A: Yes.

Q: What is the biggest crowd to eat at the White house?

A: The largest dinner ever held at the White House was a dinner in honor of the Vietnam prisoners of war in 1972 during the Nixon Administration, there were over 1400 guests. The largest dinner during the Clinton Administration was the Georgetown Reunion in 1993 with 1300 guests.

Q: Who plans these big meals, you or the staff?

A: I work with the Social Secretary and the White House Chef to plan White House dinners. We decide on a menu, the decorations and table settings.

Q: How big is the White House cooking staff?

A: There are 4 chefs in the main kitchen.
