Conventional Arms Transfers

The CSCE paper "Principles Governing Conventional Arms Transfers" was agreed prior to the Rome Ministerial. The measure calls for, inter alia, states to consider mutual assistance in the establishment of effective national mechanisms for controlling the transfer of conventional arms and related technology. Participating states also agree to exchange of information in the FSC about national legislation and practices in the field of transfers on conventional arms and related technology and on mechanism to control these transfers. Below are steps the U.S. has taken consistent with these commitments:

- o Nunn-Lugar legislation provides for assistance to the four nuclear states of the former Soviet Union for the establishment of both effective export control systems and the indigenous capabilities to sustain such systems.
- o The U.S. has held a series of technical consultations on export control issues as part of the COCOM liberalization process.
- o Under a Department of Commerce program, U.S. experts have conducted export control legal consultations in several states, i.e., Poland, Lithuania, Romania and Bulgaria.
- o The U.S. is planning a regional briefing and training forum for export control officials from all Central European countries.
- o The U.S. and other CSCE states share information required by the UN Register of Conventional Arms in the FSC.
- o On xxx, 1994, a plenary meeting of the FSC was dedicated to the discussion of arms export policies; national experts participated in the meeting.
- o The CSCE paper "Principles Governing Conventional Arms Transfers" was used as the basis for the development of a Code of Conduct on conventional arms transfers in the CD, and was drawn on by policymakers during the U.S. review of conventional arms transfer policy.

SUBJECT: Interagency Work Plan for Budapest Review Conference

Attached is our proposed tasking of U.S. position papers to serve as the basis for the Delegation's work during the Budapest Review Conference. These papers will flesh out our initial guidance cable, enabling the Del to engage actively in all facets of Working Group Two (WG 2). Once the papers have been agreed interagency, we will fax them to the Del. (This was the approach we used in preparing for Helsinki, and it seemed to work well.)

The papers are keyed to the list of topics for discussion under WG 2 and are fairly self-explanatory. Papers on individual FSC Program for Immediate Action items should:

- 1) update the status of implementation of items agreed (this includes U.S. implementation to date);
- 2) include a statement of U.S. goals with respect to those items currently under discussion (e.g., a Code of Conduct should establish norms for the use of armed forces in a democratic society); and
- 3) outline U.S. policy (e.g. on non-proliferation) or pose questions (e.g. on approaches to regional security) to help guide and stimulate discussion of items for further consideration.

I would appreciate hearing agencies' reactions to the workplan by COB Thursday. I realize the deadlines are tight, but the working groups begin meeting on October 14, and we would like to get as much as possible out to the Del at the outset of the Conference. We are not looking for lengthy treatises; one or two pages will suffice. As the conference progresses we will have a better sense of what additional contributions or guidance are needed from us.

If, as I fear, my Irish obligations keep me from attending your meeting this morning on CFE/NATO expansion, let me offer a few comments which you may file "donde el sol no brilla," as Ms. Eatmon might say:

Option I - I have always had a horror of opening up parts of CFE to renegotiation. What can work -- with great difficulty and only under Dr. Timbie's personal supervision -- in bilateral treaties with Moscow is almost certain to fail in a multilateral three-ring circus like CFE. The specific ideas in Option I look impossible to get agreement on in Vienna and doomed to die the death on the Hill.

Option II - I don't see how we can expect to get a better deal on most of the things we care about in a new treaty. We risk winding up with less than we started with.

Option III - Faute de mieux, the box to check.

Option IV - Maybe a nice position to adopt tactically, but in full recognition that the Russians won't accept it and it is not politically defensible, so maybe we should go to Option III to start with.

I will raise all this with Gerry Adams the next time I see him.
