PROGRAMS	DESCRIPTION AND \$ AVAILABLE
<u>Worker Training, Education, and Employment Programs</u>	
JTPA Title III Dislocated Worker Program (DOL)	In 1993: \$4.3 million to OR \$6.5 million to WA \$59 million to CA Also, \$105 million can be spent at discretion of Secretary of Labor. In 1992, \$19 million of these funds were allocated to WA (\$7.7), OR (\$8.4) and CA (\$2.5).
Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA) (DOL)	TAA currently provides relief for approx. 3500 timber industry workers at a cost of \$10.5 million.
Wagner-Pryser Act/Labor Exchange Program (DOL)	Funds are allocated to each State to plan and administer a labor exchange program. Objectives of the program are to assist jobseekers in finding employment and to assist employees in filling job vacancies.
National Workplace Literacy Program (DOEd)	The DOEd provides funding to train workers in basic skills needed by an established industry in a partnership arrangement between an industry and an educational or training institution. Requires a cooperative effort among the State economic development agencies, local educational institutions, and the DOEd.
Labor Surplus Area Program (Office of Procurement Policy)	Regions with high unemployment receive a preference in the awarding of government contracts.

Economic/Community Development and Diversification Programs	
Community Development Block Grants (HUD)	
Water and Waste Disposal Loans (USDA-RDA)	To develop water and waste disposal systems in rural areas and towns with a population not in excess of 10,000. Loans made to public entities and not-for-profit corporations. RDA also guarantees similar loans made by banks and other lenders. \$600 million total for direct loans \$35 million total for guaranteed loans
Water and Waste Disposal Grants (USDA-RDA)	To reduce water and waste disposal costs to a reasonable level for rural users. May not exceed 75% of eligible project costs. \$390 million total
Technical Assistance and Training Grants (USDA-RDA)	To make grants to nonprofit organizations to provide technical assistance and training to associations on a wide range of issues relating to the delivery of water and waste disposal service. \$7.3 million total
Solid Waste Management Grants (USDA-RDA)	To make grants to public and private nonprofit organizations for providing technical assistance and training to associations to reduce or eliminate pollution of water and improve planning and management of solid waste facilities. \$3 million total
Rural Water Circuit Rider Technical Assistance (USDA-RDA)	To provide technical assistance for the operation of rural water systems. \$4.2 million total

Business and Industrial (B&I) Guaranteed Loans (USDA-RDA)	To improve, develop, or finance business, industry, and employment and improve the economic and environmental climate in rural communities, including pollution abatement and control. Funds used to guarantee quality private loans. \$100 million total
Intermediary Relending Program Loans (USDA-RDA)	To finance business facilities and community development projects not within the outer boundary of any city having a population of 25,000 or more. Loans made through intermediaries. \$32.5 million total
Community Facilities Loans (USDA-RDA)	To construct, enlarge, extend, or otherwise improve community facilities providing essential services in rural areas and towns with a population of 20,000 or less. \$100 million direct loans \$100 million guaranteed loans
Rural Business Enterprise Grants (USDA-RDA)	To assist public bodies and nonprofit corporations to finance and facilitate development of small and emerging private business enterprises located in areas outside the boundary of a city of 50,000 or more. \$20.7 million total
Small Business Administration Guaranty Loans (SBA)	In total, SBA loans are funded at \$3 billion, with maximum loans up to \$750,000.
Planning Grants (EDA)	To maintain and/or strengthen capacity of multicounty economic development districts (EDDs), and State and local governments to do economic analysis, strategy development, and to coordinate implementation. Grant size \$60- \$200,000. \$30 million available nationwide in stimulus package for adjustment projects.

PROGRAMS	DESCRIPTION AND \$ AVAILABLE
Technical Assistance Grants (EDA)	To economic development districts, communities, and nonprofits to acquire expertise to address special problems, design new programs, undertake industry/business surveys, feasibility and development studies, networking and market analyses, etc. Grant size \$25 - \$200,000 \$ as above
Revolving Loan Fund Grants	To States, EDDs, and local governments to provide financing for new and expanding businesses consistent with adjustment strategy. Initial grants \$300,000 - \$2 million \$ as above
Infrastructure Grants	To local governments to improve/provide amenities for business development identified in strategy, including small business incubators, industrial parks, building rehab, etc. \$45 million in stimulus projects for "ready-to-go" projects nationwide.
State Technology Extension Program (NIST)	Grants to States to coordinate/upgrade existing technology transfer and industrial extension activities. Grant size \$50 - \$300,000 \$3 million annually
Manufacturing Technology Centers (NIST)	To establish/expand regional centers to support demonstration and transfer of advanced technologies to small and medium size manufacturing firms FY 94 budget \$100 million
Working Capital Guarantee Program (EX-IM Bank)	Targeted at small businesses that need working capital to export any and all types of exportable goods and services, including wood products. Guarantees cover 100% of principle and interest. No specific dollar limit on this program. FY 93 estimated \$200 million in guarantees

Old Growth Diversification Project (USDA)	Provides loans (with state matching funds) to small and medium-sized businesses involved in manufacturing secondary and value-added forest products. FY 93 funding \$1.5 million
Land Stewardship Programs	
Forest Stewardship Program (USDA)	Provides technical assistance (with matching state monies) to small private landowners and develops a woodlands-management plan for the landowners. If the landowner approves the plan, USDA provides partial funding for plan activities. FY 94 funding at \$65 million
Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Loans (USDA-RDA)	
Resource Conservation and Development Loans (USDA-RDA)	
Construction of Recreational Facilities and Trails on FS/BLM Lands (FS/BLM)	To construct needed recreational facilities, annual increases of \$15 million per year for 5 years would be needed, and would create approximately 600 jobs.
Enhancement of Recreational and Commercial Fisheries (FS/BLM)	Funding levels of \$15 million per year for 4 years would be needed, and would create approximately 600 jobs.
Natural Resource Inventorying and Monitoring (FS/BLM)	Approximately \$18 million per year for 3 years would be needed, and would create 350 jobs.
Reclamation of Existing Roads in Owl Habitat Conservation Areas	Approximately \$6 million per year for 5 years would be needed, and would create 1000 jobs per year.

Increase in Timber Presale Work	Need \$30 million per year above the President's Budget level for three years (Based on 1991 Budget levels), and would create 1500 jobs

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
