again is that the Senate just move forward, that there's no need to release these videotapes; the transcripts will be available, will be made part of the record. But if the Senate majority decides that there is some compelling reason that they have to release them, that this shouldn't be done in snippets, as Senator Daschle said.

Q Why is the U.N. ordering American and British staffers out of Iraq again?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I actually -- British?

Q Yes.

MR. LOCKHART: Okay. I'm sorry, I literally found out about this as I was walking out. My understanding of this is this is a decision the Secretary General Kofi Annan made. There's only a handful of Americans there now, humanitarian workers.

Q How many?

MR. LOCKHART: Half a dozen -- we'll see if we can get a number. But it's a small number. And the Secretary General is of the view now and has taken the decision that he can't guarantee their safety and he believes they should be removed.

Q Their safety during what -- another all

-out

bombing effort, or their safety from Iraqis --

MR. LOCKHART: No. I will let him speak more completely to this, but my understanding of the situation is from the Iraqis on the ground, rather than the other --

Q Do you agree with his assessment?

MR. LOCKHART: I again, haven't had a chance to look too deeply into this. I think it's the Secretary General's job to make sure that he can assure the safety of all of those who are going in and doing important work of the United Nations. And it's his view at this point that that safety can't be guaranteed, and we believe that he's in the best position to make that decision.

Q What did the President tell Gephardt?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, the President and Minority Leader Gephardt spoke this morning for about 40 minutes over in the residence. I think anything that I told you about that conversation might give you even more clues about the Minority Leader may or may not be announcing this afternoon, so I'm going to leave it to him to make his announcement. We'll have more to say then.

Q Well, did they just talk about that or did they talk about some of the issues before Congress, or was it just Gephardt's plans?

MR. LOCKHART: I think it was primarily a conversation on the Minority Leader's plans.

Q Joe, on Kosovo, Cohen today announced that United States troops could go. Would the KAL want those troops there -- would they want those troops to be guaranteed in order to get an agreement, or as you've said in the past, the troops would come after an agreement is in place? I guess what I'm asking is wouldn't the KAL be more inclined to reach an agreement if they knew up front the agreement would be backed by troops?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I think my understanding of the testimony today, it's part of the overall consultation we're doing with members of Congress. That's happening now both behind closed doors in private meetings and in open hearings, like you saw this morning with Secretary Cohen and General Shelton.

There's really a series of points they're making here. One is they're providing an explanation of what the stakes are, as far as what the U.S. government sees in the area -- which is really things that we've talked about before -- but avoiding a humanitarian catastrophe which we were very close to late in last year; preventing a wider Balkan war; ensuring the credibility of NATO; and preserving the hard

-fought peace in Bosnia, which we think could be impacted by escalating tensions in Kosovo.

I think, secondly, they have been consulting on the issues and details of the proposed agreement that they expect both sides to start working on very soon in Rambouillet. And, third, they've been consulting again both openly today and in private on the question of an implementation force. As we said, the President has not made a decision on that, on the appropriateness of U.S. involvement, but we've been working very aggressively in discussing with members of Congress, getting their input and their feedback about what, if any, role there would be for U.S. forces in an implementation force.

Q When is he going to make up his mind?

Q -- there is no way that troops will back up -- I mean U.S. troops.

MR. LOCKHART: Well, there's no direct assurances, that I'm aware of. I think that clearly, as part of the discussions that will go on as far as reaching an interim settlement, there will be discussion of a post

-implementation force, which is separate and apart from discussions here at home with Congress on the value and utility, if any, of a U.S. involvement in that force.

Q General Shelton gave the figure of 2,000 to 4,000 -- of course, he was saying that this would be dependent upon when the peace agreement is reached. You, again, are saying the President has not made -- committed to that, has not made a decision --

MR. LOCKHART: That's right. There's been contingency work that's been done since last fall on what could be part of a post

-implementation force. And I think General Shelton was making the point that if the President decided, along with Congress, that it was appropriate and useful to do, that this would be a small force working in a permissive environment. But, again, we are one step ahead of a decision because we are continuing to consult, work with Congress. But both the foreign policy team -- the foreign policy team has neither recommended, nor has the President decided, on how we'll move forward with this.

Q And when he did decide, would there be an end date? In other words, would you say at the outside, Christmas, or would they just be --

MR. LOCKHART: Well, I think that's part of the discussion about what the mission would be, as we talk with members of Congress and get their input and what the actual exit strategy for such a force would be.

Q Two questions on Arafat. Do you have any thoughts on this proposed boycott and will the President meet with him tomorrow? And do you have anything on his congressional move to oppose Arafat's unilateral declaration?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, our views on unilateral declaration are well

-known -- it's an issue for final status talks and that's where it should be.

As far as calls to boycott, I think, as I said this morning, the National Prayer Breakfast has traditionally been a moment in Washington where politics and other issues that are political in nature have not found a way to intrude on. It's a morning of prayer and reconciliation. And we believe that it's unfortunate that that spirit of reconciliation is being ignored by some, and that people have made the decision that the normal politics of Washington should intrude on this. And it's unfortunate, but I think this is a small group, and the prayer breakfast would be as big a success this year as it has been in the past.

Q Does the President meet with Yasser Arafat?

MR. LOCKHART: Yes. He will have a short meeting with him after that. There are a number of world leaders there. I think, all told, the President will meet with four or five of his counterparts before returning to the White House.

Q Can you say who else?

MR. LOCKHART: I've got it here. Albania, Macedonia -- who am I missing here?

Q Norway?

MR. LOCKHART: Norway. Anybody else? Okay, that's it.

Q Joe, in terms of unilateral declaration, you aren't really answering the question.

MR. LOCKHART: Ask the question again. I'll try to answer it.

Q If Arafat makes a unilateral declaration, will the United States oppose it?

MR. LOCKHART: The United States' view on unilateral

declarations is well

-known. We've expressed it every time it's been asked. We don't believe that this is an issue that lends itself to unilateral statements or declarations; it's an issue for final status talks, and that's where it belongs.

Q Does that mean you would say if Arafat said --

MR. LOCKHART: That means what it means. I don't have any other way of explaining it.

Q Joe, just to clarify, are you saying that you would not be opposed to the Senate taking a vote on the finding of fact after the trial is over?

MR. LOCKHART: They have it within their power to call whatever they want a vote, whether it's a sense of the Senate whether it's a censure, whether it's some sort of finding. But not -- we believe that it doesn't have a constitutional basis if it's done in a context within the impeachment trial. After that, I think it's up to the Senate.

Q Would you prefer a vote on censure instead of a finding of facts?

MR. LOCKHART: I don't know what preference we have. Obviously, some of that would have to do with the words and the sentiment that they seek to express. But our objection is that something like this be done as an 11th hour bid to rewrite the Constitution. And that may not seem like it's that important and it may seem small because the Senate can set up its rules, but I think if you look at what's happened this year, and with the partisan nature of how the House moved forward on impeachment, and the Senate setting up a context whereby many could interpret what they do as finding a way to convict, yet not remove, I think there is a lot of objective people who believe as we go into the future, every President, from a very early stage, if the majority happens to be in the party opposite in Congress and they happen to be in control, are going to go through impeachment. And it will somehow stop being a constitutional tool to remove a President who is a grave threat to the state, and it will become a political tool to somehow inflict political damage on someone in the party opposite.

Q How is your concern addressed if you just flipped the vote around? I mean, if instead of a finding of fact vote coming before you vote on the articles of impeachment, instead it comes after, aren't your concerns the same? Wouldn't the threat be the same?

MR. LOCKHART: No, because I think after the trial, the impeachment trial is done, the Senate has every right to express their views on a subject as a sense of the Senate, but not in the context of removing the President. What we're doing, no matter what gloss and what nice words we put on this, is, you're trying to set up a function of saying the President is guilty of these things, but we're not going to remove him. And the Constitution, we believe, is very clear on that -- and I think most constitutional scholars are. I mean, I know that Chairman Hyde

and the House managers are very dismissive of constitutional scholars, and that's not hard to understand, because they don't have a serious backing among those who make a living out of trying to interpret what the framers meant.

Q Joe, there's a letter circulating with some Republicans to get -- circulate for signatures that would ask the President to agree to a deposition. Is that something the White House would agree to?

MR. LOCKHART: No. I think we've made very clear, the President has testified; the time now is to find a way to bring this to an end, not to extend it. And, again, I think whether it's finding of facts or looking to at the last minute seek to get additional testimony from the President says less about the constitutional issues that are here and more about some of the -- more about the political dynamic that exists at the Capitol now.

Q Joe, in that connection, when you announced that the President was going to postpone his Central America trip, I believe you said that it looks like they would -- the Senate would meet the February 12th target end date.

MR. LOCKHART: I didn't say that.

Q Oh, I'm sorry.

MR. LOCKHART: No.

Q Forget my question.

MR. LOCKHART: Okay. I wish it was true. I wish I had said it and I wish I believe it.

Q Can you tell us about the sense you're finding of fact following the Senate vote. Is the issue here that once the Senate votes the President's guilt or innocence, it has fulfilled its responsibility under the impeachment, it is no longer sitting as a legal body, and that its actions then go back, revert to the political arena? Is that the --

MR. LOCKHART: Well, in large part, yes. But I think it's sometimes hard to separate. I think the framers purposely made this process a hybrid of legal

-political. But they did make it a process and it's very clear and I think their intentions are very clear -- that they give the Senate, they set a high bar for the Senate. And there were no escape routes built into the system, there were no political fixes built into the Constitution.

And I think there is serious concern -- one can't expect us to be objective on this, so I would listen to others -- but I think there have been serious concerns expressed by others that this really does complete a transformation in the impeachment process, where it really is less of a constitutional tool and more of a political weapon -- with the arguments that the House made as far as grand jury and just, "we're not the triers of fact, we're just looking to see if there's something here that the Senate ought to look at." And I think it poses serious concern to administrations down the road.

Q Will the President promptly send up the Holbrooke nomination, now that he's agreed to pay \$5,000 to settle the

allegations against him?

MR. LOCKHART: My understanding is that there's still some paperwork to do on that nomination, but we're close to sending that name up, and as soon as the paperwork's done, we will enthusiastically and quickly send that paperwork up. We believe that Dick Holbrooke is a gifted diplomat, will be of enormous value to our foreign policy team. And we believe that the Senate will move quickly and support him. And we look forward to the day, sometime soon, that he's at the U.N. representing U.S. interests around the world.

Q How long do you think that paperwork will take? A week? Next week?

MR. LOCKHART: I can't be sure, but I think it will be relatively quickly.

Q Joe, why would it not be in the public interest for the depositions to be made public?

MR. LOCKHART: I think if people have an interest in knowing what each of these people said, the transcripts will be available. They are readable. I think once you release videotape, you will see these all hours of the day, 24 hours a day. We'll be exactly where we were back late last year, when the President's videotape was dumped out. And we just don't believe it serves any sense of the public interest to do that.

The other point that struck me was, there was an outpouring, I think, from Republican senators on the Hill yesterday, having watched the videotape, of support and sympathy for some of the -- particularly Miss Lewinsky, and I think it's hard to understand why they think it would be in her interest for this to be dumped out into the public for all to watch at all hours on the many 24

-hour outlets that -- this has become their stock in trade. So it's hard for us to see a case for that.

Q But your opposition is about what impact it would have on the President, not about the individuals who gave --

MR. LOCKHART: Yes, I think that's certainly a point others can make. But I certainly don't think -- again, we can speculate about the national interest, but I don't it serves any purpose here or the interest of the President or his family to have this out on television 24 hours a day.

Q Then why do you not support just releasing snippets?

MR. LOCKHART: Because, Wolf, we've been down this road before, and if we felt that those who have made the prosecution's case would go forward in good faith and air things that were contextually right and were straightforward, maybe we could be in that situation where we just released those. But we have been down this road before, we don't believe that. I think if you did believe that, you might believe their case, and we don't.

Q Joe, I realize this may be a sore subject, but there are reports today that you pressured one TV network not to

run a story that another network had investigated. My question is, is that appropriate behavior in terms of spin control, or is it kind of heavy

-handed for the White House Press Secretary --

MR. LOCKHART: If this is your way, your side way to get into writing the story, go ahead and write the story; I'm not going to help you. You've already written it.

So, next.

Q Joe, do you think it would not be in the national interest for Ms. Lewinsky to give an interview for Barbara Walters?

MR. LOCKHART: I think that's completely her decision to make.

Q Also, if I might, Joe, Vernon Jordan now apparently has said it's the President who asked him to find a job for Monica Lewinsky. Does the President agree that that is the case?

MR. LOCKHART: Well, if he said that, he said it in a deposition that I'm not allowed to talk about, so I'm not going to address that question.

Q Did you pressure a network?

MR. LOCKHART: If any of you think I'm in a position to pressure anyone, you give me more power than you think I have.

Q Did you make the call, as has been reported?

MR. LOCKHART: I'm just not going to discuss private conversations I have, even if others can't keep them private.

Q May I go to Iraq one more time? You didn't really make a reference to this, the fact that Saddam Hussein may be threatening American nationals. However, does the United States have a reaction to that? Is that a violation?

MR. LOCKHART: Clearly, we're concerned when any American who is doing any kind of work, but particularly

humanitarian work, is put in danger. And it does not come as a surprise, given what we know about Saddam Hussein and his regime, and we expect that all safeguards are taken to protect Americans, and when they can't be taken, they're moved out of harm's way.

I think that somehow, if Saddam Hussein believes that this is of some value to him, he's sorely mistaken. He is as isolated as he's ever been, both around the world, but particularly in the region where he would expect to enjoy some support. We have contained the threat there, the sanctions have denied him of hundreds of billions of dollars that keep him from rebuilding his military abilities to threaten his neighbors. So again, it is always a serious concern when Americans are threatened, and we will take, and we expect the U.N., when they work under U.N. control, we expect the U.N. to do everything they can to protect them.

REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT
TO AARP NATIONAL LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

The Willard Hotel

THE PRESIDENT: Thank you, and good morning. Thank you, Mr. Perkins -- or, good afternoon. Don't tell anybody. (Laughter.) Don't tell anybody I didn't know what time it was. (Laughter.)

Thank you, Mr. Perkins, for your memory of that -- I did say that, about counting. Mr. McManus, Tess Canja, Margaret Dixon, John Rother, Horace Deets -- thank you especially for representing the AARP so well in dealing with the White House over the last six years.

I was glad to be invited to come over here today. You know, it's rare that a President gets to speak to an organization of which he's a member. (Laughter.) As I said repeatedly a couple years ago, I had mixed feelings about that, when you called my attention to the fact that I was aging. (Laughter.) But I don't have mixed feelings about the record the AARP has established for 40 years, calling attention to the challenges of aging to all Americans.

Those challenges, today, are more profound than ever as we look forward to the baby boom becoming a senior boom -- the number of seniors doubling by 2030. We owe it to 21st century America, to the children and the grandchildren of the baby boom -- as well as to all the seniors -- to meet those challenges and to meet them together.

I remember, in 1992 when I was a candidate for President, I came to your convention in San Antonio, and talked about the kind of America I wanted to work with you to build -- an America in which we honor our obligations to older Americans without burdening younger Americans. An America with its fiscal house in order and its future shining brightly. When I took office, we charted a new course to achieve that kind of America -- with fiscal discipline, more investments in our people, more trade for our goods and services around the world.

In the past six years, the American people have worked hard and come far. We know now that we have the longest peacetime expansion in history; nearly 18 million new jobs; wages rising at twice the rate of inflation; the highest home ownership in history; the lowest welfare rolls in history; and now, the lowest peacetime unemployment rate since 1957. Last year, for the first time in three decades, the red ink turned to black with a \$70 billion surplus. We project one slightly larger than that this year, and projecting them on out for about a generation, as we have ended the structural deficits that caused our national debt to quadruple between 1981 and 1992.

I want to thank you for your hard work over these past six years -- for standing strong for bipartisan progress on the

issues of great concern to you. Now, I ask you to stand with me and to say, we must meet the great challenges of the next century. We must use this prosperity, we must use this confidence, we must use this projected surplus to save Social Security, to strengthen Medicare, to meet the challenges of the aging of America.

In my State of the Union address, I laid out a four

-point plan to do that: saving Social Security; strengthening Medicare; providing tax relief to help Americans save for their own retirement; and a tax credit to help families with long

-term care for aging, ailing and disabled relatives. These will help our country to honor our duties to people today, and to uphold our responsibility to future generations.

On Monday, I sent my new balanced budget to Congress -- the first budget of the 21st century -- to implement this plan. First, in the budget we dedicate the lion's share of the surplus to saving Social Security and to strengthening Medicare. Both are important, and I'd like to explain why.

I proposed that we invest 62 percent of the surplus to save Social Security, and the surplus -- excuse me, for the next 15 years. I am very pleased that members of Congress in both Houses and both parties have agreed that this is the right thing to do. As you know, I have proposed investing a small portion of the trust fund in the private sector, to do it in a way that any private or state government pension would do. I agree with AARP that we absolutely have to insulate any investment of the surplus from political influence. And I believe we can, just as other public pension funds do.

I was in New York last night, talking to several people there in the investment community who came up to me and said they thought I was right and they hoped that we wouldn't let initial criticism stop us from offering a plan which would demonstrate to the American people that you could run this investment just like any other public pension investment is run. And I am confident that we can do that.

If we do this, we can earn a higher return and keep Social Security sound for 55 years. Now, all of you know that from the beginning we have measured the financial health of Social Security by asking if it will be sound for 75 years into the future. I do believe we have to take steps to strengthen Social Security for 75 years. I have looked at the options, believe me -- it's a lot easier to go from 55 to 75 than it is to go from where we are now, 2032 to 75.

I also believe we have to improve the program by reducing poverty among elderly women who are twice as likely to be poor as married couples on Social Security. I believe we should

eliminate the limits on what seniors on Social Security can earn. This costs the trust fund some money in the short run, but over the long

-term it will actually strengthen the retirement systems of the country and, more importantly, it will strengthen the quality of life of people in their later years.

Now, doing these things will require some difficult choices, but they are clearly achievable. You know basically what the range of options is and I know what it is, as well. To make them, it is clear what we have to do. We have got to work together across party lines to make these decisions. We have to work together across generational lines to make these decisions. But think of how we'll feel if we have Social Security secure for 75 years, if we lift the earnings limit and if we do something to reduce the deeply troubling rate of poverty among single elderly

women, who are growing in numbers at a very rapid rate.

I have told the American people and members of Congress

in both Houses of both parties -- I've met with dozens of them, literally -- that I am ready to make these choices and to make them with them, and it is time to get on with the job. Now, I feel pretty good about where we are with that, because of the initial positive support for setting aside the surplus portion for Social Security. I wanted to come here today to tell you what I said in the State of the Union I was very serious about -- I do not think it is enough. We all know that Medicare is going to have financial trouble well before Social Security does, unless we do something about it.

Now, if you look at -- where is my chart -- there it is.

(Laughter.) What I propose is to take 62 percent of the surplus, which you see there for Social Security -- maybe I'll bring it up a little closer. (Laughter.) You may be able to see it just fine, but I can see better from here. (Laughter.) And then to take 15 percent, about a little less than \$1 in every \$6 of the surplus, and commit it to Medicare.

Now, some of those who agree with us on Social Security do not agree that we should do this. They would use the entire rest of the surplus for tax cuts. I believe we can only meet our responsibility to the future by saving Social Security and Medicare. Now, President Kennedy, who first proposed Medicare, once said, "To govern is to choose." And so we should have a great national debate about the choices involved in managing this surplus. After all, we haven't had one in 30 years, and it's a little unusual for us.

Yesterday, we learned of a proposal that would make a very different choice about what to do with the surplus. The plan would spend well over \$1 trillion over the next 15 years on a tax proposal that would benefit clearly the wealthiest Americans -- who

have, I might add, done quite well as the stock market has virtually tripled in the last six years. I'm happy about that; we should all be. But we ought to look at this proposal against that background. It would do this before Medicare has been secured, and in a way that would prevent us from spending 15 percent of this, or investing 15 percent, of this surplus in Medicare.

Now, to govern is to choose. I believe that's the wrong choice; I believe this is the right choice. You, the American people, and the United States Congress will have to decide. This is the latest in a rather long series of large and risky tax proposals that we have heard over the years. If we had adopted even one of the large ones, we wouldn't have the surplus we enjoy today.

We cannot return to the old policies of deficit and debt. Quite apart from our obligations to deal with the aging of America, the strength of our economy is premised on our demonstrated discipline and driving down profligate deficit spending, driving down interest rates, getting private investment up, generating opportunities for the American people.

I believe the American people should have tax relief; in a few moments I'll talk a little bit about what I think the best way to do that is. I believe there are things we can and we must do to help families. And I believe our targeted tax cut for the USA account is especially important. I'll say more about it in a moment.

But, first of all, anyone who hopes to invest the surplus or to spend it on other programs, or to spend it with a tax cut, must first tell America's families: What is your plan to preserve and strengthen Medicare in the 21st century? (Applause.) I was always taught from childhood, as most of you TOP EVEN
- \p -

BOTTOM EVEN
MORE

were, that you may want to do a lot of things, but you have to do first things first. To me, Social Security and Medicare, with their looming financial challenges, are the first things, and we have to take care of them first.

I want to work with you to strengthen Medicare. I want to work with the results of the Medicare Commission that Senator Breaux is chairing. In the bipartisan balanced budget we reached in 1997, we extended the life of the Medicare trust fund by 10 years. But no one seriously believes this is adequate, particularly with more and more people qualifying for Medicare.

To stabilize Medicare, we should extend its life until 2020. To truly strengthen Medicare for the long

-term, we will have to take further steps. That means committing a percentage of the surplus to the trust fund. It also means committing ourselves to meaningful reforms that will meet the demands of the 21st century.

I am frank to tell you that some people have said, well, the President, by committing this amount of money from the surplus to

Medicare to the trust fund, is trying to convince people that we can just go on forever without making any changes in Medicare. That is simply not true, and I don't want to pretend that that's true. But neither do I believe we should be in the position of making reforms or changes that we might later regret, simply because we haven't stabilized the trust fund when we have the funds to do it. These funds should support meaningful reform and prevent permanent damage to Medicare and to the people who depend upon it and are entitled to rely on it.

So here's what I think we should do, with regard to at least basic principles, as we look forward to the 21st century Medicare program. Did they change the chart? Good. (Laughter.)

First, Americans should be able to count on Medicare and know it will be there when they need it. I have proposed to use, as I said, about one of every six dollars in the surplus for the next 15 years to just simply guarantee the soundness of the Medicare fund until the year 2020. Without these new resources, Medicare spending would have to plummet significantly below the private sector average. No one believes we can have that happen without seriously weakening a program that millions of older Americans need.

Second, Americans on Medicare should be able to count on a modern, competitive system that maintains high

-quality care and
top

-notch service by drawing on the best private sector practices.

Third, Americans on Medicare, especially Americans with lower incomes, should be able to count on a defined set of benefits and protections without having to worry about excessive new costs they can't begin to afford.

Fourth, Americans on Medicare should be able to count on a benefit that many have long waited for, and that will actually cut our cost over the long run, and lengthen life, and lengthen the quality of life: prescription drugs. (Applause.)

Now, I believe we ought to use the savings that reforms in Medicare can create to provide this prescription drug benefit. Yes, it will be more costly on the front end, but over the long run it is bound to save money. It will keep people out of the hospital. It will keep people away from more expensive medical procedures. It will lengthen life and it will lengthen the quality of life.

I want to thank especially Senators Kennedy and Rockefeller for their leadership on this issue. I look forward to working with members of both parties. But keep in mind -- within these principles, my view of Medicare is: take 15 percent of the surplus, make sensible reforms, add the prescription drug benefit. All three will be required to truly strengthen Medicare for the 21st century.

Now, as I said before, we know the American people have worked very hard to replace the era of budget deficits with an age of budget surpluses. They deserve to benefit from that, and they deserve some tax relief. The real question is: What kind of tax relief and how much should it be? What are the other competing

demands for the country? Again, to govern will be to choose.

I think we should use a percentage of the surplus to give Americans tax relief -- that strengthens working families, that encourages savings and the sharing of our nation's wealth among a broader range of Americans. And that is why I have proposed that we set aside -- we're back to the chart now -- 12 percent of the surplus, or, over 15 years, \$536 billion, to establish USA accounts, Universal Savings Accounts, that give working Americans a chance to save for the future. These accounts would basically involve the government giving a tax credit that would be a cash match for a certain amount of savings by Americans who save, with extra help for Americans who are lower

-income working families who have less ability to save on their own.

Now, all of you know that when Social Security was set up, it was never viewed as the sole source of income, ideally, for retirees -- although, unfortunately, it still is the sole source of income for a large number of people. We need a country in which we have a sound Social Security system, a sound set of pension options -- and all of you know how the pension marketplace has been changing, from defined benefits to defined contributions -- and we need, thirdly, a vehicle which promotes more private savings.

The USA account is designed to give tax relief -- which, I might add, would be considerably greater tax relief for middle income families than most of the other proposals I've heard that cost a lot more money. But tax relief in the form that actually promotes personal savings, more secure retirement and gives people who otherwise would not have it a chance to have a savings account which would give them the opportunity to hook into the creation of wealth in America, and to own a part of America's wealth

-creating enterprise. I think it's very, very important.

I have also proposed \$1,000 tax credit to help pay for the long

-term care needs of families who are caring for aged, ailing or disabled family members. We know that long

-term care needs will increase. Frankly, I would like this tax credit to be even larger. But I believe if we start now, within our other obligations to fix Social Security and Medicare and other competing claims and responsibilities of the government, I believe that this will become an integral part of the way we manage long

-term care, and will be a strong part of a bipartisan American consensus for how we should support long

-term care over the long run. So I very much hope that will pass.

For middle

-income families I have also supported tax relief for child care, for work related expenses for disabled Americans, for further tax relief from the interest payments on student loans and tax relief to businesses which help their employees start retirement programs. We've worked very hard for six years to stabilize the existing retirement systems and to facilitate the establishment of retirement programs by more small- and medium

-sized

businesses for whom the old laws were quite a hassle and a lot of trouble, and actually a lot of start

-up costs, so we're working very hard on that.

Now, this is the kind of tax relief that I think is good for the country. I have proposed tax reliefs to individuals and corporations who will invest money in areas of high unemployment in America -- in inner cities and rural areas, to bring private enterprise to create jobs and to generate more national growth and more national wealth.

This is the first time, at least in 30 years, when we've had a level of prosperity and the resources necessary to actually get free enterprise into the inner

-city and rural areas that still have been left behind by the economic expansion. And I hope you will all support that, because, keep in mind, that helps the whole economy. We have to keep finding new ways to grow this economy, even with a low unemployment rate, that doesn't spark inflation. And this is clearly the best way we can.

Now, I think this tax relief is good for America. We can afford it. It is all paid for -- all this tax relief I mention, except for the USA Account -- every other bit of this tax relief I mentioned is paid for in the balanced budget. It has nothing to do with this surplus. It will not have anything to do with undermining our fiscal strength.

I simply think we have to use the surplus in a way that honors our most profound responsibilities to our parents, to our children, to our grandchildren, and I think that we cannot waste a penny of it until we have saved Social Security and Medicare for the 21st century.

As I pointed out in the State of the Union address, there is another enormous benefit that will come from saving the surplus in this way. It will enable us to buy back a lot of the national debt held by the public. And that is very important. Why? In 1981, our total national debt amounted to about 26 percent of our annual income. In 1992 it had quadrupled in dollars, and it was about half our national income. When I got the budget charts, it was projected to go as high as 75 or 80 percent of our national income -- a very dangerous situation.

Now, the national debt has dropped from 50 percent down

to 44 percent of our income, but if -- if -- we save the money I recommend for Social Security and for Medicare for 15 years, our national debt will drop to seven percent of our national income. That's the lowest level since 1917, before the United States entered World War I.

Now, what does that mean in practical terms, to an average family? It means that we will have lower interest rates; lower home mortgage rates; lower car payment rates; more investment; a dramatic increase in national savings; and more economic growth. It also means that if we have all the financial instability you see around the world -- and I want to make it clear that the financial instability that we saw, for example, in Asia, came primarily not out of irresponsible government spending policies -- a lot of those people had balanced budgets -- but there was just turmoil in the financial markets because of banking systems and investment patterns. That undermines our ability to grow, when our trading partners get in trouble.

We need to know that we have some insurance against that sort of trouble here at home, so we can keep plugging ahead, even as we try to help our friends around the world get back on their feet and start growing again. So this is an enormous insurance policy.

The last thing I want to tell you is this: You can be thinking about what your successors around this table will be debating 15 years from now. Today, when we draw up a budget, the first thing we have to do is take interest payments on the debt off the table. Right? Some of you may own that debt -- you may have government bonds. We've got to pay you before we can do anything.

Today, that takes over 13 cents of every single tax dollar. Fifteen years from now, if we do this, it will take 2 cents of every tax dollar. Once we secure Social Security and Medicare, think what you could do with that difference -- in tax cuts, or investments in education, or whatever you think it ought to be spent on. This is a very important issue.

So, seven years ago, I said to you that if we worked together we could leave our children a nation that is stronger, freer, and wealthier than the one we inherited. Today, we actually have the chance to do this. Today we have a chance to deal with the aging of America -- a challenge facing every advanced society on earth -- in a way that is dignified, that has genuine integrity; that will strengthen not only the lives of seniors but will strengthen the lives of their children and grandchildren. It is an enormous opportunity, and an enormous opportunity.

I ask you to join with me to make sure that our country meets that responsibility. Thank you, and God bless you.

On the whole, the budget roll-out went well -- though attendance wasn't as great as last year -- and the crowd's energy level seemed to be down (maybe it was the Feb. drizzle, maybe it was that the CCTI and its billions aren't news, maybe it was the late hour).

I thought I should report on one very unhappy group. I got reamed yesterday by our friends at Amer. Public Power Assn. about the cut in the POTUS FY 2000 budget for the Renewable Energy Production Incentive (REPI). This little program offers huge dividends with this part of the power sector. Those folks w/in public power that are trying to move them forward say they all look to REPI as the first sign of how serious the Administration is about working w/ public power on climate. They think we just set ourselves back months in terms of getting voluntary action from public power.

Here's the situation. Last year, Congress funded REPI at our request -- \$4 million. This year we only asked for \$1.5 million -- so while other climate programs got a boost, this one got over 60% cut.

Congress created REPI as the public power alternative to the wind/biomass tax credit. The \$1.5 m. will cover all of the "Tier I" projects, which include wind and most biomass -- but before, we also provided \$2.5 m. to cover "Tier II" projects, which include as part of biomass some landfill methane capture. For climate purposes, they argue that the methane capture is probably more important.

Early this year, I raised this several times w/ Reicher. In hindsight, I should have made a bigger stink with you, but Dan always agreed with me and said he'd fix it. Now he just says we made a mistake. I gather the two of you spoke, and that he thought that it was taken care of, based on what you understood from OMB. He didn't realize that this meant such a huge cut, but he also didn't check back w/ his staff.

When questioned at DOE, he and TJ agreed to try to fix it. Not sure how. But I thought you should know.

A PROCLAMATION

Thanks to the dedicated efforts of scientists and researchers and the strong support of the American public, today we stand at the threshold of a new frontier in the prevention and treatment of heart disease. And in coming years, Americans will reap even greater benefits from our ongoing commitment to heart research.

Already, research has profoundly altered scientists' understanding of heart disease, revealing that the likelihood of heart disease is increased by risk factors such as smoking, high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol, diabetes, obesity, physical inactivity, and a family history of early heart disease. Armed with this knowledge, millions of Americans have been able to take steps to reduce their risk of illness. Thanks to scientific discoveries, those already afflicted with heart disease now have access to lifesaving therapies and procedures such as clot-dissolving drugs, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, defibrillation, and balloon angioplasty.

Even greater advances lie ahead. Fields on the verge of delivering major innovations include molecular genetics, gene therapy, biotechnology, immunology, and epidemiology. The next breakthroughs will include better noninvasive diagnostic tools that can help physicians examine the heart and blood vessels without surgery; an implantable mechanical device that can restore heart function to those suffering heart failure; and a drug that can promote the growth of new blood vessels to body tissues and organs with poor circulation.

But technology is not a panacea. Despite the great gains we have made, heart disease remains the leading cause of death in the United States, and millions of Americans have at least one risk factor for heart disease. Moreover, recent data have shown a slight rise in the death rate for stroke and a slowing in the decline of the death rate for coronary heart disease. Some cardiovascular conditions, such as heart failure, as well as two key heart disease risk factors, obesity and physical inactivity, are on the increase among Americans.

We must work together to make all Americans aware of the information science has given us regarding controllable risk factors for cardiovascular disease. It is particularly important that we reach out to African Americans, Hispanic Americans, other minority communities, and women, who often are at high risk for heart disease and stroke, and ensure that they have access to the resources and information they need to guard against these afflictions. We must also encourage families to teach their children the importance of adopting healthy lifestyle practices early and maintaining them into and throughout adulthood.

The Federal Government continues to play a vital role in improving the cardiovascular health of Americans by supporting research and public education through the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute of the National Institutes of Health. The American Heart Association, through its research and education programs and its broad network of dedicated volunteers, also plays a crucial part in bringing about much-needed advances.

As Americans look ahead to a new century and a new millennium, we should use the momentum of past heart research as a springboard to even greater gains. In recognition of the importance of the ongoing fight against cardiovascular disease, the Congress, by Joint Resolution approved December 30, 1963 (77 Stat. 843; 36 U.S.C. 169b), has requested that the President issue an annual proclamation designating February as "American Heart Month."

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM J. CLINTON, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim February 1999 as American Heart Month. I invite the Governors of the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, officials of other areas subject to the jurisdiction of the United States, and the American people to join me in reaffirming our commitment to combating cardiovascular disease and stroke.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this third day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and ninety-nine, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and twenty-third.

THE PRESIDENT: Thank you very much, Judge Keith. It's good to be in your presence again. Mrs. Marshall, Rosa Parks. Mr. Hill, I'm honored to be in your presence, sir. President Swygert, President Reid, Mr. Mecham; to Congressman Clyburn and members of the Congressional Black Caucus and any other members of Congress who may be here; Mr. Holder, Mr. Lee, and Justice Department officials who are here. To all the members of the White House staff, but especially Thurgood Marshall, Jr. (Applause.) I thank you for permitting me to be a small part of this momentous day.

"We are all created equal" -- the simplest, most powerful idea about human beings ever articulated. Our history is largely the story of Americans of courage and vision who have stepped forward, often at risk to their lives, to lead us in our ongoing march toward justice and equality. I thank you for chronicling their journey in this exhibit.

Perhaps no one in this century did more to open the doors to "the glorious temple of American liberty" than the man we honor and remember tonight, Justice Thurgood Marshall. You honor with this exhibit the courage of a man who traveled to towns of the segregated South -- places where he couldn't find a bite to eat when he was hungry, a bed to rest when he was tired, a police officer's protection when he was threatened. He did all that to argue that we are all created equal.

We honor the genius of a man who masterminded a strategy to dismantle Jim Crow, case by case, trial by trial, decision by decision, from Baltimore to Topeka to Little Rock to the United States Supreme Court.

The 14th Amendment, with its promise of equal protection under law, was Thurgood Marshall's sword and shield. It was pretty moribund when he began to work on it, but he breathed life into it and transformed it into a living charter of freedom. The legacy of the 14th Amendment -- the legacy of Justice Marshall -- the legacy of his mentor, Charles Houston, his colleagues such as Wiley Branton and Jack Greenberg and Oliver Hill -- the legacy of others we have lost, like that great lion, Leon Higginbotham, our friend -- (applause) -- that legacy can be seen every day, everywhere in America -- in

classrooms, in libraries, in restaurants, and in the lives and careers of so many of the men and women standing here tonight.

Because the road to freedom and justice is long and never ends, we can honor Thurgood Marshall best not only with grand buildings and museum exhibits, but with great vision and vigorous action, to make equality ever more real and discrimination that some day will be something that can only be found in museum exhibits. No one should be denied a home or a job, a world

-class education or equal pay for equal work, or indeed any part of the American Dream, because of race, or disability, or gender, or sexual orientation or religion.

During some of the darkest days of Jim Crow, a single phrase whispered in African American communities all across the South would give hope to millions: Thurgood is coming. Today, at the dawn of a new century, it is up to each and every one of us to ensure that Thurgood is still coming. (Applause.)

So let us pick up his sword and his shield, and fight for that more perfect union, that one America that was his great and lasting gift to all of us.

Thank you very much. (Applause.)
