May God bless you and those you love, this holiday season and always.

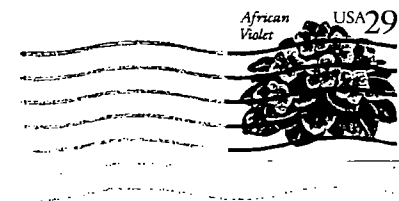
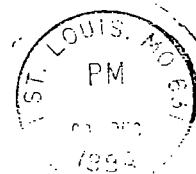
