0019 Thank you for forwarding the letter from your constituents, (b)(6) about the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) health care system. Their experiences demonstrate why we need health care reform so desperately.

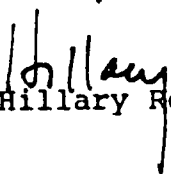
Today, the VA health care system must overcome numerous regulatory and financial barriers to serve our veterans. The current VA system must contend, for example, with prohibitions against receiving reimbursement from private insurance, complex eligibility rules, and restrictive personnel and contracting requirements.

We recognize that, with reform, the VA system can provide the high quality, affordable health care that our nation's veterans deserve. Under the President's plan, veterans will be able to enroll in VA health plans that provide the comprehensive package of benefits guaranteed to all Americans as well as additional services that target the particular health needs of veterans. Veterans with service-connected disabilities or low incomes receive all of these services at no cost to them. Those veterans who do not enroll in a VA health plan may continue to receive the supplemental services that they are eligible to receive today, such as hearing aids and long-term care.

The President's plan prepares the VA system for its role in the new system by investing over \$3 billion over a three year period to modernize and improve the VA system. In addition, for the first time, the VA will be able to collect Medicare and private insurance payments. Finally, unnecessary and burdensome regulations will be reduced, freeing VA hospitals and doctors to concentrate on patients rather than paperwork.

Thank you again for sharing the experiences of your constituents. I look forward to continuing to work with you in the coming weeks.

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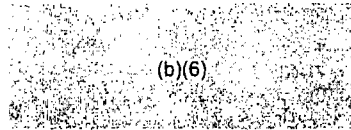

Dear Congresswoman Lloyd,

I am writing this letter to request your help in resolving a health care problem arising from my service in Operation Desert Storm. After consulting with my chain of command and going as far through the channels of CHAMPUS as I could, I was told that I should contact you.

I am a third generation wartime-decorated veteran and am very proud to have served with my Army Reserve Unit, the 3397th United States Army Garrison, during Operation Desert Storm. I am a Staff Sergeant. 0012

During the thirteen months I was on active duty my wife (b)(6) who is the Family Support Group Coordinator for the 3397th USAG, required surgery twice. Both times CHAMPUS approved and paid for the operations. Since then she has been under constant medical care for chronic pain and swelling blamed on adhesions caused by the surgeries. Now she must have another operation immediately.

I felt sure that CHAMPUS would pay for this operation since it is required due to complications from the operations performed under their coverage but a CHAMPUS representative, Ms. Rivers told me that it was against CHAMPUS policy. She said policy is set by and can only be waived by Congress. I told her that I could not end my efforts until I had exhausted all attempts to get CHAMPUS to do the right thing and I needed to know who to contact next. After conferring with her supervisors she told me to contact my congressman.

My civilian insurance would have covered this operation but I lost it due to my unit being mobilized. At that time I was working as a welder at Komatsu Dresser Corporation and was covered through my employer, Bowman and Associates. They are a temporary service used by Komatsu Dresser Corporation to hire welders. I expected to be made permanent.

Due to a layoff at Komatsu Dresser Company during the Gulf crisis my job was not protected by the Soldier's and Sailor's Relief Act and I became unemployed upon my release. Had I not been called up I am certain that Bowman and Associates would have placed me with another company (I had an excellent work record) and I would still be insured. My present employer is unable to offer health insurance.

During the Gulf crisis my wife volunteered twenty to thirty hours per week as Family Support Group Coordinator for my Reserve Unit. This was in spite of her chronic pain and swelling and in addition to caring for our three sons. (b)(6) was responsible for the welfare of the families of more than 250 soldiers and was officially commended by the Garrison, the 125th ARCOM, 2nd Army and the former First Lady. 001c

Ms. Lloyd, I am not asking for any more than what is owed (b)(6) and I believe the Army, Congress and the people want to take care of military families but are sometimes restricted by inflexible rules that sometimes eliminate deserving individuals. Somewhere, someone is able to cut through the red tape and secure an exception to policy. Any help you can offer will be greatly appreciated.
