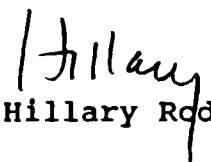
Dear Representative Long:

Thank you for sending me a summary of your meetings with the eleven hospitals in your district.

The concerns of your constituents are remarkably similar to those I have heard across the country: too much paperwork and regulation, too little incentive to control cost, too little emphasis on preventive and primary care, the need for malpractice reform, and the need to provide incentives for physicians to practice in rural areas.
