Status of Transition

First, let me say, Stanley, how very disappointed all of us related to Guam are that you will be resigning both from the Government and as Presidential Negotiator for the Status of Guam effective December 31, 1995. You have been a very able public servant and negotiator and very responsive to Guam's needs. We know that, despite your focus elsewhere, you remain a true friend to Guam and to the American democratic process. We wish you the best of luck at the U.S. Institute for Peace and hope you will allow us to call on you sometimes there.

I have spoken to the Governor, to the Congressman and to appropriate staff members. We are all in agreement that the goals during this transition from you to a new Presidential Negotiator, as you and I discussed, are the following:

1) Status Report

The Commission would very much appreciate from you a Clinton Administration status report of the progress of the draft Guam Commonwealth Act including the achievement of agreement by the Administration to the mutual consent section of the Act. In

addition. I have followed up your conversations with Ed Knight and Dan Berman at Treasury on tax de-linkage and single-filing. Perhaps, with further discussions next week, we might also include progress on those issues.

2] Appointment of a New Presidential Negotiator

It would be ideal if when the Governor is here on Friday, December 15, we could agree on your replacement. Toward this end, the Congressman's offices and the Governor's offices have been in consultation and we have developed a list of persons whom we suggest the White House consider for appointment.

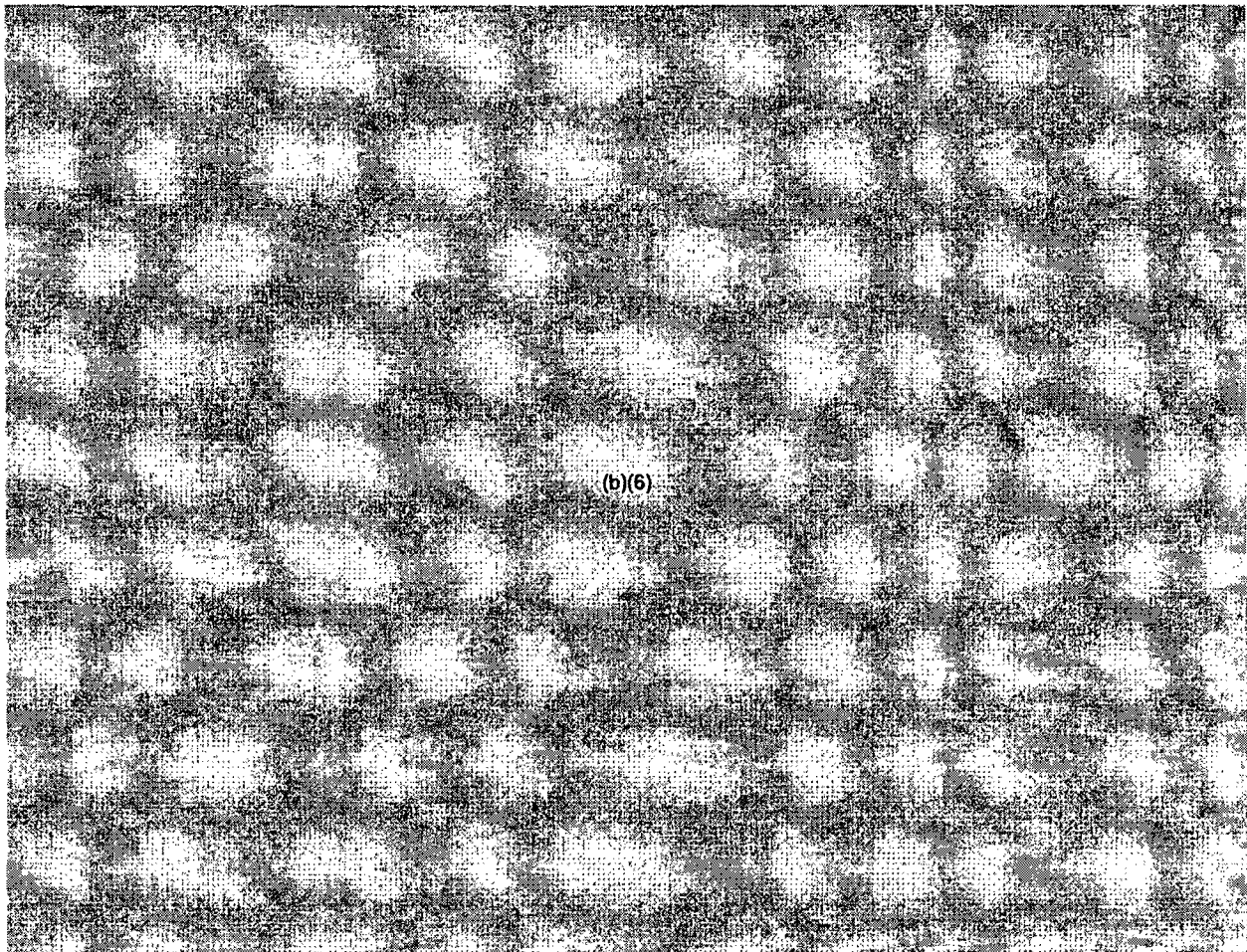
The ideal person, as you and I discussed, would be someone with access to the White House, good relations with Congress, a knowledge of the area, an interest in the appointment and time to devote to the effort.

Of course, as soon as a Presidential Negotiator is appointed, the first order of business will be to schedule a meeting for the Negotiator with the Commission, either in Guam or in Washington. We would hope this would be in early January 1996 at which a timetable for action would be determined.

3] Appointments when Governor is in Washington. Dec. 15:

Thank you for agreeing to initiate requests for appointments with Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt and with Chief of Staff Leon Panetta for Friday, December 15. We recognize that with the budget negotiations, December 15 is a difficult day for meetings. Both Governor Gutierrez and Congressman Underwood will be at these meetings. They hope their first meeting on December 15 will be with you.

The purpose of these meetings will be to agree on a new Presidential Negotiator and to outline a schedule for achieving Administration agreement to all issues of the draft Commonwealth Act.

We will follow-up with both offices. Please let me know the status of these requests on Monday, December 11.

Again, thank you very much, Stanley, for your efforts on Guam's behalf.
