As you are well aware, the reform of our nation's health care system is not only one of the most critical issues facing the Congress, the Administration and the states, but it is also one of the reforms most eagerly anticipated by the American people.

Public awareness and involvement in this issue are vital to the development and support of comprehensive health care reform. It is for this reason that I am hosting The Florida Health Care Summit in West Palm Beach, Florida on October 29, 1993. I am delighted that Governor Lawton Chiles has accepted an invitation to co-moderate this event with me. We would both be honored if you would join us at this important health care summit.

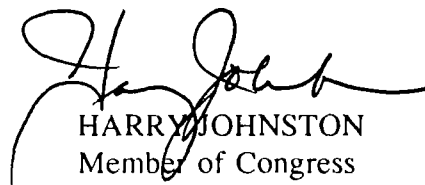
Health care reform has long been my top priority. Two years ago, when many Democrats were supporting centralized single-payor proposals, I introduced the Community Health Care Act. This legislation would have created a network of local health care cooperatives to negotiate with private plans to provide comprehensive coverage for all Americans. In many respects, my proposal is quite similar to the plan you and the President have outlined. It is also important to note that the Community Health Care Act was supported by members from both wings of our party including Barbara Boxer and Glenn English.

Health care reform is of particular concern to Florida. A recent study showed that Florida has three of the five most expensive health care cities in the United States -- Miami, Ft. Lauderdale and Tampa. Meanwhile, nearly 2.5 million of our citizens have no health care coverage. We have a vulnerable senior population constantly struggling with a complex health care system, and a volatile job market which leaves our families without health care security.

The Florida Health Care Summit would provide you with an excellent opportunity to address these issues with a diverse audience of Florida's health care consumers and providers. Most importantly, your participation would send a strong signal that health care reform is on the way.

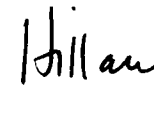

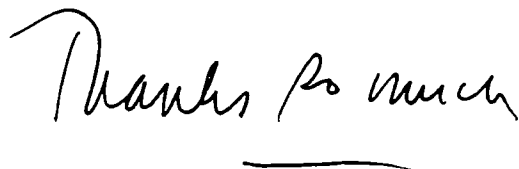
