On March 28 we wrote you to invite you to address the National Assembly on the United States and the United Nations in Washington on September 1, 1995. A copy of this invitation is enclosed.

I understand that you may be in Beijing on September 1 in connection with the NGO forum which precedes the Fourth World Conference on Women. If that is so, I want you to know that we expect to arrange a satellite connection between the U.S. delegates attending the NGO Forum in Beijing and the National Assembly meeting in Washington. We would therefore be delighted if you would speak to the National Assembly by satellite transmission from Beijing, if you cannot do so in person.
