1. Misty Hicks of Missouri: Seventeen-year-old Misty Hicks of Bradeyville, a small town in southwestern Missouri, wrote a thoughtful letter to you about the uncertain future facing her high school. Built over fifty years ago, the school was condemned last November after the gymnasium collapsed. Now, classes are being held in trailers pending the outcome of a request for government help. She also told you that there is talk of consolidation, but:

... it would be such a shame to lose the school and everything it stands for. The people in our school have a very special relationship. Students and teachers have a friendship and can confide in one another. ... It is safe in our school. Students don't bring weapons or threaten teachers. We all respect each other. We can't get that in very many schools, not even around here.

We sent Misty's letter to the Department of Education and, as with all referrals, reviewed a copy of its response. In replying, the Department stated that the school's request for federal construction funds had been approved. After double-checking with our contacts at the Department, Sue Smith of this office telephoned Misty to make sure she had gotten the good news. Sue reached her at the school, first explaining to the principal the role of this office and the purpose of her call. The principal, who knew of Misty's letter to you, called Misty a "fine young lady." Before bringing Misty to the phone, the principal asked that we let you know how thankful he was for the call to her. (Naturally, he was aware of the favorable decision through a recent, separate communication from the Department of Education.)

Sue then spoke with Misty, telling her that you appreciated her letter and confirming that the Department's response had reached her. Although nonplussed, Misty regained her composure enough to say that she "really appreciated your interest." Misty's letter to you is attached, along with the Department's response.

2. (b)(6) of Kansas: In another letter to you about a problem within the purview of the Department of Education, (b)(6), a physically disabled Topeka resident, asked for your help in locating a better job. For the last six years he has worked as a dishwasher, a dead-end job that lacks benefits. "I just want to get a [good] job, be shown how to do it, and go ahead and do it," he wrote. [001]

The Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA) within the Department of Education sent (b)(6) a personal and informative response on your behalf. Thanking him for writing you, the

Associate Commissioner commended his perseverance and gave him a local contact who would help him explore possible job-training options. Although the ball is now in (b)(6) court, RSA's letter contains the elements we look and push for in agency responses to this kind of correspondence to you. I enclose it and (b)(6) incoming letter for your possible review.

3. Pearlie Mills of South Carolina: A particularly desperate-sounding letter to you came from 75-year-old Pearlie Mills of Cheraw, South Carolina. Barely able to write as the result of a stroke and a heart attack, she told you she was unable to obtain food stamps or afford her medicines. "Sorry to beg," she wrote, "but I need help so bad."

After consulting with Sue Smith, White House volunteer Debbie Ziff referred Ms. Mills' case to the local Area Agency on Aging (AAA). Like so many elderly persons living in rural areas, Ms. Mills lacks a phone, so an agency staff person went to her home to explore her concerns. A caseworker subsequently followed up on the visit, helping her obtain free medicines through the indigent drug program, arranging for physical therapy, sending out a nutritionist to advise her on healthy eating, and signing her up for the local congregate meal program.

Ms. Mills was "touched and astounded" that you cared, according to Debbie's AAA contact, who quoted the South Carolina resident as saying, "You mean to tell me that you came to help me because of that letter I wrote Mrs. Clinton?!" Her letter to you and the AAA's report are attached.

My name is Misty Hicks and I am 17 years old. I am a senior at a very small school in the Southwestern part of MO. in Taney County. You probably haven't heard about our school, but being a mother, and having a daughter about my age, I am sure you will be concerned.

The name of our school is Bradleyville School. There are only about 200 students in K-12. I have three sisters and they all graduated from Bradleyville with good educations, and all went to college. Both of my parents attended Bradleyville also, my mother all twelve years, and my father about 9 years. As you can tell, this may be a small school, but we get a good education and we are proud of where we are from.

Getting to my point, our school is in a lot of financial trouble. For starters we are surrounded by government land which we receive no money for. Our community is mostly farmers so there isn't much money coming from that either. So basically we are at the mercy of the government to provide us with enough money to keep our school

running. Then it all came to a head last December during our Christmas break. Our school is about fifty-five years old, and for several years we have been struggling with leaky ceilings and weak floors. We built a new gymnasium a few years ago which also contains our lunch room and music room. I guess we did this just in time because on December 27th our old gymnasium - which we were still using for P.E. and other things - collapsed. Inspectors came to assess damages and declared the rest of the school "unsafe" for classes. We were out of school about a month longer than we were supposed to be. When we finally did return we were introduced to eight trailers which serve as our school. There are two bathrooms with three toilets each for our entire school to use. We have a small set of lockers for high school which are situated in one end of the gym where the bleachers have been pushed back. The Junior High has a bathroom space in one of the trailers where they have to put their gym bags because we don't have enough lockers for them.

We walk outside between classes and on rainy days our little wooden plank sidewalks get very slick. They finally put some rough covering on the

top of them so no one would fall. Many of the rooms aren't big enough for certain classes, but we don't have enough money to rent another trailer. Our Home-Ec room doesn't even have a kitchen in it so the classes can't cook unless it's in a microwave or electric skillet.

There has been talk of consolidation, but Mrs. Clinton, it would be such a shame to close the school and everything it stands for. The people in our school have a very special relationship. Students and teachers have a friendship and can confide in one another. No student has to worry about being made fun of because he doesn't have money or doesn't dress like others. Everyone is accepted. It is safe in our school. Students don't bring weapons or threaten teachers. We all respect one another. You can't get that in very many schools, not even around here.

Everyone is really worried about what's going to happen to our school, so we are all writing letters. I wanted to write mine to you because it seems like women are a little more compassionate about these kind of things. Mrs. Clinton, I know you really stand behind what you believe and so do I. That's why I'm asking

you this favor. If there is anything you could possibly do to help our situation, any influence you might have, you can't imagine how many people would appreciate it greatly.

If we could get just enough money to rebuild a new school - not a fancy one with a pool or tennis courts or anything like that - just a basic building that we could have school in. We've already asked the government for their help, but being such a small community we aren't getting much recognition. I know you are for education, and I ask that you would please help us in any way you possibly could.

Dear Ms. Hicks:

This is in further reference to your recent letter to Mrs. Hillary Rodham Clinton. Your letter concerning the need for school facilities in the Bradleyville R-1 School District has been referred to me for reply because this office administers the Federal Impact Aid School Construction Program.

The Bradleyville School District filed a preapplication under Public Law 81-815 requesting Federal assistance to construct a new school facility in lieu of repairs to the current structure. That preapplication, filed for Fiscal Year 1994 funding consideration, has been reviewed and determined to be eligible for assistance.

The needed school facilities are estimated to cost \$1,800,000 according to information provided in the preapplication. Based on that figure, \$1,346,281 has been reserved under section 14(c) of Public Law 81-815, and \$453,719 representing insurance proceeds is to be provided by the Bradleyville School District. The School District is now in the process of completing the formal project application including an environmental impact assessment and various assurances that are required by law. As soon as those documents are received we will proceed with the planning stage of the project.

I hope this information is helpful.

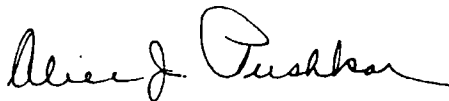

Dear (b)(6):

Thank you very much for your letter to Mrs. Clinton asking for assistance in finding a training program to help you qualify for a better job. As you are probably aware, your letter was referred to the Department of Education for reply. I hope that the information that we are providing helps you in reaching your goals.

In your letter you said that you have been handicapped since birth. You also indicated that you have been working as a dishwasher for about six years, and that your job has no retirement plan. You said that you wanted to prepare for retirement by learning how to do a more skilled job.

First, I want to congratulate you on keeping your job for six years. You must be doing well. In your letter, you said your doctor and job counselor advised you there are no programs available that are appropriate for you which provide the wages and benefits that you desire. You indicated you are just looking for a chance.

It is the goal of this administration to provide each individual with the tools and opportunities to become a productive member of society, and it is quite possible that the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services will be able to assist you in obtaining the job that you are looking for. I would like you to share your desires with your doctor or job counselor so that you can work together in finding a better job.

Since it is unclear from your letter whether or not you have ever applied for services from a vocational rehabilitation (VR) program, I will review the eligibility criteria. To be eligible for VR services, an individual must have a physical or mental impairment that is a substantial impediment to employment; be able to benefit in terms of employment from VR services; and, require VR services to prepare for, enter, engage in, or retain gainful employment. Decisions about an individual's eligibility for services, and the nature and extent of services which may be provided to an individual are determined by the State agency. The enclosed Fact Sheet gives you more specific information concerning the VR program. I have also enclosed the publication Pocket Guide to Federal Help for Individuals with Disabilities which will provide you with an overview of other Federal programs.

To find out more about services that may be appropriate for you, please contact Mr. Glen Yancey, Commissioner of Rehabilitation Services, Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, 300 Southwest Oakley Street, Biddle Building, 1st Floor, Topeka, Kansas 66606-1995. His telephone number is (913) 296-3911.

I am taking the liberty of providing a copy of this correspondence to Mr. Yancey so that he will know of your concerns and be expecting to hear from you. I am sure that he and members of his staff will be glad to assist you in any way possible. Again, I want to let you know that we appreciate your desire to improve yourself and hope that this information assists you in finding a training program that leads to a better job.

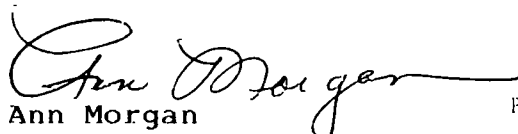
This letter will serve to document our conversation of last week regarding Pearlie Mills of Cheraw, South Carolina.
