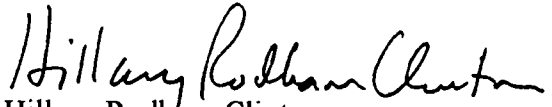

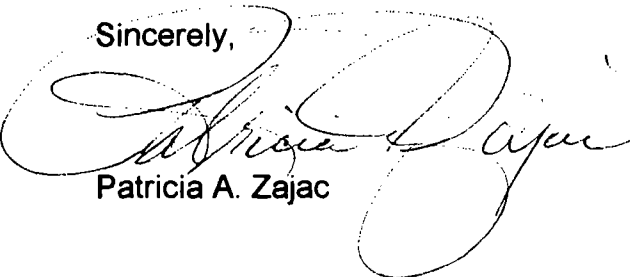
Dear Ms. Williams:

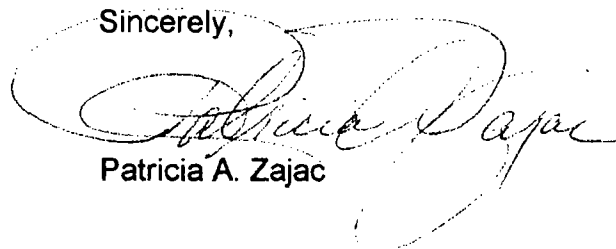
Let me introduce myself. While I would not like to limit myself to this description,

Once upon a time, there was a young woman of character and strength called Hillary Rodham who came upon an adventuresome young man known by those in the kingdom of Arkansas as the "boy wonder" and its rising star. The young woman, Hillary, found him to be handsome and attractive. However, Hillary, being of strong will and a very independent nature, pursued her own path to self-actualization. She did not wait for this charming Prince to whisk her away to the vague region known as "Happily ever after".

This introduction illustrates how Hillary Rodham Clinton rewrote the Fairy Tales of my childhood liberating me from such pervasive mythology with all its consequences. 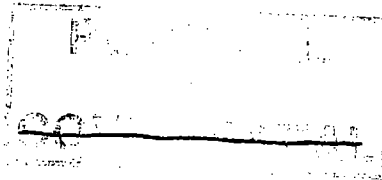

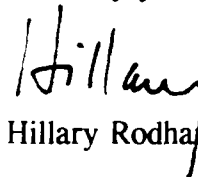

Just after inflicting the gravest electoral punishment by asserting that Democrats tried for too much too fast, Republicans committed the error in spades. I look forward to a convincing victory in November, and much progress in 1997. Who knows, the time may then be ripe for revisiting a few of the goals we sought in 1993-4. Depending on what happens with the Kasselbaum-Kennedy bill this year, an effort to improve access in the individual market might be a good target. So, too, might be a "kids first" approach. "Choice" in the Medicare program could also be enhanced, perhaps even with some dividends in government savings.

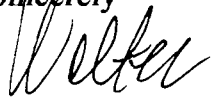
Enclosed is a copy of a book I've written. It is not about our reform effort, but about the marketplace change that is taking place in the absence of government-sponsored reform. You should be pleased to know that, without question, our efforts helped to fuel a series of changes, most of which are generally positive. The book also focuses on the issues of public policy being generated by marketplace change.

Now that I have finished the project, I've been doing some speaking, and will be doing some "adjunct" teaching for Harvard. In some recent talks I have focused on the relationships between market change and public policy --how public policy might impact market change, and what issues market change is putting on the plates of policy makers.

As for the longer term future, I am still thinking and looking around for the right opportunity. Among other things, I would like very much to serve in the Administration again, should the right opportunity emerge.
