YOUTH 2000

Youth 2000 is a 10 step program for reclaiming our youth. Past centuries refined the power of apprenticeship and mentoring which are fundamental to Youth 2000. Past twentieth century solutions have included the public works projects and Civilian Conservation Corp of the Franklin Delano Roosevelt administration, the Peace Corps of the Kennedy administration, the CETA program of the 1970's, and the role of the military in directing youth towards productive lives. However, presently there is a void of any program to reclaim our youth. The Clinton administration can fill that void with Youth 2000 under the concept of *"It Takes a Village."*

Instead of sending our children to jail or preparing them for dead end jobs let's prepare them for successful, productive, and meaningful lives.

To be effective Youth 2000 must first be implemented in major cities within the public sector. The outgrowth will spread across the nation from the public sector into the private sector. The 10 steps are as follows:

- R** **Redirection**
- E** **Empowering**
- C** **Commitment**
- L** **Leadership**
- A** **Assistance**
- I** **Inspiration**
- M** **Mentoring**
- I** **Intervention**
- N** **Nurturing**
- G** **Guidance**

THE PROGRAM

The program is very simple. Every city department will dedicate a percentage of it's staff to Youth 2000. The funding will come from local fund-raisers, corporate and private donations, and city funds with matching federal AmeriCorps funds. We have developed a method for implementing the program which maximizes the "*It Takes a Village*" concept.

Our pilot consists of various modules. We are prepared to implement Module One in San Francisco shortly after the November 5th election.

I look forward to your review of this summary and await the opportunity to share the complete vision with you personally.

Dates and Format

Greg Sheridan's characterization of President Clinton as poor in foreign and domestic policy, as tactically and strategically weak, and as exhibiting no depth in policy and character is without basis in fact or thoughtful interpretation of his presidency. (30-31 December, 1995) Readers of The Australian deserve a more accurate assessment and considered judgment of the Clinton presidency. History may well show Bill Clinton to be the best first term president since Harry Truman. Sheridan's characterization is contra-indicated by President Clinton's record of accomplishments.

Consider the economy. Under Clinton's economic policies and strategies nearly 8 million new private sector jobs have been created. Unemployment is lower than it has been for thirty years. The stock market is smashing all records. The budget has been balanced three years in a row and the deficit has been cut by 50%. (Recall that under Presidents Reagan and Bush our deficit went from \$1 trillion to \$4 trillion.) The three consecutive years of deficit reduction is the first time that has been done since Harry Truman. The GDP (Gross Domestic Product) growth is the highest in over a decade while the combined rate of unemployment and inflation is the lowest in 26 years. That is not chicken feed, Greg.

Consider foreign policy. Clinton's tough work with Russia on the "Non-Proliferation Treaty" means that for the first time in over forty years nuclear missiles are not trained on the U.S. His negotiated agreement with the North Koreans freezes and leads to the eventual elimination of their nuclear capability. He helped Israel achieve historic peace accords with Jordan and the Palestinians and contributed to

a historic cease-fire in Northern Ireland. His role in restoring democratically elected Haitian President Aristide to power was a clear foreign policy win. His leadership in achieving the Dayton Accords for a Bosnian peace settlement and his leadership in implementing those plans on behalf of NATO has the promise of being a resounding foreign policy coup.

Consider government reform. Under Clinton there has been a huge reduction of bureaucratic offices, programs, and personnel. Over 200,000 jobs have been cut. As a percentage of our work force it is the smallest federal government since 1965 meaning a big gain for tax payers.

Other considerations. Crime rate in the U.S. is way down. Welfare rolls are down. The poverty rate is down. Creation of new businesses is way up. Hundreds of thousands of jobs have been created because of President Clinton's efforts in pushing through NAFTA and GATT international trade legislation.

I want Australians to know that many close observers of the Clinton presidency here in the U.S. are deeply grateful to him for his wise and effective leadership and his concomitant record of accomplishments.

Europe continues to look to the United States – and its suddenly stronger President – for leadership

THE Bosnian crisis has underlined in the starkest terms the European Union's impotence in foreign affairs, even in matters in which it has the closest interests.

This is a sad commentary, especially on the major States: the United Kingdom, France and Germany. Europe has once again failed to establish a united and concerted policy. The move from a European Economic Community to the EU was meant to herald a new era in which Europe would start to develop common foreign and defence policies. That has been found impossible.

Through most of the Yugoslav crisis, the United States took the view that this was a European problem, European States should be able to manage it and achieve an appropriate resolution.

That was appropriate. It was a reasonable expectation that Europe combined, should be able to handle a problem that was within the geographic confines of Europe. Unfortunately, that has proved to be an unreasonable expectation. A solution, fragile as it may be, has only been possible with the positive and active intervention of the US.

The EU, in numbers, is larger than the US; in terms of product it is roughly equivalent. It is not therefore a matter of numbers, nor of power, that prevents the EU being an effective and cohesive instrument. It is the lack of will, the lack of leadership and the internal concerns of Europe itself that have prevented Europe playing a constructive role in the wider international forum.

Wherever there has been a major problem it is the US alone that has ultimately made effective international action possible.

I have sometimes been critical of US actions, particularly in relation to trade. But in straight political matters that affect the future of the world, the US is, and remains, the world's best hope for a sensible outcome.

The world would be so much better if that burden could be shared. The US, in some instances, would be so much more willing, if there were not an obvious feeling that it always has to be America. In recent months, the US has enhanced its reputation as an international leader. I and many others have made a new assessment about President Bill Clinton and his effectiveness, and his chances for the forthcoming presidential election.

The President has clearly had foreign policy successes. Haiti, small as it was, was an effective operation. It was the US that ultimately acted to enable humanitarian aid to be delivered to hundreds of thousands of Rwandan refugees. Others obviously did much to help but it was US resources that made the possibility of effective delivery a reality.

The peace process in the Middle East has been further advanced and positive progress continues to be made as a result of US diplomacy.

In Bosnia it was the US that engineered the Dayton, Ohio, peace plan which it is now maintaining by contributing so heavily to the forces needed.

American leadership has, once again, proved essential to a sensible outcome and Europe has, once again, been proved to be lacking. The President has clearly played a leading role. He and his administration must be given due credit. I would be surprised indeed if this is now not apparent to the American body politic. Clinton has conducted an effective foreign policy with increasing maturity.

The President seems also to have largely won the propaganda war in his battle with the Republican Congress.

The President is correct when he says that the reality of the American Government being in part shut down as a result of the impasse with Congress brings America into disrepute. Republican ranks have broken on this issue, with presidential candidate Senator Robert Dole wanting a resolution, but Republican aspirant Newt Gingrich apparently holding his House of Representatives numbers against an agreement.

The President has played his cards on this issue calmly and with an appropriate sense of the inherent importance of the office of President. It is no discredit to Clinton that this impasse underlines one of the problems with the US Constitution. Comparisons have been made between the American impasse and our own situation in 1975. There is really no similarity at all. The major difference, of course, being that our Constitution provides a constitutional means for settlement of the dispute, while the US Constitution does not.

American politics will increasingly centre on the forthcoming presidential elections in which Dole increasingly looks as though he will be the Republican candidate. Clinton will be facing that election with a great deal more confidence than many would have thought possible, even a few months ago. If he wins the second term, which at this stage must be regarded as not only possible but probable, he will have earned it.

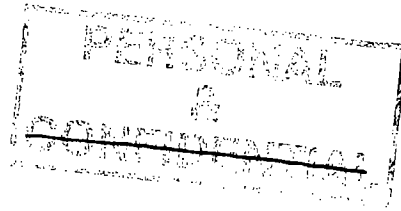

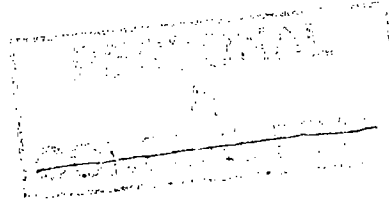

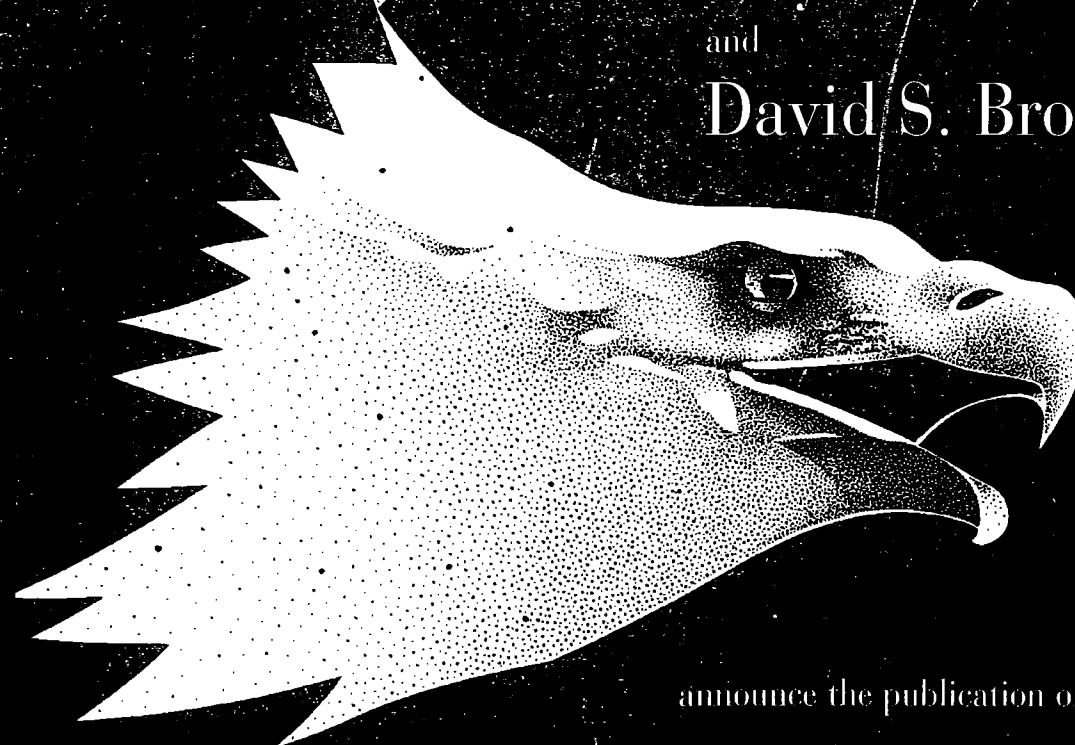
