SUBJECT: Possible Sunday Program in Budapest on December 4

Arranging the President's schedule to ensure his arrival in Budapest on Sunday, December 4, rather than on Monday, December 5, as currently envisaged, would relieve much of the considerable time pressure on the President's schedule of events for Monday, would enable us to schedule the President for several visible public events on Sunday (thereby advancing our agenda on several key issues and deflecting potential criticism of an over-hasty Summit trip), and further ensure his arrival back in Washington well in time for the Congressional Ball on Monday night. Below are several proposals for events which could be held on Sunday:

A. Hungarian Bilateral Events

- Bilateral with President Goencz and Prime Minister Horn of Hungary. While the meeting is necessary from the protocol point of view, there is no compelling reason why it needs to be held on Monday. It would fit with an effort to give Sunday a Hungarian bilateral focus. A meeting on Sunday would be held at the Parliament, a venue which the Hungarians strongly prefer over the CSCE conference site.
- Visit to the Hungarian Parliament for roundtable meeting with political leaders (or informal dinner).
- Outdoor/public event: possibilities include:
 - A visit to a recently privatized factory (perhaps coupled with a short meeting with Hungarian business leaders);
 - Walking tour of the old city/Castle and Cathedral (very photogenic, as well as chance for the President to relax and greet Hungarians in an informal setting);

- A visit to see the Crown of Saint Stephen (symbol of Hungarian independence and returned to Hungary from the United States during the Carter administration);
- A meeting with the U.S. business community, organized by the Chamber of Commerce (another possible informal dinner event);
- A town meeting organized either by the University or Academy of Sciences;
- A visit to the U.S.-inspired Regional Environmental Center for Central and Eastern Europe established in Budapest four years ago (we are considering including a statement of support for this institution in the President's speech); and
- A ceremony laying a wreath at the Raoul Wallenberg monument who saved thousands of Hungarian Jews from Nazi extermination camps. (Note, however, that the Holocaust Memorial Museum is holding an event on January 17, 1995, honoring Raoul Wallenberg, to which the President has been invited, and which we recommend he attend.)

B. CSCE-Related Events

- Bilateral with Yeltsin on Sunday in order to achieve progress toward one of our key objectives -- the establishment of a CSCE peacekeeping force in Nagorno-Karabakh. This would be an opportunity to explain the NAC decisions on NATO enlargement and narrow U.S.-Russian differences over Bosnia. Time permitting, we could usefully address several arms control issues as well.
- Trilateral denuclearization ceremony with Yeltsin and Kuchma (this would relieve pressure on the President's schedule for Monday and thereby avoid the difficult protocol issues of his departing the plenary hall before the conclusion of some of the major addresses and before the end of the working lunch).
- Other bilaterals: although it will be difficult to choose among our many allies, the President might wish to consider further bilaterals with Major, Mitterrand or Kohl, for example. Alternatively, we could agree to a long-standing Yeltsin proposal of holding a Contact Group Summit (although this would be high risk given the low

prospects of agreement on decisive new measures on Bosnia).

C. Other

- Meeting with Embassy staff at Ambassador's residence.
