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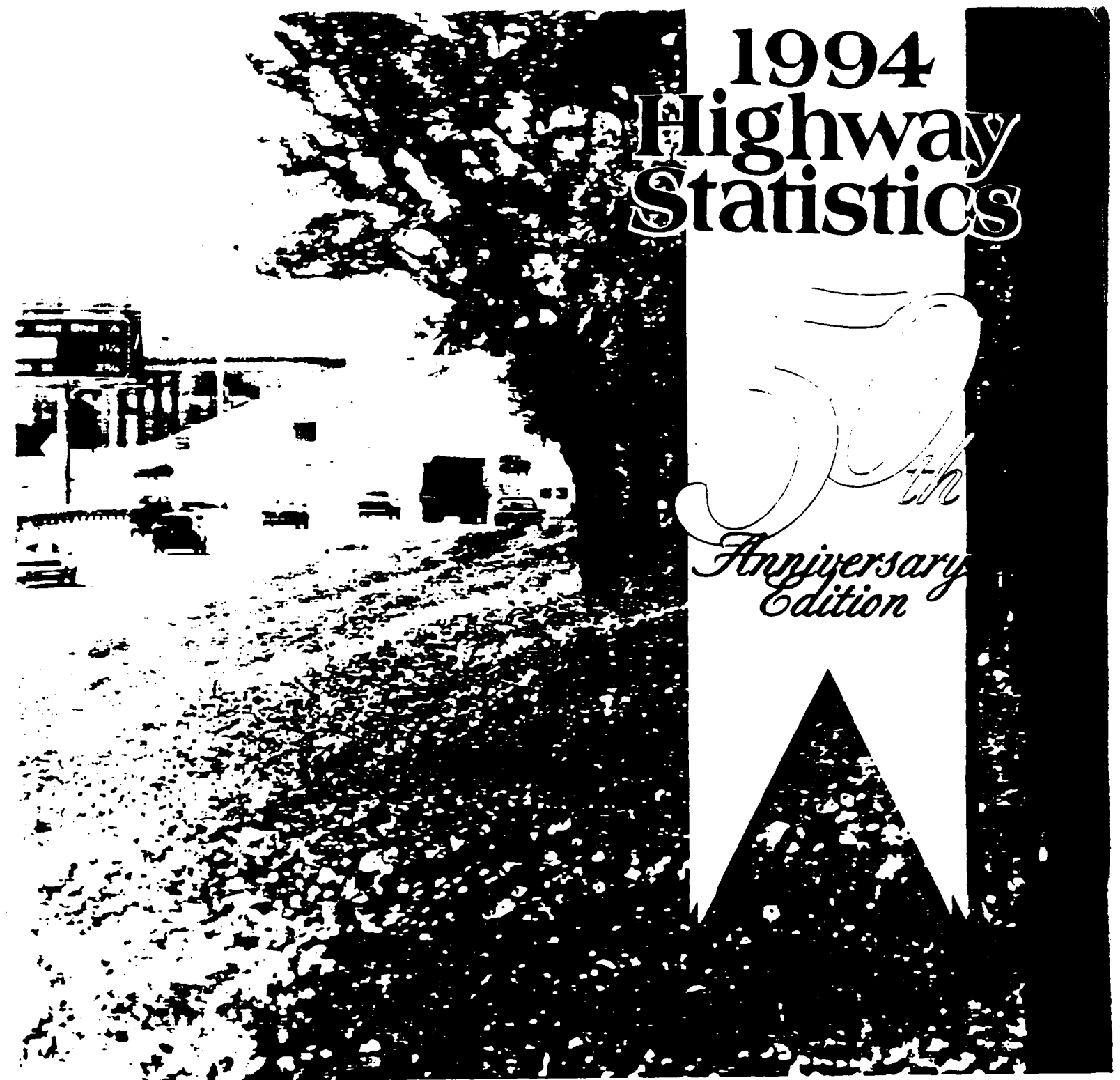

SUBJECT: 1994 HIGHWAY STATISTICS ERRATA SHEET

Dear Highway Statistics User:

Attached are updated tables from the Road Extent, Characteristics, and Performance section of the 1994 Highway Statistics. A description of the changes follows:

1. Table HM-63 has been revised to correct errors in mileage in the following categories:

Rural

- o All "POOR," "MEDIocre," and "FAIR" columns except those under "INTERSTATE SYSTEM" and "RURAL MAJOR COLLECTOR."

Urban

- o All "POOR," "MEDIocre," and "FAIR" columns except those under "INTERSTATE SYSTEM," "MINOR ARTERIAL," and "COLLECTOR."

2. Table HM-72 has been revised to correct urbanized area data for the State of Washington to reflect **complete** lane mileage information (last 2 columns of table). This would also affect neighboring States with overlapping urban area boundaries. We have also included the 1994 HPMS data for Hawaii and Oklahoma that were received after the original publication went to press.
3. Table HM-46P all the "POOR," "MEDIocre," and "FAIR" columns have been revised except those under "INTERSTATE SYSTEM."
