For it is only by deepening our understanding, unleashing our imaginations, and enlarging our capacities to see and to feel that we can envision a better future for ourselves, our communities, and our nation.

In the new and complicated century that awaits us, we will depend even more on our artists and humanists to help us discover the roots of our deepest beliefs and gain a vision of our most promising possibilities.

The month of October has been designated National Arts and Humanities Month, and I urge all Americans to celebrate the artistic and intellectual freedoms we enjoy and to reflect on the crucial role they play in reinvigorating and renewing our great nation every day.

The 12 sculptures selected celebrate the special genius of American artists and their enduring capacity to stir our imaginations and touch our hearts.

I hope this celebration of America's creative spirit will enable each of us to gain a greater appreciation of the rich cultural traditions we share as a nation and as a people.

My special thanks go to the Association of Art Museum Directors, the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Foundation, George Neubert, J. Carter Brown, and the lending institutions, for their time, energy, and wisdom in making this exhibition possible.

The twelve works of art selected from American art museums for this special exhibition span over seventy years of the 20th century, and represent a diverse and vital aspect of our cultural heritage. Conceived by Mrs. Clinton and drawn from public collections in the heartland of the nation and installed in the First Ladies' Garden of the White House, the exhibition has been organized under the auspices of the Association of Art Museum Directors.

The current selection provides a visual illustration and understanding of the transformation and development of 20th century sculpture.

Historically, sculptures have functioned primarily as statuary, nobly serving a civic purpose to memorialize society's heroes and reflecting its philosophical ideas. Pieces were often placed in an honored setting, high up on a pedestal, physically removed from everyday pedestrian traffic. Today, much contemporary sculpture has been removed from the elevated space and placed directly within the context of the viewer's environment. Significant 20th century sculpture now reflects the individual artist's vision and personal convictions about humankind and contemporary issues in modern society. Freed from specific subject matter or function, the visual and physical elements of three-dimensional form—shape, texture, color—have become the primary syntax for expression in the 20th century.

This exhibition highlights important examples of work by American artists who have contributed to this historical artistic transformation. Though retrospective in nature, over half of the inclusions in this exhibition are by living American artists. Diverse in their ideas, idioms and chosen medium, they span several artistic generations. Divided almost equally between figuration and abstraction, all evoke references to nature and the human figure.

Carved, modeled, or constructed, the predominant concern with material, structure, gravity, gesture and movement (implied or real) invite the viewer actively to participate and experience the work. Pieces were chosen that incorporate
