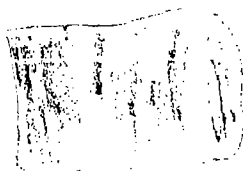

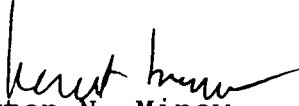
Dear Mrs. Clinton:

at the Senior Class Banquet

Monday, March 22, 1954

the easy confidence we felt dissolved as more and more the articulate and vocal among us doubted their beliefs and believed their doubts.

Nor do I need to enumerate for you in sepulchral tones the problems that you face. You know them only too well. Perhaps you can solve them. I would not presume to tell you how to do it. This University has given you the tools with which to try. Moreover, even if I would guide you, I could not. What a man knows at fifty that he did not know at twenty is, for the most part, incommunicable. The laws, the aphorisms, the generalizations, the universal truths, the parables and the old saws—all of the observations about life which can be communicated handily in ready, verbal packages—are as well known to a man at twenty who has been attentive as to a man at fifty. He has been told them all, he has read them all, and he has probably repeated them all before he graduates from college; but he has not lived them all.

What he knows at fifty that he did not know at twenty boils down to something like this: The knowledge he has acquired with age is not the knowledge of formulas, or forms of words, but of people, places, actions—a knowledge not gained by words but by touch, sight, sound, victories, failures, sleeplessness, devotion, love—the human experiences and emotions of this earth and of oneself and other men; and perhaps, too, a little faith, and a little reverence for things you cannot see. /

Nonetheless, I would speak to you not of the past, when my generation held its hopes so high—a time when even I received two votes as the most likely to succeed—but rather I would speak to you of the future, of your future. And if I cannot advise you on how to solve the momentous problems of your future, perhaps I can venture to suggest some duties and, if you please, some rules of conduct that, it seems to me, devolve upon the educated man because that is what you are about to be. I would speak to you briefly, then, about the educated man and his government, and about the educated man and his university.

The political organization that goes by the name of the United States of America consists of no fewer than 155,000 governing units, school boards, conservation districts, municipalities, states, the nation, etc. It is operated by some one million elected officials, ranging from mosquito district trustee to President, and by some six million full-time employees. Our government is so large and so complicated that few understand it well and others barely understand it at all. Yet we must try to understand it and to make it function better.

For the power, for good or evil, of this American political organization is virtually beyond measurement. The decisions which it makes, the uses to which it devotes its immense resources, the leadership which it provides on moral as well as material questions, all appear likely to determine the fate of the modern world.

All this is to say that your power is virtually beyond measurement. For it is to you, to your enlightened attention, that American government must look for the sources of its power. You dare not, if I may say so, withhold your attention. For if you do, if those young Americans who have the advantage of education, perspective, and self-discipline do not participate to the fullest extent of their ability, America will stumble, and if America stumbles the world falls.

An important contribution to this new, predatory climate was made not by the FCC but by the Justice Department, which with mindless zeal succeeded in killing the NAB code in 1982, claiming that its restraints on commercial time violated antitrust laws. (In fact, of course, they did, but in a manner conducive to the public interest.) In 1979, when the Justice Department initiated its suit, five hundred television stations—65 percent of the nation's total—subscribed to the NAB code.⁶⁵ The suit baffled not only the NAB, but Congress as well. Senator Daniel Inouye called it "wrong," and newspaper columnist Art Buchwald quipped, "The beauty of government servants is that they are always willing to help American citizens, even when you don't want them to." The absurdity of the case was noted even by U.S. District Court Judge Harold Greene, who in exasperation during oral arguments asked a Justice Department attorney, "Except for the fact that the Sherman Act is there, like Mount Everest, what did you hope to gain?"⁶⁶

A good question. In March 1982, Greene reluctantly ruled that a portion of the NAB code's commercial limitations was a *per se* violation of the Sherman Anti-Trust Act. Fearful of the treble damages that antitrust actions incur, and on the advice of its lawyers, the NAB voted in 1983 to disband the code in its entirety, thereby abolishing perhaps the only nongovernmental articulation of the "public interest" in broadcasting and ending fifty-five years of self-regulation. Four years later, in 1987, retiring Westinghouse Broadcasting CEO Dan Ritchie paid for space in *Broadcasting* magazine to complain about the proliferation of commercials and to urge the industry to seek an antitrust exemption from Congress—as Judge Greene had himself suggested—so that it might reinstate the code. Without it, he wrote, the only alternative was government regulation. The Justice Department had effectively removed any hope of a middle road.

What *had* Americans gained from this? A television marketplace in which broadcasters were encouraged to exploit children for profit, and where economic considerations compelled them to. The kinds of commercial indiscretion that had prompted ACT to peti-

tion the FCC in 1970 had not only worsened but increased exponentially. Where in the late 1970s children saw about 20,000 commercials on television each year, they saw about double that in 1987—80 percent of them for toys, cereals, candy, and fast-food restaurants. Where in 1970 the FCC had concerned itself with whether *Hot Wheels* existed merely for the purpose of selling toys, in 1985 the commission gave toy manufacturers and broadcasters the go-ahead to turn toys into programs. *He-Man and the Masters of the Universe*, *GoBots*, *Thundercats*, *GI Joe: A Real American Hero*, *Transformers*, and others now dominated children's television. In only five years, the time given over to war cartoons grew from about one and a half hours per week to twenty-seven, and the sale of war-related toys surged with it.

Of course, many companies and people were making a great deal of money. *He-Man* generated some \$350 million in sales in just three years. Other shows, such as the Mattel Company's *Captain Power and the Soldiers of the Future*, were "interactive," but only if the watching children owned Mattel's forty-dollar XG7 Power Jet. (When a child fired the Power Jet at the show, the show "fired back.") When Congressman Edward Markey questioned Mattel in 1987 about *Captain Power's* designs on America's children, a company vice president for entertainment objected to Markey's insistence that the show was a glorified commercial, though he did acknowledge that Mattel retained script control and that "action segments" were specifically included for interactive viewing.⁶⁷ Ohio congressman Dennis Eckart found Mattel's explanation unconvincing. If *Captain Power* was interactive television, he said, "I can't help feel we've dropped to the lowest common denominator." Markey added, "Children's television today is not a wasteland but a waste site, strewn with war toys, insipid cartoons and oversweetened cereals."⁶⁸

The FCC could not have cared less. Toy-based programs were by definition in the "public interest," the commission had ruled in 1985, on the basis of their phenomenal sales success. But the obliteration of educational programming and the overnight success of toy shows did trouble Congress, which, after two tries, passed the Children's Television Act in 1990. The new law reflected what Peggy

Charren, Joan Ganz Cooper, and others had been saying: television had been saying the successes of the television medium were not one of them, nor would they be.

5. Congress should exempt broadcasters and other programmers from the antitrust laws for the purpose of developing a code of professional standards. The earlier code of the National Association of Broadcasters was abandoned in 1982 after an overeager, short-sighted, and ideologically driven Justice Department succeeded in destroying it. The Justice Department's action made effective self-regulation virtually impossible in the industry, and left the government in the position of being the only judge of programming practices, a situation clearly unfavorable to the First Amendment.

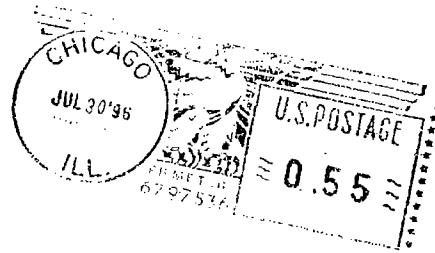
Congress should not only permit the creation of a code of practice but require membership of all licensed broadcasters. A code of professional standards for broadcasters would be analogous to similar codes in other industries, from real estate to manufacturing, that prohibit deceptive, discriminatory, or abusive practices. The code of the National Association of Securities Dealers, for example, specifies what brokers may not say or do in their dealings with the public and with each other. Other professionals—such as lawyers and doctors, engineers and teachers—have to meet minimum standards of professional practice. Journalists, of course, are not professionals in this sense of the term, but most broadcasters are not journalists; instead, they are licensed operators of a publicly owned spectrum. Are their character and performance any less important than that of other professionals? Broadcasters and cable operators should be held to a standard of practice that meets their own best professional judgments.

Business groups, particularly, have an important role to play here, since their advertising influences so much television programming. Sanford McDonnell, chairman emeritus of McDonnell Douglas, is a proponent of what he calls "character education" in schools, but worries that "television is creating a very strong headwind into which we character education proponents must fly." For that reason McDonnell has wisely urged his colleagues in the influential Business Roundtable to use their influence "to leverage the cable and television industries into establishing a self-policing mechanism,"

but so far has had no success.¹⁸ If the members of the roundtable sat with their children and grandchildren and watched and discussed the programs sponsored by their companies—if all advertisers did—they would change their policies. Producers and advertising executives should similarly spend time with their children and grandchildren, watching the programs they have produced and funded. Are they proud of what they're doing?

Recently a number of business associations announced their commitments to "children's best interest," as one group, the New American Revolution, put it in a full-page *New York Times* advertisement in September 1994. The New American Revolution includes among its members top executives from several communications companies, including Time Warner CEO Gerald Levin and USA Network president Kay Koplovitz, both of whom, in different circumstances, have publicly denied their own companies' responsibility to children and parents. Inconsistencies like these raise questions about whether the revolution was launched in the boardroom or the marketing department. Now the real question is whether these executives and the companies they represent will make good on their promises.

6. The nonprofit community, especially foundations and universities, should become more active in the debate over children's television and its place in the new world of SuperTube. About seventy-five not-for-profit groups have been active in the Telecommunications Policy Roundtable, a consortium that lobbies to guarantee equal and affordable access to the information superhighway. Others have sponsored projects related either to SuperTube or to children's television. Laudable as these efforts are, they need to be brought together lest their debate—and their message—go unheard. In the years between 1927 and 1934, divisiveness among educators, labor unions, churches, and foundations was perhaps the single most important reason why the Wagner-Hatfield amendment was defeated and the success of commercial broadcasters assured in controlling virtually the entire radio spectrum. Today we are in danger of repeating the mistake. If Americans compound the error they made in 1934, it will be because the institutions that fought so resolutely in the 1930s are now sitting silently on the sidelines.

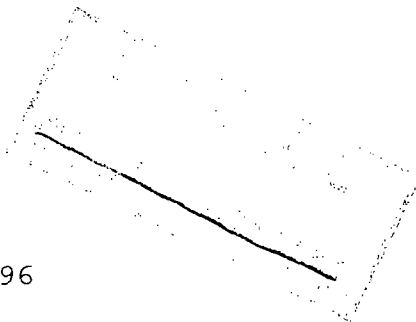

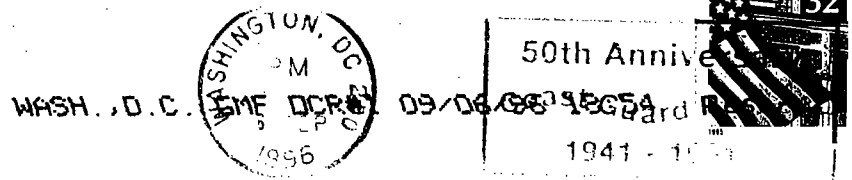

Dear Hillary:

I am mindful of the old saying that advice is worth what you pay for it and that I am about to volunteer in an area where you doubtless have highly paid advisers. Nevertheless, when I saw you here I said that I stood ready to help. What follows may or may not be helpful. At least it comes from a friend outside the Beltway in the great unsophisticated Midwest. Put it in the pot with the rest of the advice you get and come to your own conclusions.

Of course, what I have to say relates to last night's speech. I want to make three comments. They come against a background of a perception of you by some of the public which, I am sure, is not shared by those who know you well - certainly not by me.

I have found over the years that an admission of a misstep has a certain quality of endearment to the listeners. While adhering to the objectives of the health program - universal access to health care and cost containment - the proposed breadth of the solution was obviously more than could be sold. A recognition of that would have helped soften your image and would have furnished a natural lead-in to your acknowledgment of Kennedy-Kassebaum as a first step.

Somewhat similarly, I think you might have reached out to some reachable Republican women if you had pointed to the bi-partisan basis of the 3rd grade reading program by mentioning Mrs. Bush's activity in that general area. You are an experienced enough trial lawyer to look past the personalities of the opposition in the interest of winning jurors to your side.

Mrs. Clinton,

I am very concerned that the President's April 9 meeting with Greek Prime Minister Costas Simitis may encounter unnecessary difficulties. They may be caused by lower levels of the Administration not implementing the Athens airport order according to yours and the President's wishes.

Despite the fact that: (1) our DOT data shows the Athens airport to have one of the safest records, (2) the FAA chose a period of major transition for the Greek government to require procedural changes and (3) the Greek government believes it is now doing everything asked of it by the FAA, the "order" may not be lifted in time.

Attached are the details. Your help would be greatly appreciated.

The Clinton-Simitis April 9th Meeting and How it Will
Be Affected by the Administration's
Implementation of the Athens Airport Order

1. The administration committed to lift the order on the Athens airport at the earliest moment.

The Department of Transportation (DOT) is indicating that the order may not be lifted until after the Greek prime minister's April 9th meeting with President Clinton. Reports from Greece indicate that the Greek government feels that they are doing everything requested by the FAA.

To lift the order after nearly a month is not the earliest moment. President Ronald Reagan, who was openly unsympathetic to Greece, had his Secretary of Transportation, Liddy Dole, lift his unfair action against the Athens airport after just over a month.

2. The administration committed to administer the order against Greece in a way which would minimize its potentially devastating impact on the Greek economy.

Following the issuance of the order, which was sensitive to the Greek economy, the DOT changed to a much more strict requirement regarding language to be put on each ticket purchased to Greece. Now it must be precisely the language issued by the DOT. This language is reported to be frightening passengers. It says:

"The United States Secretary of Transportation has determined that Hellenikon International Airport, Athens, Greece, does not maintain and carry out effective airport security measures."

The initial DOT order regarding the language to be used on tickets to Greece says, "this model language is provided solely for the guidance of carriers and their agents and does not bind them in any way."

The chairman of the House Aviation Subcommittee, John Duncan (R-TN), encourages the use of reasonable language on the ticket in his letter to the airlines which take Americans to Greece. He pointed out that the secretary's ticket language is a "model" and "not binding." He also said that the language used on the ticket should help the American passengers know of the excellent safety record of the Athens airport, and that the order involves procedures not incidents. Further, he points out that language on the ticket should make clear the fact that the procedures in question do not involve flights to the United States.

Language like the following would be consistent with both the order and the administration's commitment. Also, it would give the flying public a much more accurate perception about Hellenikon and would have a much less unfair impact on Greece.

"The Hellenikon International Airport, in Athens, Greece, which has an excellent safety record, has been found by the United States Secretary of Transportation not to maintain some security measures up to the standards established by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO). These measures, however, do not apply to carriers which fly from Athens to the United States."

3. The following information which led President Clinton and Secretary Pena to the moderate position they took on the Athens airport appears not to be weighed as heavily by those implementing the order.

- A. Americans' current significant difficulties in Greece stem from our State Department bureaucracy inadvertently seeming to undercut Greece's national security rationale following a recent Turkish attack against Greek sovereign territory. The FAA's running of the 90 day airport advisory clock during a major Greek government transition inadvertently led to an unfair airport advisory. As you know, President Clinton and Secretary Pena would not have issued the Athens airport advisory were it not for the 90 day clock activating the law mandating it.
- B. DOT records of dangerous airport incidents show that the Athens airport has been and continues to be a very safe place for American passengers. Athens airport security has one of the best records in the world for arresting would-be terrorists. In addition, the airport was recognized this year with the "Safe Skies Award."
- C. The potential major embarrassment of the April 9th Clinton-Simitis meeting will be caused by people in our government holding Greece's significantly improved screening procedures to an unfair, artificially high standard. We Americans and the internationally flying Greek public know that airports all over the world, including the United States, are not held to such a high standard. Such lack of adherence to an artificially high standard includes not being asked to turn on a cellular phone or calculator each time through security, the hand wand metal detector user stopping his or her search after finding one element of metal, and other such minor procedural problems.

We Need Tough Laws , Consistent Messages . . .



Prosecute the men responsible and give girls the self-esteem and knowledge they need to resist early sex.

At dinner recently, my mother, a high school teacher for more than 25 years, told me she was disappointed because one of her star students, a bright and energetic 15-year-old girl, had worn a sweatshirt that day and the day before.

When I asked my mother why wearing a sweatshirt two days in a row was so tragic, she looked at me, as if I were from another planet. "Mi hijita," she said, "that's how you know the young girls are pregnant." She said the girls hide their conditions for as long as possible and once they start to show, they wear oversized sweatshirts.

My mother's disappointment was palpable. She knew that it would be more difficult for her star pupil to finish high school

and, given the time and financial demands of providing for another human being, to attain the career and family goals she had told my mother about.

The girl's experience is not unique. Each year, 1 million teenagers become pregnant, statistics that prompted President Clinton to begin a national campaign against teen pregnancy. California has the highest teen pregnancy rate in the country; Gov. Pete Wilson has targeted the prosecution of adult men who engage in sex with girls under 18. This pilot program is important in light of the study by the Alan Guttmacher Institute last year, which found that the younger the mother was, the greater the usual age difference between her and the baby's father. According to the study, in 20% of cases, the father is six or more years older than the mother; fully half of the fathers of babies born to girls between 15 and 17 were 20 or older.

Adult men who prey on young girls should be punished and vilified. Perhaps the threat of incarceration will deter some of them from impregnating young girls. For

those who still choose to break the law, at least they will not be able to target other young girls once they are prosecuted and incarcerated.

Yet one must contrast this with a recent case in Texas in which three adult male students, one of them 19, had sex with a 13-year-old girl during school hours.

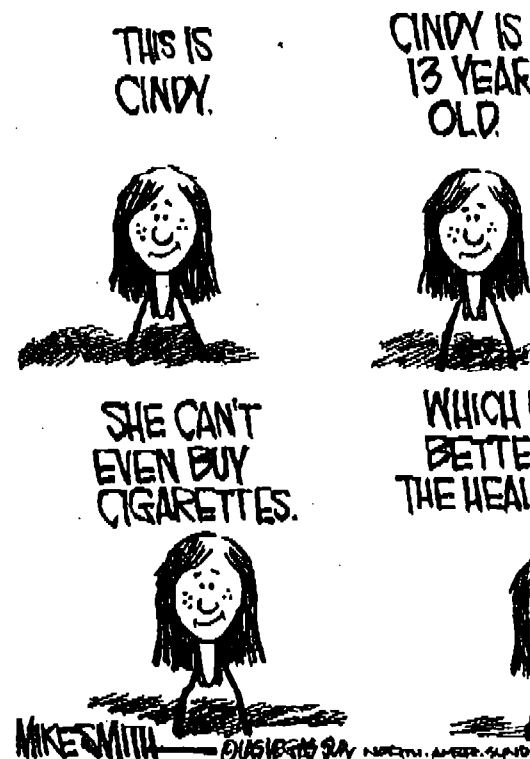
The girl provided each with a condom. Under Texas law, the male students committed aggravated sexual assault on a child, a felony punishable by life in prison. The first time the case went before a Dallas grand jury, the jury declined to indict the three students. The case went back to the grand jury and this time the three were indicted on charges of public lewdness, a misdemeanor that carries a maximum sentence of a year in jail. One cannot say for sure why the only charges were misdemeanors, but I suspect that because the girl provided condoms, the jurors decided that she had consented to have sex with the young men. But the fact remains that she was 13.

Punishing the adult male is important and cannot be discounted. But if a grand jury applies the law as it is written and the father of the child is actually jailed, what of the girl and her baby? Presumably the welfare system will provide the safety net. We all know that welfare is a shrinking net that may not be available. The answer is to educate underage girls. Some may know about contraception, as did the 13-year-old in Texas. But she was not mature enough to understand the consequences of her actions. Would it not have been better for her to have been educated about life's choices?

Research by Girls Inc., a youth organization that provides direct services and advocates for girls, shows that age-appropriate sexuality education that enhances girls' knowledge, skills and resources is effective in enabling them to delay sexual activity and pregnancy. Girls Inc. has learned that sexuality education must start by age 9 and continue through age 18, as a girl takes increasing responsibility for her well-being. Girls need to learn the skills to resist early sexual activity and to practice these skills.

Preventing teen pregnancy requires more than implementing tough sexual predator laws and enforcing them. A young girl who lacks self-esteem, parental involvement or basic information must receive consistent messages and reliable adult support at home, in school and in the community.

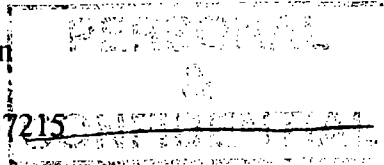

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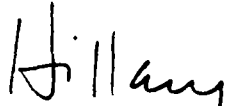

I would also love the chance to see you again. I think of you so often, and will always be there when you need me.

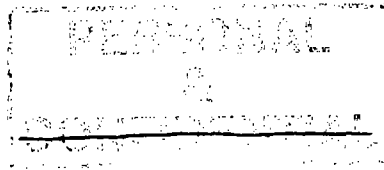

Dear Mrs. Clinton:

I am writing on behalf of the Congress for the New Urbanism (CNU) to invite you to address our 4th Congress at the signing ceremony for the CNU's new charter on Monday, May 6, 1996. The Congress will meet in Charleston, South Carolina, hosted by the Hon. Joseph P. Riley, Jr., Mayor of Charleston. We would like you to speak about *It Takes A Village*.

It struck me while reading *It Takes A Village* that in many ways the ideas that the CNU advances are the physical embodiment of the ideas in your book. We believe that the built environment has social, environmental, economic and physical components, and that it is difficult to get the first three right when the last is badly done. Moreover, we believe that the automobile-based planning of the last half-century has been antisocial, destroying many of our old communities while building sprawling suburbs with no public places for the young to grow up in. The CNU actively promotes work that reinforces our communities and promotes public life. Some like to say that sociologists, economists and the like provide the software, while the CNU provides the hardware.

You may be familiar with New Urbanism in some of its forms. One of the Founding Board Members of the CNU, Peter Calthorpe, is on the President's Council for Sustainable Development; *Newsweek* called him one of twenty-five "innovators on the cutting edge" of urban and suburban planning. With Phil Angelides, Calthorpe built Laguna West, the first example of his new model for Transit Oriented Development. Two other Founding Board Members, Andres Duany and Elizabeth Plater-Zyberk, designed Seaside, Florida, which *Time* said "was probably the most important built American work of the 1980's. As more of their work is completed, for towns and cities as well as developers...they may well become the most significant planners of the age."

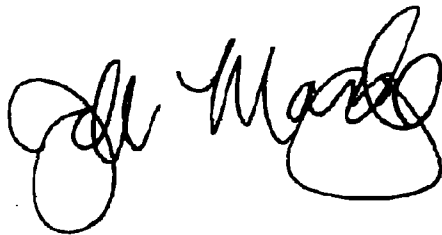

"In their crusade for the New Urbanism," Mike Davis wrote in the Sierra Club magazine, "Peter Calthorpe, Andres Duany, and their colleagues have reestablished a critical dialogue between urban designers and mainstream environmental groups. They have sketched with admirable clarity, a regional-planning model that cogently links issues of social equity...with key environmental concerns.... They offer a powerful program for uniting otherwise disparate constituencies — inner city residents, senior citizens, advocates of children, environmentalists, and so on — all of whom are fundamentally disadvantaged by the sub-urban city."

The CNU is a newly certified 501(c)3 organization, funded by the Energy Foundation (a consortium of The John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, The Pew Charitable Trusts and The Rockefeller Foundation) and The John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. At the Charleston Congress, we will develop an agenda for action and ratify our charter. We would like you to speak at the ceremony for the Board's signing of the charter, where we intend to have national press coverage. If you prefer, we could arrange the schedule for you to speak Friday, May 3 or Saturday, May 4.

I enclose several articles about New Urbanism, as well as a copy of *The New Urbanism*, a book by Peter Katz, our new Executive Director. Please feel free to contact him, at the address and telephone number listed on the first page, or me, at the address below. I very much hope that we will be able to hear you in Charleston.

A recent call from the Personnel Office in the White House indicates that you are considering appointing me to a new term on the Board of Directors of the Legal Services Corporation. I am hard put to tell you how pleased and gratified I am for your consideration. It gives me reason to believe that my services have been of value to the Corporation and your administration.

I have considered the possibility of reappointment at length and have with great regret concluded that I must decline. My interests and my endeavors for more than thirty years have laid in providing access to justice for all our citizens, but most particularly the indigent and the disadvantaged. Now I feel that it is time to pull back a bit and pass the torch on to younger, more able people.

Three days after your reelection this year I will be 75 years old. A new three-year term with the historic delay in a successor being appointed means that I would be approaching 80 years of age before finally stepping down. While I have no known physical disability or ailment, I am conscious that age has impaired my senses, that my mental acuity is not what it once was and that my ability to express myself orally has diminished. Given these facts I believe that I would not bring to continued service the high standards of performance to which you and the Corporation are entitled.

I will, of course, continue to serve out my present term and thereafter until a successor is seated in my place. It has been a great privilege and pleasure to bring this phase of my life to a conclusion in a role which I once shared with your lady.
