MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Addendum to the May 14 ISTE A Reauthorization memo (see attached)

This morning Erskine asked that we clarify the division of views within the White House on the latest Congressional offer on the ISTE A reauthorization.

Since last night, we both met with the combined House and Senate leadership and committee staff. We laid out an alternative approach that would not require any unacceptable offsets. We expressed clearly our concern about the use of the proposed offsets. The discussion is now aimed at closing a gap of roughly \$7 billion over 6 years.

It appears that the combination of our senior advisors veto threat, and bringing constructive alternatives to the table is having a positive impact. We have received signals from Gingrich's staff this afternoon that they may be willing to work with us to find acceptable offsets. Technical staff discussions will continue over the weekend.

We are unable to determine whether we have the votes to sustain a veto at this time. Despite this concern, several members of your economic team, including Erskine, Gene Sperling(?), Frank Raines, Jack Lew, and Secretary Rubin, would recommend you veto the bill as the only way to maintain our ability to pursue other aspects of your policy agenda later in the year and maintain fiscal discipline.

John Podesta, Rahm Emanuel, Larry Stein, Doug Sosnik, and Paul Begala want you to be aware of the real risk if your veto is overridden. You could not only suffer a political loss, but in the long run the override could undermine your ability to affect other decisions on the Hill. They would only support a veto if we had a reasonable chance to sustain an override.

The stakes go well beyond this bill, and will impact our ability to resolve other funding issues later in the year.

Linda Lance asked me to pass the following on to you in the event the issue arises during the ISTEА negotiations. She has heard that Jim Lyons at USDA may have provided Sen. Reid and others with ISTEА language that would allocate funds to USDA's forest highways. Linda's strong concern, which is shared by the enviro groups, is that such a provision is an

opportunity for mischief on the Hill. (Linda mentioned that this was the message given to Lyons previously by EXOP and the enviros. Lyons apparently has tried to "perfect" the language on his own to prevent mischief. CEQ and the enviros can't verify that the language can or has been "perfected" and therefore want it out.) She likened this to another timber rider.

Linda strongly wants us to oppose any attempts by our Democratic friends to give us the forest highway money "the Administration" requested. Any questions should be directed to CEQ's GC, Dinah Bear who is pageable though Signal. She is passing the same message on to Steve Palmer at DOT.

Bill Hughes sent us draft House Republican leadership ISTEА language on the spending side of the veterans issue. It spends about \$1.85 billion over five years. The President's proposed increases in veterans GI bill/Education benefits (\$965 million) are in the package. The Labor veterans training money is not. The package also has about \$882 million of unrequested enhancements in certain veterans survivor and disability benefits.

Larry - The language also includes a provision that purports to set aside any excess savings from VA tobacco (that is not spent on surface transportation programs) to help pay for future legislation that would create a VA/HHS Medicare subvention demo. The legislation for the demo does not appear in the draft.

This is the first example of legislation finding its way into the conference report that is not germane to ISTEА (or paying for ISTEА). Hughes tells me that the language came from Len Swinehart on the Speaker's staff. I pushed back on Hughes who expressed surprise that such language was in the package and that anyone thought there would be money left on the table. Can you push back on Swinehart both on policy grounds and more generally on any efforts to put non germane items in the conference report?

Transit Spending in the ISTEA Reauthorization Bill Talking Points

- The original House and Senate bills would have provided more than \$219 billion and would have required offsets of roughly \$34 billion in outlays. The Senate bill was simply an authorization; the bill included no guarantee that the funds actually would be appropriated.
- On May 5, the Administration proposed an authorization to spend \$184 billion -- \$150 billion for highways and \$34 billion for transit; all of the spending would be guaranteed through a new budget mechanism.
- On May 13 the Republican Congressional Leadership announced an agreement in principle to spend \$201 billion -- \$167 billion in highway spending and \$34 billion in transit spending for 1998-2003.
- Left unchanged, the Leadership agreement would cost roughly \$23 billion in other outlay savings. Paying for the agreement would require either spending the budget surplus, lowering the discretionary caps, or making unacceptable offsets in other discretionary spending.
- The Administration is pressing Congress to change the final agreement in two ways. **First, reduce total spending to a level that can be offset fully by the VA/tobacco proposal alone. Second, increase the share of spending dedicated to transit.**
- Since the Congressional leadership's proposal announcement, policy changes have been identified that could reduce by about \$7.7 billion the total offsets needed to pay for the announced plan. About \$6.9 billion -- almost 90 percent -- of these outlays savings could be realized by changing the proposed highway spending. The majority of the highway savings would result from lowering by roughly \$5.2 billion the amount of money made available for obligation.
- These outlay savings would be achieved without reducing total transit funding below the levels in the Leadership agreement for the period 1998-2003. Simply phasing-in the increased transit spending would realized outlay savings of \$0.8 billion. Transit spending would average 17 percent of total spending during the entire authorization. Transit spending would start at 16 percent of total surface transportation spending, and then rise to 20 percent of total spending by the end of the authorization period. For the first time, this transit/highway split would be guaranteed.

- Under the Leadership agreement:
 - For the first time, transit spending levels would be guaranteed. The transit community would no longer have to endure the uncertainty of the annual fights through the appropriations process to secure adequate funding.
 - During 1998-2003, transit would spend 130 percent of prior-year Transit Account receipts; Highways would spend 100 percent of prior-year Highway Account receipts.
 - The Leadership agreement would provide transit with just under 17 percent of total surface transportation spending during the 1998-2003 authorization period -- the same share received by transit during ISTEA (transit *authorizations* were 21 percent of ISTEA spending; transit *appropriations* were only 17 percent).
- The Administration seeks a final bill that can be paid for with a single offset -- VA tobacco -- and provides transit with a share of total spending that rises to 20 percent by the end of the authorization period.

Q: WHY SHOULDN'T THE SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT SAVINGS BE USED FOR THE TRANSPORTATION BILL? DIDN'T THE ADMINISTRATION PROPOSE THIS REDUCTION?

A: The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) savings should be devoted to preserving and expanding services for children and families; the Administration has proposed other offsets sufficient to fund a sizeable increase in transportation spending.

The Social Services Block Grant provides funds to States to help them accomplish a number of goals, including promoting self-sufficiency/reducing dependency, preventing child and elder abuse and preserving/reuniting families, and providing home or community-based alternatives to institutional care.

Among the services most commonly provided using SSBG funds are child care/day care (14.4% of total SSBG funds devoted to this purpose), protective services for children (10.7%), home-based alternatives to institutional care (10.4%), and foster care (10.1%). [Source: FY 1995 data reported by States]. Other services provided through SSBG by the majority of States include adoption, abuse/neglect prevention and adult protective services.

The Administration proposed the SSBG reduction, in a broad sense, to reallocate resources to other programs (including other State-run programs) that serve much the same population -- children and families, especially the disadvantaged.

While the Administration's budget does include a reduction of about \$3.2 billion over five years in SSBG, it also includes, for example, \$21.3 billion over five years to increase the availability and quality of child care and promote early learning, largely through the existing State child care systems.

Using savings from SSBG, a program that supports services for children, families and the elderly, to offset excessive transportation spending is inappropriate.

According to EPA staff, the conferees have a deal on the environmental riders.

Inhofe Amendment Related Language

Although they have not seen the language yet, there reportedly is substitute language on regional haze. This provision would give those areas that are in attainment or unclassifiable for PM2.5 one year after

the attainment or unclassifiable designation to develop a regional haze SIP and the regional haze SIPs would still be tied to the PM2.5 timetable. In addition, there is bill language endorsing the Grand Canyon Visibility Commission's recommendations.

The one-year delay in the monitoring network schedule reportedly is gone.

They reportedly removed the language requiring the National Research Council recommendations for the PM network, and, instead have included report language exhorting EPA to follow those recommendations.

Other Riders

The bill managers have agreed to resist the other riders such as the Wise and Delay clean air amendments and the Solomon cleanup amendment.

EPA staff say that the only problem that they have now is with regional haze, but if it stays as advertised, they can live with it.

Today, President Clinton and Congress Agreed To An ISTEA Reauthorization Bill That Includes An Historic Investment in Infrastructure While Maintaining Fiscal Discipline and Protecting Critical Investments, Such As Education, the Environment, and Health Care. While providing an historic investment in our infrastructure, the agreement maintains President Clinton's priorities of reserving the surplus until Social Security is reformed and investing in critical areas such as education, the environment, and health care. In response to the concerns the Administration raised, Congress improved the bill and the agreement now represents a solid compromise that is consistent with President Clinton's core principles:

Strengthens Our Infrastructure. The agreement guarantees nearly \$200 billion to continue rebuilding America's transportation system -- an approximately 30-percent increase over the 1991 ISTEA reauthorization. This agreement will help communities modernize and build the roads, bridges, railways, and buses that link the people of our great and vast country together, that keep our economy strong and vibrant.

Maintains Fiscal Discipline. The agreement cuts the increase in excess transportation funding in half -- reducing it by \$17 billion from the extra spending levels that were included in the original Congressional bills -- even though those bills had passed the House and Senate by large majorities.

Preserves Surplus Until Social Security Is Reformed. Unlike the original Congressional bills, the compromise is fully paid for with real offsets. And because the agreement does not touch the surplus, it is fully consistent with the President's call to "Save Social Security First."

Protects Critical Investments in Our Future. Unlike the original Congressional bills, the transportation agreement does not squeeze other critical investments in our future, such as education, health care, research and development, and the environment, because it is not financed by lowering the discretionary caps.

This Highway-Transit Bill Agreement Also Reflects President Clinton's Priorities -- By Expanding Transit Funding, Protecting the Environment, Helping Move People from Welfare to Work, Helping Disadvantaged Businesses, Extending the Ethanol Tax Credit, and Strengthening Border Infrastructure.

Expands Transit Funding Within A Smaller Bill. While the agreement has

less overall spending than the original Congressional bills, it increases the share of transit funding from 17 percent of total surface transportation spending to 20 percent of total spending by 2002.

Protects the Environment. The highway-transit agreement strengthens proven strategies to protect public health and the environment by increasing funding for the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement program 75 percent by FY2000.

Helps Move People from Welfare to Work. One of the biggest barriers facing people who move from welfare to work -- in cities and in rural areas -- is finding transportation to get to jobs, training programs and child care centers. To help those on welfare get to their jobs, the highway-transit agreement authorizes \$900 million over the next six years for President Clinton's welfare-to-work transportation plan. Of the \$150 million per year, \$50 million is guaranteed in FY99, rising to the full \$150 million per year guaranteed in FY2003.

Helps Disadvantaged Businesses. The highway-transit agreement provides opportunities to disadvantaged businesses by retaining the Department of Transportation's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program.

Extends the Ethanol Tax Credit. In order to provide incentives to use ethanol in gasoline and protect the environment, the highway-transit agreement extends the Ethanol Tax Credit through FY2007.

Strengthens Border Infrastructure. The highway-transit agreement authorizes the Administration's program to target resources to border crossings to improve traffic flow and reduce illicit trade. The agreement allows highway funding to be used for Customs and INS equipment that speeds border crossings.

While the Agreement Provides Funding For Increased Safety, It Does Not Include A National Drunk Driving Standard of .08 BAC. The agreement includes a number of measures to increase safety, including incentive grants to increase seat-belt use, new measures to target repeat drunk drivers and to ban open alcohol containers in cars, and a strong program to make highway-rail grade crossings safer. However, the President is disappointed that Congress refused to lower the national drunk driving standard to .08 percent blood alcohol content (BAC). The President will continue to work to make sure that .08 is the law in every state of the country.
