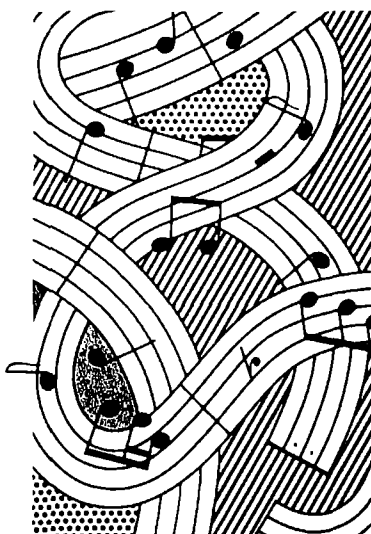

Douglas Dillon and Mrs. Suzzie Dillon a Tribute of Appreciation for Internationalism and Public Service at FAPE's annual State Department dinner on Thursday, June 8. The Honorable C. Douglas Dillon and Mrs. Dillon have been lifetime supporters of international diplomacy and the preservation of America's cultural heritage.

Mr. Dillon graduated from Groton School in 1927 and from Harvard University in 1931, *magna cum laude*. As an investment banker, he was a member of the New York Stock Exchange from 1931 to 1936. During World War II, he served four years in the Navy, rising to the rank of Lieutenant Commander. He is a recipient of the Legion of Merit with Combat V and the Air Medal.

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
