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PRESS STATEMENT

The White House announced today that the President plans to attend the Summit Meeting of the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe (CSCE) on December 5 in Budapest, Hungary.

Since the adoption of the Helsinki Final Act in 1975, the CSCE has played a unique role in advancing the goals of democracy, tolerance and respect for human rights. Created during the Cold War, the CSCE -- with its emphasis on safeguarding freedoms within all its member states -- helped pave the way for Europe's transformation beginning in 1989. Now CSCE has a role to play in supporting the transition to a freer, democratic and secure Europe. America's security and prosperity will be enhanced as the values espoused by the CSCE take root.

Leaders of the 53-nation CSCE will gather to take stock of their respective compliance with CSCE's principles and standards. They will examine proposals for enhanced cooperation in conflict management and prevention, promotion of economic ties and free-market reforms, respect for human rights, and expansion of cultural ties. Respect and support for the sovereignty and independence of the newly-emerged nations of Europe represents another priority area for the CSCE's activities. The leaders plan to undertake initiatives to energize and strengthen CSCE, particularly its role as the institution of first resort to prevent, manage, and contain potential conflict in Europe.

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MISSION STATEMENT

The new era of security cooperation in Europe has led to the development of the CSCE beyond the status of a conference. Heads of State and Government are determined to exploit its potential to the full. Reflecting this it will henceforth be known as the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe.

Heads of State and Government have directed that its future role and functions will be as follows.

- to make vigorous use of its norms and standards in shaping a common security space;
- to serve as the inclusive, consensus-based and comprehensive forum for consultation and cooperation in Europe;
- to foster good neighborly relations through the conclusion of bilateral and regional agreements between participating states;
- to strengthen further the CSCE's capacity in preventive diplomacy, its ability to provide early warning of tension and potential conflict and to take preventive action;
- to develop its principles and capabilities in conflict resolution, crisis management and peacekeeping carried out and monitored under its responsibility, and in post-conflict reconstruction;
- to enhance transparent effective arms control and confidence building throughout the CSCE area and at regional levels;
- to promote cooperation among participating states to establish strong market based economies throughout the CSCE area.

In implementation of these objectives, the Council will function as follows:

- Heads of State and Government will meet every three years at the conclusion of a review conference.

- The Ministerial Council of the CSCE will meet annually at the level of Foreign Minister.

- The Senior Council will be composed of representatives from capitals at the level of Deputy Minister or Political Director. It will meet a minimum of twice yearly in Prague, chaired by the Chairman-in-Office. Its function will be to set forth policy and budgetary guidelines.

- The Permanent Council will be a standing body composed of representatives, resident in Vienna. It will be chaired by the representative of the chairman. Its functions will be those of the former Permanent Committee.

Overall political authority will remain with the Chairman-in-Office. The CIO shall use all the measures at his/her disposal including, inter alia, the Troika to assist him/her in the exercise of his/her functions, and personal representatives.

The Secretary-General acts in support of and in agreement with the CIO. His responsibilities shall include initiating reports, despatching fact-finding missions, calling attention to violations of CSCE principles, and participating in Troika Ministerial meetings.

To ensure greater coherence and efficiency, increased use will be made of steering groups.

The purpose of its new mission and structures is to enable the OSCE to assume a central role in the promotion of a common European security space based on the principles of the Helsinki Final Act.

The OSCE will establish the closest cooperative ties with the UN and with European and Trans-Atlantic organizations while avoiding duplication of effort. As members of a regional arrangement under Chapter 8 of the UN, OSCE states will make every effort to achieve pacific settlement of local disputes through the CSCE before referring them to the UN Security Council.

As a comprehensive framework for security in Europe, the OSCE should act as a depository for cooperative arrangements and, as appropriate, should monitor them.

In its organizational development the OSCE will remain flexible and dynamic. It will regularly review its goals, operations and structural arrangements. Member states will furthermore examine possible ways of incorporating their commitments into national legislation, and where appropriate of concluding treaties.
