A Proposal for Credible Early Action in U.S.
Climate Policy

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 1999 -- As international negotiations on climate change continue, momentum is building for domestic "early action" to begin reducing U.S. emissions of greenhouse gases in the nearer term. With unopposed Senate ratification of the Framework Convention on Climate Change (FCCC) in 1992, the U.S. and other Parties are already committed to adopt policies and measures to limit these emissions.

While the mostly voluntary measures undertaken so far have had some

positive effects, the U.S. and virtually all industrialized nations remain on a trajectory of significant emission growth. In particular, the limited success of these measures suggests that businesses and individuals are abstaining from significant new investments in emission reducing capital and research. This pattern will undoubtedly continue until there is greater clarity about both domestic and international policies.

Current proposals for early action continue to emphasize voluntary measures that do not provide clear and substantive incentives for credible reductions. Senate Bill 2617, for example, would credit early, voluntary emission reductions with an equivalent volume of emission rights under an unspecified future permitting scheme. In theory, a business that plans to undertake reduction activities in the future, once a permit program is in place, would have a similar incentive to undertake such activities much sooner thanks to early crediting.

From the nation's perspective, however, this proposal risks distributing too many credits for questionable early reductions. The only way to reduce this risk is to thoroughly examine each project and evaluate the true reductions incurred—a cumbersome and potentially expensive administrative process. Further, the proposal still connects the incentive for early action to the future worth of emission rights under an uncertain permit scheme, a speculative value that may fail to motivate sufficient activity.

cost. This should be true regardless of whether those reductions
occur among electric utilities, in the transportation sector, or
elsewhere. In an upstream program, we focus on domestic energy producers
(and importers) in order to obtain this broad coverage at the
lowest possible administration and monitoring cost.

all domestic emissions are covered by roughly
two thousand collection points. This is then augmented by a permit
requirement on imported fuels along with exemptions for non-combustion
use or export. The
key point is that this approach provides the
same incentives as a more
complex, more expensive, and less
comprehensive downstream
program focused on end-users.

The program should be broadened as quickly as possible to
include other greenhouse gases, sinks, and international joint
implementation projects.

These sources represent additional opportunities for equally effective
and potentially low-cost reductions in net greenhouse gas emissions.

Yet, they also pose greater challenges to monitoring and enforcement. We believe that rules and regulations for crediting carbon sinks and joint implementation emission reduction projects as well as controlling other greenhouse gases**Methane (CH₄), Nitrous oxide (N₂O), Hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), Perfluorocarbons (PFCs), and Sulfur hexafluoride (SF₆)**can be developed by 2004 or sooner. To the extent practicable, these regulations should permit trading among all gases, sinks and joint implementation projects, and should be consistent with internationally accepted definitions.

An essential element of this proposal is that it remains modest.

This modesty reflects the desire to proceed gradually while we undertake further research into climate change consequences, while the capital stock (both human and physical) adjusts to new incentives, and while other countries remain undecided about their own courses of action. Yet, one of the potential problems associated with any permit trading scheme is the large uncertainty concerning future permit prices, and by extension the compliance cost of the program.

Therefore, we propose capping the price of permits in order to prevent the program from becoming too expensive.

With a price ceiling*or safety valve*the government provides unlimited additional, above-target permits at a specified price. As long as the price remains below the ceiling, emissions are strictly limited to the number of permits in the initial distribution*the target. If the permit price reaches the price ceiling, extra permits are offered for sale and emissions are allowed to rise in order to contain compliance costs.

This ceiling price should therefore reflect the maximal burden that society is willing to bear in order to reduce a ton of carbon dioxide.

We propose an initial ceiling price of \$25/ton carbon in 2002 which rises by 7 percent each year (above inflation) through 2007. In 2002, this ceiling price is equivalent to a six cent rise in gasoline prices*less than one-third the price decline experienced in the past year. The equivalent rise in electricity prices is one-half cent per kilowatt hour. By beginning with a low ceiling price that rises over time, we provide a softer transition to these new incentives and send a signal that energy prices are likely to rise, not fall, in the future. This signal strengthens the incentive for technological innovation that is essential for future emission reductions.

there is an excessive accumulation of valid but unused permits in
the system. To avoid this risk we place limits on permit banking. With
large, sophisticated markets for carbon, firms will be able to
efficiently sell excess permits and purchase options on future permits,
thereby eliminating the need for long-term of banking .

the program be The final cornerstone of our proposal is that
equitable: therefore permits must be auctioned
and the revenues generated through permit sales must
be returned to households.

Since any carbon reduction program will raise the cost of carbon-based fossil fuels, households will bear a large direct burden in the form of higher household energy prices as well as an indirect burden in the form of higher prices for those goods and services with a high energy content. If the program is going to equitable*and indeed viable*it must compensate households for these price increases.

Thus, we propose quarterly permit auctions with 75 percent of all proceeds in the first year funding a direct payment to all U.S. households based on legal residency. In order to address special hardships, the remaining 25 percent would be given to states based on energy use by low income households and the vulnerability of industry (both owners and employees) to increased energy costs. In subsequent years, we propose reducing the share that accrues to states by 2.5 percent annually as these special hardships are successfully addressed. Revenue generated by extra permit sales at the specified ceiling price would follow the same allocation as auction revenues.

By establishing a credible early action program, the United States will learn a great deal about the opportunities and costs associated with greenhouse gas reductions*information which can enhance our ability to make prudent decisions.

We also expect that similar motivations will lead other nations to adopt policies and measures designed to reduce emissions. Accordingly, it is critical that a major evaluation of the U.S. and other nations, programs be conducted during the first five years of implementation. The evaluation should consider the environmental, economic, and social performance of the program. On the basis of that evaluation, the actions of other countries, and the status of the Kyoto negotiations, the United States can then decide how best to proceed in the future.

U.S. Support for Fire Prevention and Restoration
through the Mexico Nature Conservation Fund

President Clinton announced today an additional \$1.22 million in incremental

funding toward meeting a \$5.75 million pledge of U.S. support for Mexican efforts to improve fire management and provide alternatives to slash-and-burn agriculture and logging practices. The U.S. commitment followed last year's devastating wildfires in Mexico, which affected the environment on both sides of our border. The new funding will be provided through the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) to the Mexico Nature Conservation Fund (MNCF), which has agreed to match the U.S. contribution through private fundraising. The funds will be used by Mexican non-governmental organizations and community groups.

Wildfires in Mexico in early 1998 sent a pall of smoke over most of Mexico and parts of Texas and Florida. In September 1998, President Zedillo of Mexico announced a \$24.5 million campaign to reestablish natural conditions and prevent future wildfires in 188,000 hectares burned by the fires.

The MNCF is a non-profit Mexican foundation established under a side agreement of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) in 1995. The MNCF grants funds to Mexican non-governmental organizations for the conservation and sustainable use of environmentally important areas in Mexico. The fund is the implementing agency for rehabilitation efforts in areas burned by the fires last year. It is also active in reconstruction efforts in the Central American countries devastated by Hurricane Mitch. The MNCF has been capitalized with \$20 million from the United States and \$7 million from Mexico.

U.S.-Mexico Cooperation Against Border Violence

Today Attorney General Reno and Foreign Secretary Rosario Green of Mexico signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Cooperation Against Border Violence. The MOU is the latest step forward in the continuing joint effort by the United States and Mexico to build cooperation and understanding along the 2,000 mile border we share. It formalizes and enhances existing modes of communication between law enforcement officials on both sides of the border in order to help prevent incidences of violence along the border.

The United States and Mexico share a deep concern about life-threatening border incidents. To help prevent such incidents, both governments pledge in the MOU to take the following steps:

Develop procedures among law enforcement agencies on both sides of the border for responding to calls for assistance when conflicts, assaults, violence, and other threats to public safety occur along the border.

Develop training programs for local and national law enforcement in non-lethal response, proper procedures for patrol and arrest, and heightened community sensitivity.

Formalize communication between U.S. Attorneys and Mexican Consuls along the border.

Establish a working group to monitor and report on the success of these and other bilateral efforts.

In 1997, President Clinton and President Zedillo signed the Joint Statement on Migration affirming their commitment to enhancing bilateral cooperation in the management of migration between the two countries. Since that time, the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) and Mexican officials have taken concrete steps to further the goals of the Statement.

Last June, with the assistance of the Mexican government, INS launched its Border Safety Initiative, an unprecedented effort to reduce injuries, prevent fatalities, and educate migrants about the very real and ever present dangers associated with illegal crossing.

In January, officials from the Department of Justice, Department of State, and INS met with their Mexican counterparts in San Diego to discuss progress in implementing the border safety program. In addition, the participants agreed to explore border-wide arrangements between United States Attorneys and Mexican Consuls to investigate incidents involving U.S. law enforcement and Mexican nationals. The MOU on Cooperation Against Border Violence comes as a result of this meeting.

U.S.-Mexico Cooperation on Tuberculosis Control

President Clinton and President Zedillo of Mexico today announced a new agreement that will advance U.S.-Mexican cooperation in controlling and monitoring the spread of drug-resistant tuberculosis, a resurgent health threat in both Mexico and the United States. Increased commerce and tourism between the United States and Mexico, as well as labor migration across the 2,000 mile border we share, have raised public concern regarding infectious diseases in both countries. Tuberculosis is a major public health problem in Mexico,

where
an estimated 11,000 new cases appear annually. This disease primarily
targets
the poor, thriving in areas of malnutrition and inadequate sanitation.

Under the new agreement, the two parties will work collaboratively to
ensure a
reduction in the morbidity, mortality, and transmission of tuberculosis in
both
countries. The agreement calls on the U.S. Agency for International
Development and the Mexican Ministry of Health to identify new areas for
joint
actions to address the spread of tuberculosis in North America. Actions
undertaken as a result of the agreement may include increasing awareness of
tuberculosis as a curable disease, strengthening epidemiological
surveillance
of tuberculosis, and expanding laboratory diagnostic capability.

CLIMATE CHANGE & LABOR

- *Climate change is an issue on which Administration looks forward to working w/labor.*
 - **There is a powerful scientific rationale for taking action on global warming:** 1998 hottest year on record, topping 1997, which was also a record. Our leading scientists agree that human activities are starting to disrupt the Earth's climate. They also warn of serious consequences, like severe droughts, floods and health problems, if global warming is ignored.
 - **Taking action now amounts to an insurance policy against this serious risk.**
 - **Cost of this insurance policy is reasonable.** Administration's economic analysis concludes that implementing Kyoto Protocol would mean an increase of \$70-100/year for an average family's energy bill.
 - This price doesn't take into account the price *decrease* likely to result from restructuring the electricity industry.
 - Also doesn't take into account the various domestic initiatives proposed by the President -- such as increased investment in clean energy technologies and tax credits for consumers who purchase fuel-efficient cars, homes, appliances -- that can further reduce costs.
- *Kyoto Protocol is a good first step in fighting climate change.*
 - **Based on flexible, market-based approach that will allow emissions to be reduced in ways that make the most sense both environmentally and economically.**
 - **Protocol still needs work, however.** Still must "fill-in the details" on key issues such as international emissions trading and must encourage more meaningful participation on part of key developing countries. President will not submit Protocol to Congress for approval without such participation.
- *High-level Administration officials met w/labor leaders [from the IBEW and the AFL-CIO] [at the White House] last September to discuss these and other issues relating to climate change.* In this meeting, there were three main topics that were raised:
- **Electricity Restructuring.** Labor understandably concerned that workers are protected as legislative efforts intensify to bring about restructuring of the nation's electricity generation industry. In particular:
 - Worker transition issues: Need to make sure that workers are protected as electricity generation is opened up to competition. One way to do this is to ensure that there is a mechanism for providing this protection. I can report to you that

when the Administration sends up its bill on electricity restructuring there will be a provision that directs states to take into account worker transition issues as they define “stranded costs.” **[Need input from Ron]**

- Grid reliability: Need to make sure that opening up the industry to competition doesn’t mean a loss of reliability for customers. We understand that manpower levels have a lot to do with grid reliability and we will continue a productive dialogue with labor on this issue. **[Need input from Ron]**
- **Transition Issues.** Apart from the electricity context, we need to keep workers and their families in mind as our nation transition to a less carbon-intensive economy. We stated in September that we are committed to beginning a consultative process with labor so that we can fully consider a whole range of worker transition issues and what can and should be done to protect workers. **[Need input from Ron]**
- **Coal Industry.** Of course, one of the sectors of the economy where transition issues will be very challenging is in the coal industry. Also a topic in our September meeting.
 - Administration believes coal plays an important role in the nation’s energy portfolio. National Energy Strategy makes clear the importance of maintaining a diverse energy supply.
 - Also committed to ensuring that the coal our nation needs is used in the cleanest, most efficient way.
 - **[include Admin estimates of employment effects?]**
 - What Administration is doing to help mitigate impact on coal industry:
 - R&D into cleaner coal technologies. The FY2000 budget request contains \$122 million for R&D to develop next-generation technologies for coal combustion with much higher energy efficiency and lower greenhouse gas emissions. Also looking at new technologies that can absorb and hold waste carbon gases from coal combustion.
 - Abandoned Mine Reclamation. Interior Department is focussing its mine reclamation work to promote reforestation techniques that maximize carbon storage. This way the dollars spent and jobs created in reclamation work would flow to communities that have been heavily coal dependent.
 - Administration understands that more needs to be done. In particular, we are consulting with labor and industry on tax incentives to spur adoption of clean coal technologies as well as tax provisions to support advanced coking technologies.

PRESIDENT CLINTON PROPOSES NEARLY \$1 BILLION PACKAGE IN DISASTER
ASSISTANCE;
AID WILL HELP CENTRAL AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN REBUILD AFTER HURRICANES
MITCH
AND GEORGES

President Clinton today proposed \$956 million in funding for disaster assistance in the wake of Hurricane Mitch and Hurricane Georges, which hit the Central American nations of Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador, and Guatemala, along with Haiti, the Dominican Republic, and other Caribbean nations, in the fall of 1998. The additional funding, announced today by First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton at the White House, brings total United States assistance to these countries to more than \$1.2 billion.

In his letter of transmittal to Congress, the President said, "In light of the close consultation we have had, and the bipartisan recognition that the needs for reconstruction are pressing, I urge the Congress to act quickly to restore hope to this region and help our neighbors return to the path of democracy and economic growth."

Central America's full recovery from the storms are clearly in the U.S. national interest. Over the past decade, the region has made tremendous strides toward settling conflicts, strengthening democracy, promoting human rights, opening economies, and alleviating poverty. The economic destruction and dislocation caused by the hurricanes threatens to undermine these achievements. Disaster assistance to our Central American partners will ensure that their transformation continues.

Hurricane Mitch was the worst natural disaster ever to strike the Western Hemisphere. It caused the deaths of more than 9,000 people, left millions homeless, and resulted in more than \$8.5 billion in damages to homes, hospitals, schools, roads, farms and businesses throughout the region. Even today, hundreds of thousands of Central Americans cannot return to their homes while the economy, largely dependent on agriculture, has been severely damaged.

To date, the United States government has provided more than \$300 million in humanitarian relief aid to provide food, medicine, emergency shelter, and agricultural assistance through civilian relief workers and US military personnel, while also helping to clear roads and install bridges. Responding immediately to the disasters, the Agency for International Development (USAID), the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Defense were responsible for delivering urgently needed relief supplies to millions of people.

More than 5,000 U.S. military personnel have been working side by side with our Central American neighbors to help rebuild these nations and restore hope to the region.

The President's proposal will provide funding for reconstruction and restoration of local economies, prevention efforts to avoid future losses through environmental management and disaster mitigation, and debt relief. It will repay USAID and the Department of Defense for funds already spent in immediate response to the hurricanes. This proposal also will provide \$80 million to the Department of Justice's Immigration and Naturalization Service

to support policies to delay deportation to these countries and for other costs related to these disasters.

This proposal also allocates \$10 million to Colombia to help address needs arising from its recent earthquake, focusing assistance on health, housing and schools.

Central American Nations

More than a dozen Cabinet agencies will be involved in the relief efforts for Central America. For example, the Department of Health and Human Services will continue to take active measures to advance public health, and the Department of Agriculture will assist with farming recovery and land use planning. Funds in this package for the Central American nations hit by Hurricane Mitch will provide assistance as follows:

Reconstruction Assistance (\$ 613 million):

£ Restore clean water and sanitation systems and preserve public health, including:

- < Repairing over 700 damaged health clinics to serve at least 4 million people;
- < Providing clean water and sanitation services for more than 7 million people;
- < Stemming the spread of contagious diseases through health surveillance and prevention for more than 17 million people.

£ Help rebuild housing, schools, and roads, including:

- < Providing temporary shelter for 20,000 people;
- < Building 6,400 new housing units;
- < Establishing 6,000 temporary "open-air" schools and repair more than 1700 schools.

£ Restore agriculture, rebuild economies and create jobs, including:

- < Restoring agricultural production through technical assistance and delivery of seeds, fertilizer, and tools to small farmers;
- < Providing over 70,000 micro-enterprise loans;
- < Providing credit subsidy to the U.S. Export-Import Bank for short and medium term trade credits for imports of essential goods from the US
- < Rebuilding roads and bridges;
- < Funding business outreach for overseas private investment through Overseas

Private Investment Corporation.

Help local governments to manage the crisis with advice and assistance in reconstruction and in the management of funding to ensure that assistance is used efficiently and serves its intended goal.

Debt Relief: In order to enable Central American nations to concentrate on rebuilding their economies, this proposal would provide for debt relief with:

A deferral by the U.S. of all bilateral debt service requirements for the next two years (\$54 million);

An increase in forgiveness of \$19 million of Nicaragua's bilateral debt (for a total of 90%, or \$75 million) and of \$26 million of Honduras', (for a total of two-thirds, or \$103 million) through agreement with other nations in The Paris Club; and

A contribution by the U.S. of \$25 million to a multi-nation fund to cover debt service obligations of Nicaragua and Honduras to international financial institutions during the deferral period. This fund, the Central America Emergency Trust Fund, will be sponsored by the World Bank.

Caribbean Nations

Included in this reconstruction funding is the assistance of \$50 million to the

Dominican Republic, Haiti, and the Eastern Caribbean, which collectively suffered more than \$1.5 billion in damage from Hurricane Georges. This assistance will be concentrated in the areas of housing, health, and economic revitalization.

Environmental Management and Disaster Mitigation (\$64 million):

Assist farmers to use methods that are less likely to result in soil erosion, which would reduce the damage from future hurricanes, and will encourage farmers to shift to more productive crops.

Help local governments establish land use planning systems to mitigate effects of future hurricanes and protect key ecosystems.

Crisis Corps

Financing will also be provided for the expanded effort by the U.S. National Guard and Reserve to rebuild schools and clinics in the four Central

American
countries and the Dominican Republic and to deploy 220 Peace Corps
volunteers
drawn primarily from the new "Crisis Corps" of those who formerly served
in
the Peace Corps and who now are pitching in to provide short-term
assistance.

HURRICANE MITCH: THE UNITED STATES RESPONDS TO CENTRAL AMERICA
February 16, 1999

Following their visits to Central America in the aftermath of Hurricane Mitch, the First Lady and Mrs. Gore today announced the President's supplemental package of nearly \$1 billion in emergency disaster assistance. The supplemental package, which was developed in close bipartisan consultation with the Congress, will be directed primarily to help the Central American nations cope and rebuild after Hurricane Mitch, the worst natural disaster in their history.

The United States responded immediately after the Hurricane hit late last October, and has continued to maintain these efforts in the months that have followed. To date, the United States has already provided \$300 million in aid. U.S. military and civilian agencies have played a critical role, working with the governments of Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador and Costa Rica and a number of international and local non-governmental organizations to help provide food, water and relief supplies; to distribute seeds and tools; to repair water systems and road and bridge networks; and to provide medical assistance.

Key components of U.S. assistance to date are:

RELIEF

In the immediate aftermath of the hurricane, President Clinton directed personnel and resources from the military and civilian agencies of the U.S. government to support relief and rehabilitation efforts in Central America.

U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID)

USAID has provided almost \$92 million in food and other relief assistance.

On February 11, USAID provided \$4.1 million to the International Organization for Migration to construct and administer ten transitional shelters for displaced people in Honduras. This assistance will provide alternative shelter to an estimated 25,000 people living temporarily in schools, allowing the schools to open by March 1.

This new assistance is in addition to \$30 million from USAID,s Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance to provide health care, repair water and sanitation systems, restore agricultural production and support road rehabilitation activities. The funds were also used to transport and deliver a variety of relief commodities including shelter materials, water containers and blankets.

USAID has provided \$52 million in food aid, meeting 50 percent of the overall food needs. Under the PL 480 Title II food aid program, USAID,s Office of Food for Peace (FFP) will provide 60,000 metric tons of food to 800,000 Hondurans through next summer, 19,700 metric tons of food to 300,000 Nicaraguans for six months and 7,600 metric tons of food for 60,000 Guatemalans for six months. The total food allocation also includes a \$1 million contribution to the World Food Program,s appeal for El Salvador.

A grant of \$5 million has helped revitalize small businesses impacted by the hurricane. Joined with a \$12 million contribution from the Inter-American Development Bank, these funds will rebuild workplaces, reestablish inventories and generate employment.

U.S. Department of Defense

The Department of Defense has spent nearly \$150 million to support relief and rehabilitation efforts in Central America.

At the height of the relief effort, 5,300 military personnel were in Central America, representing the four armed services and their reserve components. Today, Joint Task Force Commanders in Honduras and El Salvador remain active in the region, coordinating the U.S. military response. U.S. Active Duty, Reserve and National Guard forces will be present in Central America through September to build schools and clinics, drill wells and repair additional roads and bridges, as part of an engineer and medical field training exercise called New Horizons.

Military personnel rescued more than one thousand people trapped by flood waters and provided medical care and immunizations to over 35,000 people. They cleared major roads and bypasses, as well as erecting prefabricated bridges. Military personnel also repaired medical clinics and schools, and provided communities with safe drinking water by building wells.

Military aircraft, including 53 helicopters were deployed throughout the region to assist distribution and delivered more than 3.2 million pounds of food and more than 500,000 gallons of water.

DoD transported to the region almost 8 million pounds of food, clothing, medicine and other relief items donated by American citizens.

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)

USDA is providing food aid and concessional loans, valued at \$63

million.

USDA is delivering 120,000 metric tons of wheat for Honduras and Nicaragua, 60,000 metric tons of wheat for Guatemala and El Salvador and 50,000 metric tons of corn for the four countries. It will also provide \$20 million in grants to Honduras and Nicaragua for the purchase of beans, vegetable oil, rice, and other basic commodities; and \$10 million in Title I concessional loans for food purchases for El Salvador and Guatemala.

RECONSTRUCTION

USAID has already identified an initial \$120 million within its own budget to support reconstruction efforts in Central America by reprogramming existing food and other funding and reallocating recently appropriated fiscal year 1999 assistance. These funds will help rehabilitate transportation infrastructure, restore public utilities, support health care, reestablish crop and livestock production and revitalize the economic sector. Of this, USAID will channel \$66.6 million to programs in Honduras, \$32.4 million for reconstruction in Nicaragua, \$16.0 million for El Salvador and \$5 million for Guatemala. USAID has also engaged with the private sector to leverage contributions and investments in Central America reconstruction. In total, more than one dozen Cabinet agencies will be involved in the relief efforts: for example, the Department of Health and Human Services will continue to take active measures to advance public health, and the Department of Agriculture will assist with farming recovery and land use planning.

DEBT RELIEF

The International Monetary Fund has estimated that the external financing needs of Honduras and Nicaragua -- the two nations hardest hit by Hurricane Mitch -- will be approximately \$1.4 billion over the next several years. Assisting these countries in filling this gap is essential to their recovery. Steps to do so include:

The United States, and other creditor nations will relieve Honduras and Nicaragua from debt service obligations until 2001. The United States will urge other creditors to provide similar relief.

The Administration expects that the international financial institutions will also contribute substantial amounts to help meet external financing needs, as will the World Bank-managed Central American Emergency Trust Fund. The Administration will work with Congress to provide a significant contribution to this trust fund.

Combined, these efforts could provide more than \$1.5 billion in debt relief. In addition, U.S. agencies will work with major donors and lending institutions to provide debt forgiveness of up to 67% of eligible debt for Honduras and up to 90% for Nicaragua.

TRADE

On February 10, the Overseas Private Investment Corporation and

Citibank signed a \$200 million loan facility for Central America and the Caribbean. Under this initiative, Citibank will extend medium and long-term loans to small and medium size businesses in the region. In addition to the Administration's Caribbean Basin Initiative enhancement proposal, the United States plans to submit to the Senate bilateral investment treaties with Nicaragua and Honduras.

IMMIGRATION

The U.S. has granted Temporary Protected Status through mid-2000 to nationals from Honduras and Nicaragua who were present in the United States as of December 30, 1998. This will permit these individuals to legally reside and work here for the next 18 months. The U.S. has extended a stay of deportation for nationals from El Salvador and Guatemala through March 8, 1999. The U.S. is also actively considering measures to address the circumstances of certain individuals from the region with longstanding ties to the United States.

REMARKS BY THE FIRST LADY
AND MRS. GORE

The Presidential Hall

MRS. GORE: Thank you very much, Madam Secretary. I also appreciate being here with Mrs. Clinton, Secretary Caldera*, of the U.S. Army, and all our guests from the Diplomatic Corps.

As Brian mentioned, I was honored and privileged to lead the bipartisan U.S. delegation that traveled to the region last November to inspect the damage and offer hope and comfort to the people that were so affected by Hurricane Mitch. And I would like to also acknowledge Representative Xavier Becerra of California, who was a member of the delegation and who also shoveled mud, shoulder-to-shoulder with us, out of a schoolhouse, and who was a very strong member of the delegation, and we are pleased that he could join us today. Also Representative Ruben Hinojosa, thank you very much for being here.

And our visit gave us the opportunity to witness firsthand the devastation in the region that has been reported so well by the media, and I would like to thank the media for their care and attention to make sure that people understood the proportions of the devastation to the region. And I think they did a great job.

Just from Hurricane Mitch there were more than 9,000 confirmed deaths; some 3 million people who were left homeless or displaced; damages to homes, hospitals, schools, roads, bridges and property that exceeded some \$8.5 billion. People just absolutely left without any infrastructure in terms of making their livelihoods. So, literally, this was the worst storm recorded in history in this hemisphere.

The people that I met made an indelible impression upon me and upon members of the delegation, I know. I remember meeting Carolina, a young woman in Tegucigalpa who had worked tirelessly, and I don't think had slept even by the time that we got there, to save hundreds and hundreds of people, along with other members of her community, by going door to door to warn the elderly.

It's a wonderful warm knit community -- in fact, many warm knit communities all around the area. And so they knew who lived where and who to go to make sure that they got out.

So she literally threw stones through the windows of cars to get people out as the cars were being engulfed by water, broke down doors and windows to get the elderly out of their homes because they didn't really understand some of the danger that this storm represented. Community leaders, like Carolina, are the unsung heroes of this storm.

I remember seeing families in refugee camps in Managua whose only homes were made from plastic and sheeting and wire that was strung, but who strung that on foundations of homes that would be theirs in the future, should they choose to build. And I think that that was something that gave them great hope even in that situation.

Most of all, I remember a little girl who pressed into my hands a medallion of the Virgin Mary after a long visit with her and other children in a makeshift camp. And she said to me, "I'm giving you this because I don't want you to forget me. I want you to remember always." And I have that.

These are remarkable people with great strength and great determination. And I'm so proud that America has responded so very well. Since the hurricane struck, we have provided hundreds of millions of dollars in food and water, medical supplies, emergency transportation and other relief. And the aid has helped prevent the spread of diseases that you see out come from after disasters like this -- so very important that that got there very, very quickly -- diseases like cholera and malaria.

It has also helped to open highways and roads and restores bridges that are so vital to get the supplies through to the areas that have been the hardest hit. Schools are now reopening, including a school in Tegucigalpa that our delegation worked to clear of two feet of mud, so it could be used as a medical facility temporarily. And now it's back to being a school, which is wonderful.

We're very proud of the tremendous job that Brian Atwood, as the Secretary of State just said, and the staff of the U.S. Agency for International Development have done to respond to the crisis. It's really been beyond the call of duty, what they've done. And more than 5,000 members of our military who are on the ground today, helping our neighbors to repair the damage and rebuild, we thank them very much.

And now is the task before us -- it is to move from the emergency relief assistance that saved so many lives to focus on the long-term economic issues. In my report to President Clinton following the trip, I recommended additional ways to help begin that long-term recovery. We made recommendations on debt relief, a temporary stay of deportation for immigrants, public-private partnerships and deployment of skilled Peace Corps volunteers to

help communities rebuild. The President has already accepted and begun acting on many of our recommendations, the recommendations of the delegation.

Last December, I was pleased to meet many of you at a reconstruction conference that we sponsored on ways that federal agencies could partner with the private sector and NGOs. I also met with the first group of Peace Corps alumni, known as the Crisis Corps, that are now working in Central America. I saw them before they went off.

Today we are taking another very important step. I'm pleased to announce that today's proposal includes funding to enable substantial debt relief by the U.S., and to encourage relief by others. We've taken many steps to show that we stand with the people of Central America in solidarity to help them recover their homes, their livelihoods, their economy, and their lives, and to ensure that we fully understand -- we the people of the United States will not forget them. We'll continue to stand with them.

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And now, please welcome a woman who has done so very much to bring hope and support of the American people to nations all around the world. Please welcome America's ambassador of goodwill, our first lady, Hillary Rodham Clinton. (Applause.)

MRS. CLINTON: Thank you, thank you very much. I'm so pleased that this day has come. And I understand some of you were a little delayed at the gate, for which I apologize, but we're delighted you are all here to be part of these announcements this afternoon.

We owe a great debt to my friend, and someone who has done a tremendous job on so many issues, Tipper Gore, for immediately bringing public attention to what had happened in Central America, and I want to thank her, personally, again for that.

Secretary Albright, thank you for your leadership, and for shepherding American diplomacy into the new century so well and with such strength and purpose. Secretary Caldera, thank you for being here. I enjoyed very much seeing you when I was on the ground visiting our troops, and it gave me such a tremendous sense of pride to see the men and women of the United States military performing as well as they always do, given whatever assignment they undertake.

I, too, want to thank Brian Atwood, and the entire USAID family for the work they do every day around the world, and in particular, what they've done here.

I also want to say a special word of appreciation to

Maria Echaveste, who headed up the President's task force that has led us to the recommendations that we are making today in response to the need that was reported to the President. And the people who put on the green eyeshades and find the money over at OMB, I want to thank all of you for working double- and triple-time to make this day happen. To the members of Congress, to the ambassadors and other members of the diplomatic community, and particularly to all the NGOs represented here, I want to thank you for your strong presence on behalf of the people of the United States, as you served on the front lines to help open roads, restore homes, bring services back into isolated communities, literally to save lives in Central America and the Caribbean.

This has been one of the most extraordinary international efforts in recent memory. When I visited the region shortly after Hurricane Mitch, I not only talked with American troops about what we were doing, but I saw firsthand supplies and troops coming from other countries, literally, around the world. On the tarmac in Honduras I saw a plane from Japan and another filled with food and clothing that just happened to be from Little Rock, Arkansas -- I don't know that that was planned. But more than that, I was moved by the meetings and conversations that I had with the leaders of these countries and with the citizens who have embarked on an extraordinary effort to rebuild not only the physical infrastructure of their countries, but more than that, the sense of hope and optimism that had recently come to this region after so many years of bloodshed and war, disappointment and pessimism about the future.

A woman in Nicaragua told me that the hurricane, in terms of its damage, was worse than both the war and the earthquake that leveled Managua. And when I obviously expressed some surprise at that rather remarkable statement, she said that it was because, unlike the terrible problems with the earthquake, or even unlike the years of unrest and war, certain parts of the country were left untouched, and life could go on, somewhat normally.

But here, the entire country was affected. Entire crops wiped out, villages destroyed, parents left without jobs or food for their children, so that it's clear that these nations that we are addressing today need not just short-term humanitarian relief, which we have come forward with in an extraordinary show of support, but they need long-term reconstruction, which is why, when my husband first announced U.S. assistance to help the people of Central America get back on their feet and look again toward the future with hope and optimism, he made it clear that we would stand with the people of these countries for the long haul. And today, we are making good on that promise.

I'm very pleased that the President has proposed

funding of nearly \$1 billion to help our Latin American neighbors repair and rebuild in the aftermath of these disasters. This proposal will bring our total commitment to over \$1.2 billion, and it will help in several critical ways. First, if this funding is approved, 17 million people will have help protecting themselves from the contagious diseases that too often rear their ugly heads in the aftermath of natural disasters.

Seven hundred health clinics will be up and running, and more than 7 million people will have access to clean water and proper sanitation. Second, this proposal will help create jobs, boost economies and rebuild entire communities.

When I was in Central America, I heard time and time again that the leaders, this new generation of leaders in these countries, understood very well that it was not enough just to stop the fighting, as important as that was, to reach peace agreements and to be able to establish the rule of law and democracy, but instead there had to be sustained investments in the well-being of the people of these countries -- investments in education, to raise literacy rates; in health care, to lower maternal and infant mortality rates. And it is this progress which has been so much put at risk because of the devastation of these hurricanes.

I remember very well in my meeting with the leadership of Guatemala and the promises that were made when the peace agreements were signed two years ago. Those promises were not just about decommissioning weapons, as important as that is. Those promises included investing more money in education and in health care and in making it possible for the people who are now free of war to feel that they have a future worth building.

In Nicaragua alone, 60 percent of the citizens are unemployed as a result of the hurricane. For farmers whose crops were wiped out, the President's proposal will provide important tools to help restore production. For people in rural areas, it will reinstall the roads and bridges that bring produce to markets and create jobs. And for 70,000 entrepreneurs, it will provide the small loans needed for microbusinesses. This is something that we feel very strongly about in this administration, from the President on. And some of you may have been in the White House last week when we held our second annual awards ceremony here in the United States to honor microenterprise. But we know that it's a tool for building lives and creating markets where none exist before. And so this proposal will include such funding.

The President's proposal will also help rebuild the roads, homes and schools that people rely on every day. For example, 6,000 new open-air schools will be created, and school supplies will be put in the hands of 200,000 children.

Finally, this proposal, we hope, will help our neighbors prepare for their future in several different ways.

They need more help in creating better systems to deal with disasters; that is one of the strong recommendations that I heard as I met with the leaders in these countries. Some countries were better prepared than others, but all can use some additional help.

They also need help in shifting the way they do agriculture, not only to more productive crops, but to help manage the environment better. Some of the damage was caused by the impact that erosion had created in many of the areas, so that the rains literally had nowhere to go but to create mudslides. So there needs to be more thought given as to how to create productive agricultural land with, perhaps, new crops, and, at the same time, undo the damage that erosion and environmental degradation has created in order to be better prepared for future storms.

This package also includes \$50 million to help the Dominican Republic, Haiti and the eastern Caribbean restore the housing, health care and jobs destroyed by Hurricane George. I saw, again, personally, when I visited the Dominican Republic and Haiti, the continuing effects of the damage from Hurricane George in both of those countries. And this will be a very welcome addition to the work that those countries are doing.

This proposal also includes an additional \$10 million to help the victims of the recent earthquake in Colombia, a devastating earthquake whose damage is still being assessed in some remote areas of Colombia.

From the start, our obligation to help Central America and the Caribbean recover from these tragedies has transcended politics; and so, too, must it now. This entire proposal is the product of close, bipartisan consultation with members of Congress from both Houses and both sides of the aisle. I'm very heartened by the support that Republican members have given, many who also made the trip to see for themselves the effect of these hurricanes. And it is our hope that Congress will quickly act to pass this proposal.

On March 8th, I will accompany the President on his trip to Nicaragua, Honduras, El Salvador and Guatemala, where he will see the destruction firsthand, where he will also meet with people who have been affected, as well as meeting with American troops and American NGOs. And he will hear what all of you in this room know so well, how important it is for us to extend a helping hand to our neighbors, to help them heal and rebuild.

I know that many of you who have worked in Central America and the Caribbean for many years understand how devastating the effect of these hurricanes have been. We understand how, at just the moment in time when all of these countries were poised for the future, this devastating natural disaster has seemed to come out of nowhere and set them back with respect to pursuing their dreams and their hopes.

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Well, we want to be friends and partners in rebuilding those dreams and hopes, and that is what the President's proposal attempts to do. It is why, I hope, in addition to what we're able to provide through this supplemental appropriation, the

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American people will continue with their generous support as well. With every road or bridge we help rebuild, with every crop that is planted, with every school and health clinic that is rebuilt, we want to send a strong message to the people of Central America and the Caribbean, who have overcome so much in recent years, that we will continue to stand by them as we move toward the future together.

We understand that the future of the United States is linked to the future of the people of these countries. And it is a great point of personal pleasure for me to be part of a process that helps bring together our countries and the people of our countries and our governments on behalf not only of the reconstruction work that needs to be done, and not even just on behalf of the humanitarian relief that must continue, but on behalf of this new strong friendship among our peoples.

Thank you very much. (Applause.)

Nobel Physicist Dies in Fla. Dive

WAKULLA SPRINGS, Fla. (AP) * Physicist Henry W. Kendall, a Nobel Prize-winner for physics for his work on the building blocks of matter and a co-founder of the antiwar group Union of Concerned Scientists, died during an underwater photography dive.

Kendall, 72, a professor at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, was working with a National Geographic magazine mapping team at Wakulla Springs State Park when his body was found in shallow water, Wakulla County Sheriff's Capt. Gene McCarthy said.

Investigators had not yet determined whether Kendall died of a heart attack or encountered a problem in the water and drowned. There was air left in his tank, McCarthy said.

An autopsy was planned for today.

Kendall, along with Jerome I. Friedman and Richard E. Taylor, worked for years starting in the late 1960s uncovering evidence that protons and neutrons, once thought to be basic building blocks of matter, were made up of smaller components called quarks. They all shared the Nobel prize in 1990.

“It was a remarkable discovery at the time and contributed to the deeper understanding of things,” he once said.

Kendall was a founding member of the Union of Concerned Scientists in 1969. He had served as that organization's chairman since 1973, leading efforts to warn against the dangers of nuclear weapons,

safety hazards in nuclear power industry and space-based weapons.

Through the group, he challenged President Reagan's ``star wars" defense system proposal * a system of satellites to defend American cities against nuclear attack. Kendall had also helped brief President Clinton in 1997 on global warming. His organization had studied the greenhouse effect, which many scientists say is raising temperatures around the globe.

``We're all in a bit of a state of shock over here," Howard Ris, the organization's executive director, said this morning. ``It's almost too trite to say, but he was a great inspiration for all of us and he had the rare gift to see where the world was headed and tried to make it a better place."

Ris said Kendall was a cautious, experienced diver and underwater photographer and a longtime friend of the late undersea explorer Jacques Cousteau. He thinks he went along on the trip ``for the fun of it." A National Geographic spokesperson did not immediately return a call for comment.

McCarthy said Kendall was taking underwater photographs by himself in about eight to 10 feet of water Monday afternoon only a few feet from the shore.

A diver who encountered Kendall about 4:30 p.m. said everything seemed fine, McCarthy said. A half-hour later, another diver found him on the bottom of the springs. Kendall was flown to Tallahassee Memorial Regional Medical Center, where he was pronounced dead.

Kendall received a Ph.D. in nuclear and atomic physics from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1954. He taught at Stanford University from 1956 to 1961, when he took a teaching spot at MIT.

In addition, Kendall and his brother were large shareholders in the family business, Kendall Co., which made Curad bandages, Curity diapers and hospital equipment. Colgate Palmolive Co. bought the business in 1972 for \$512 million.

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
