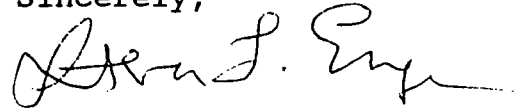

MEMORANDUM
THE LEGAL SERVICES CORPORATION AND TRANSITION

by

**NATIONAL LEGAL AID AND DEFENDER ASSOCIATION
PROJECT ADVISORY GROUP**

Although the Legal Services Corporation (LSC) is not part of the Executive Branch of government, the new Administration will need to make two key decisions early in the Administration and must consider soon its position on reauthorization of LSC.

1. APPOINTMENT OF A BOARD

The President can nominate an entire new LSC board immediately upon taking office. All of the terms have expired. The board now consists only of recess appointees.

Under section 1004(a) of the Legal Services Corporation Act as amended [42 U.S.C. §2996c(a)], the President shall appoint for confirmation by the Senate a Board of Directors of the Corporation consisting of eleven voting members, no more than six of whom shall be of the same political party. A majority must be lawyers, none can be a fulltime employee of the United States, and the board must include eligible clients and must be "generally representative of the organized bar, attorneys providing legal assistance to eligible clients, and the general public."

A new board is vitally necessary in order to reestablish the integrity and stature of the Corporation with Congress and the bar and to hire a LSC President and staff who are committed to effective legal assistance for the poor. The current LSC Board is not a confirmed board but recess appointees. There is one recess vacancy. The terms for ten recess appointees expire at the end of the 1st session of the 103rd Congress, i.e. sometime in late 1993, unless they resign. The ten recess appointees will resign early in the Administration or as soon as requested by the President.

We hope the new administration will nominate eleven members as soon as possible so that the confirmation process before the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee can begin and so the Administration can move expeditiously to fill any vacancies that occur.

The eleven members should:

- be truly bi-partisan;
- include at least two clients eligible for legal services under the Corporation guidelines and who are representative of organizations of eligible clients;

- include individuals who have actively participated in the organized bar;
- include individuals who have experience with the delivery of legal services;
- all be committed to the freedom of the Corporation from political control, to the principles laid out in Section 1001 of the LSC Act [42 U.S.C. §2996], and to the principal that the poor should have full access under law to effective legal services of high quality; and
- reflect racial, gender and cultural diversity.

2. APPROPRIATION MARK

The President will have to comment on the LSC appropriation when the new Administration's budget is submitted early in the Administration. Although the budget of the Corporation is not part of the Budget of the President, the Office of Management and Budget is to review and submit comments upon the Corporation's annual budget request. [§1005(e)(2); 42 U.S.C. §2996d(e)(2)]

We urge the Clinton Administration to support a budget mark that is at least as high as the proposal of the current LSC Board of Bush recess appointees. Last year, the Bush Recess board proposed a mark of \$525 million for LSC. The current appropriation level is \$357. While a mark of \$525 million appears to be a substantial increase in funding, it would not even restore the Corporation to the funding level adjusted for inflation that was achieved in 1981. To reach the equivalent funds based on the modest goal of two lawyers for every for every 10,000 poor people -- 4.7% of the number of lawyers available to the general public -- would require a budget mark of more than \$821 million.

A budget recommendation of at least \$525 million is justified because:

- the number of poor people have increased over 15.9% between 1980 and 1990;
- many more families have fallen below the poverty line since 1990 as the recession has deepened and they find themselves faced with a broad range of legal needs;
- state and national studies of legal needs demonstration that only 15% - 20% of the legal needs of the poor are being met through the current available resources; and
- legal services reaffirms the faith of the poor in our government and provides vital assistance to improve opportunities for the poor.

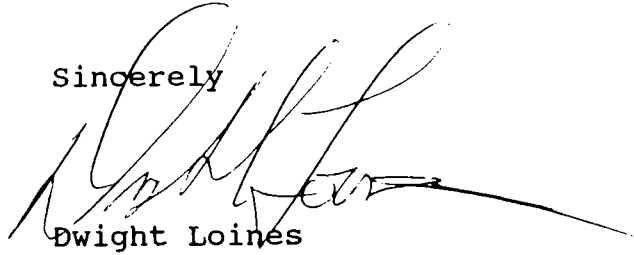

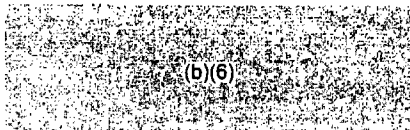

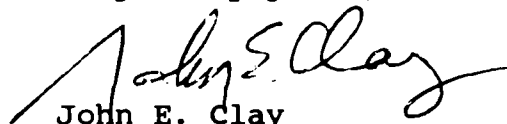
Dear Ms. Piercy:

I would like very much to be considered for an appointment to one of the Democratic places on the Board of Directors of the Legal Services Corporation.

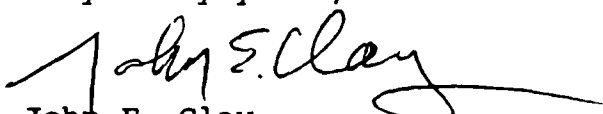

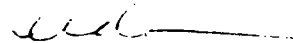

APPOINTMENT OF A BOARD

The President can and should nominate an entire new LSC Board immediately upon taking office. None of the current Board members ~~have~~ been confirmed by the Senate for statutory terms. As of the beginning of December the Board consists of one vacancy and ten recess appointees whose appointments will expire at the end of the first session of the 103rd Congress, unless they resign or are replaced prior to that time.¹

Under section 1004(a) of the Legal Services Corporation Act as amended,² the President shall nominate for confirmation by the Senate a Board of Directors of the Corporation consisting of eleven voting members, no more than six of whom shall be of the same political party. A majority must be lawyers, none can be a full-time employee of the United States, and the Board must include eligible clients and must be "generally representative of the organized bar, attorneys providing legal assistance to eligible clients, and the general public."

A new Board is vitally necessary in order to reestablish the integrity and prestige of the Corporation with Congress and the bar. A new Board must hire an LSC president and staff who are committed to effective legal assistance for the poor. The importance of this function is discussed more fully in Part Three of this memorandum and cannot be emphasized enough. Among its highest priorities, the new Administration should nominate eleven new LSC Board members as soon as possible after taking office so that the confirmation process before the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee can begin and the Administration can expeditiously move to fill any Board vacancies that exist. A new Board is critically important to restore the reputation and prestige of the Corporation.

The eleven nominees should:

- be truly bipartisan;
- include at least two clients who are eligible for legal services under the Corporation guidelines and who are representative of organizations of eligible clients;
- include individuals who have actively participated in the organized bar;

¹If the current board were to resign, the President could make recess appointments. However, if some refuse to resign, there is a question about whether the President has the authority to fire them. Under the LSC Act, the President cannot fire a confirmed board member, although it is not clear that this same statutory restriction applies to recess appointees who generally serve at the pleasure of the President. No court has ruled on this issue.

- include individuals who have experience with or who have been actively engaged in the delivery of legal services to the poor;
- all be committed to the freedom of the Corporation from political control, to the principles laid out in Section 1001 of the LSC Act [42 U.S.C. §2996], and to the principle that the poor should have access under law to a full range of high-quality, comprehensive and effective legal services; and
- reflect racial, gender and cultural diversity.

These criteria are taken primarily from the Senate Committee Report discussing the advice and consent role of the Senate:

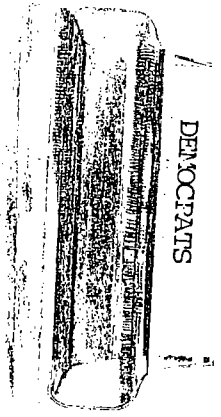
"The Committee expects that, in exercising its advice and consent function, the Senate will want to review the nominations on the basis of the following primary criteria: (1) a Board membership which is adequately representative of the organized bar, legal education, legal services attorneys, the client community, and organizations involved in the development of legal assistance for the poor; (2) the selection of persons who are committed to the Corporation's freedom from political control; and (3) the assurance that the Board members understand and are fully committed to the role of legal assistance attorneys and support the underlying principle of this legislation that it is in the national interest that the poor have full access under law to comprehensive and effective legal services."³

Two other criteria that should be considered are taken from a resolution adopted by the House of Delegates of the American Bar Association in 1989:

- All persons considered for nomination should be free of all conflict, or the appearance of such conflict, with the existence and function of the Corporation or the representation of poor persons in legal matters so that they may act and may be perceived to act with objectivity and fairness.
- All nominees should support and demonstrate a high order of commitment to the continued existence and the effective operation of the Legal Services Corporation.

Finally, the Clinton Administration should encourage all of its nominees to fully cooperate with the Standing Committee on Legal Aid and Indigent Defendants of the American Bar Association which has agreed to undertake a review of LSC Board nominees and to make recommendations to the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee on the nominees' capacity to serve.

HULETT HALL ASKEW

Hulett "Bucky" Askew's long experience with the early Legal Services Corporation and later with the National Legal Aid and Defender Association are well-known and reflected on his resume. Less well-known is his work since he has returned to his home state of Georgia in 1990 to accept the position as the Director of the Georgia Supreme Court's then-newly-created Commission on Professionalism. Subsequently he was also appointed Director of the Office of Bar Admissions of the Supreme Court of Georgia. Both of these appointments reflect the esteem with which Bucky is regarded both by the Supreme Court members themselves and by his colleagues in the Georgia bar.

In those two positions, since 1990, Bucky has had the opportunity to infuse the Georgia bar with many of the same values that he observed in legal services programs and lawyers. For instance, Bucky's approach to the abstraction of "professionalism" has been characterized by his observation that legal services lawyers represent the best of that concept: they are committed to high quality representation, to ethical conduct, to their responsibility to the system of justice, and to a responsibility to the public good and to public service. Bucky has used his professionalism activities to help draw legal services lawyers into the mainstream of the bar, and at the same time has challenged private practitioners to take seriously their obligation to engage in pro bono work.

As Director of Bar Admissions, Bucky has had the opportunity to engage in serious discussions with bar examiners as well as law school faculty about professional credentialing, about curriculum and preparation for law practice, about clinical programs. These issues are extremely germane to legal services practice.

These experiences and these relationships would be invaluable for a member of the LSC Board.
