SUBJECT: JANUARY MAIL

The letters and e-mail addressed to you in regard to the congressional hearings and the grand jury proceedings have increased significantly during the month of January. I believe that the following numbers will give you a sense of the quantity and content of this mail. The statistics are not inclusive of all mail received this month, but rather of the topics of most concern in the letters. I will provide more extensive statistics in a full mail report later this month.

Included with this report are examples of the letters and e-mail messages as well as the letter texts, pro and con, being used to answer this mail.

ANALYSIS

The mail clearly displays an overwhelmingly supportive response. There are relatively few con letters.

Since early January, the mail seems to reflect succeeding phases of public awareness. To illustrate:

- Phase 1 Early January - the "charges" - the issue of law firm billings is taken up by D'Amato Committee
- Phase 2 Week of January 7 - growing "media attention" - highlighted by the William Safire column and Newsweek cover story

Phase 3 Week of January 14 - "HRC responds" - TV appearances on 20/20, Today, etc.

Phase 4 Week of January 21 - "book tour/response"

I. Pro Mail

Among the "pro" mail, many went beyond simple words of support and appreciation. The substantive issues addressed included:

- A. Support for you as First Lady in terms of -
 - 1. Your personal "role model" qualities of character, ability and attitude displayed under fire
 - 2. Endorsing the issues you work on - health care, children, etc.
 - 3. Complimentary comparison with Eleanor Roosevelt
- B. Criticism of those perceived as your "attackers"
 - 1. Senator D'Amato and/or Senate Committee
 - 2. Partisan politicians
 - 3. Media spokespersons, including William Safire
- C. Advice that you should fight back
 - 1. Go public/ reach the American people directly(via television) and tell them the truth
 - 2. Go before the D'Amato committee
- D. Appreciation for you as strong First Lady role model
This is in some instances coupled with the view that your attackers are men who cannot accept women who evidence a strong character.

Four things were noted by those reading the letters: (1) A number of individuals wrote in the context of religion or prayer, drawing parallels to religious trials and tribulations, and advising you to hang in there...because God always wins. (2) The post-20/20 writers strongly complimented you on your appearance on the show. They praised your attitude, composure, intelligence, directness, poise, brilliance, etc. (3) Many praised you as an example of "public serenity." (4) Your correspondents exhibited great creativity. They were by turns poetic, humorous or sassy.

II. Con Mail

The few con-letters received typically chastised you for:

- A. Activities unworthy of a First Lady
- B. Telling lies, lacking credibility, and being greedy
- C. Some writers urged you to "put all cards on the table" and redeem yourself by confessing and apologizing for unspecified wrongs.

Many of our volunteers felt cheered by reading your letters in the past week. They explained that the negative news reports had left them feeling "down." After reading the very supportive letters, the volunteers realized that they shared with people all over the country a strong sense of support for you and your work.

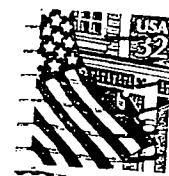

I think Senator D'Amato is behind his own plow and is just jawing and spitting in the wind.

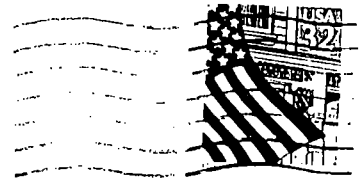

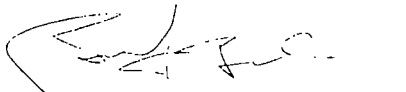

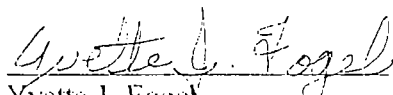
We wish to express our admiration for you and the manner in which you have performed as our First Lady. Any fair minded person must have decided by now that all the charges and noise are politically based and biased.

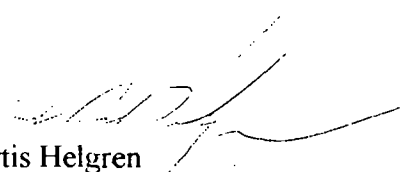
Dear Mrs. Clinton,

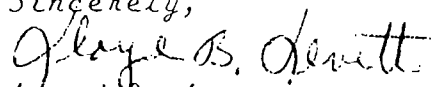

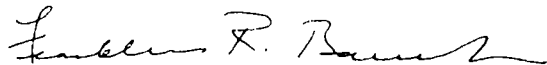
Dear Ms. Clinton:
