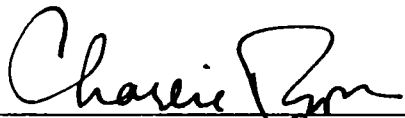
We would like to invite you to speak at the North Carolina Congressional Chamber of Commerce Washington Issues Seminar on September 21, 1993.

Rep. Charlie Rose (D-NC) wants you to know he intends to support health care reform because he is "a national democrat." He also thought you would find the attached ad that ran in his district interesting.

What Is Charlie Rose Doing?

That's the question North Carolina taxpayers and tobacco growers should be asking.

Here's the answer: He should be leading the fight against a massive tobacco tax increase that will wreck our local economy and cost more than 40,000 North Carolina jobs.

But he isn't.

Instead, Congressman Rose is trying to cut back-room deals. He's already publicly offered a compromise with the Clinton administration that would double the cigarette tax. It would be a 100% tax increase on our most important cash crop! And that's after voting FOR the biggest tax increase in U.S. history in August.

How does the White House respond to Congressman Rose's offer? Not very respectfully. Tobacco was singled out in the President's speech Wednesday night as the only item for a whopping tax increase.

In July, North Carolina Taxpayers United asked Rep. Rose and every other congressman from North Carolina to pledge to vote against any increase in tobacco taxes. Congressman Rose refused to sign that pledge.

North Carolina taxpayers and growers need to send a strong message to Charlie Rose: Stop trying to cut deals and start leading the fight to save North Carolina jobs. Doubling the tobacco tax is not acceptable!
