Personnel Briefing

The three objectives for this meeting are:

- 1) to give an overview of the Selection and Appointment Process by Presidential Personnel Office (PPO)
- 2) to review the HRC lists we have and to determine who are the priorities
- 3) to develop a workable process so that as names and positions arise we can adequately represent HRC's interests

A Brief Overview of the Selection and Appointment Process

From the beginning of Transition Personnel, the task seemed to be a difficult one. The Office was charged with, among other things, to develop a personnel system with diversity, outreach, and confidentiality, to gather skilled paid and volunteer staff, to create a computer system that could quickly enter and manage tens of thousands of resumes and to process many factors in narrowing a field of candidates who would best implement the goals of the Clinton administration. It was learning on the job and needless to say, all did not go smoothly even though many people worked countless hours and were doing their very best under arduous circumstances. Nonetheless, during the Transition Mrs. Clinton's staff had to create a shadow resume system because we never knew when the Resumix system might lose one of our candidates. Once in play resumes were difficult to track due to the extremely confidential, labor intensive, and non-computerized decision-making process.

Two Personnel Systems

Others were having the same problems so another system was created and is operated by the Office of Priority Placement (OPP). This was initiated in mid-January by Michael Wadley who was dissatisfied with the the way Resumix was at times losing Clinton-Gore campaign people and with the difficulty in representing them in the decision-making process. He vividly remembered the Carter Administration placing 1,000 people of which only 30 were the loyal campaign workers that helped win the election. He, therefore, was instrumental in creating a totally separate personnel computer and tracking system.

A Maturing PPO

Now that PPO has moved out of the Transition start-up phase and into the more structured Administration, each week it is being streamlined, and therefore is somewhat easier to use and less

fragmented. Since the very beginning people like Jan Piercy, Shirley Clarkson, Mark Bilsky, and many others have done excellent work. Now, as the task is changing, Bruce Lindsey, John Emerson, Janet Blanchard, and other new people, have helped PPO make the organizational response to this natural evolution of the Personnel task. Additionally it has made things easier to work with them now that a role has been announced between the First Lady's Office and PPO.

Tracking Candidates

As described, tracking is difficult due to the various factors, however, PPO is just beginning to attempt to track candidates from the time of entering into the system all the way to Senate Confirmation. (see the flow chart and the "Sub-Cabinet Nominee Status Report" under Tab A) On 2/11 we received a print-out which listed the candidate, the sponsor, the position, date received, and the person it was assigned to for action. Antonella Pianalto does the "Sub-Cabinet Nominee Status Report." This report picks up only at step 7 on the flow chart which is when the candidate accepts the offer of the position and the White House Counsel and PPO review process begins. Steps 1-6 are still rather fragmented, though they are trying.

Access to the Decision-Making Process by HRC Office

HRC Office has access to the process until Step 3 when "The Short List" arrives from the Secretary to Bruce Lindsey. After this those of us at the OEOB are included only as consulted. The Office of the First Lady in the West Wing should be receiving a copy of the department list at the same time that the President and the Vice President. If this is happening, this is the opportune time to comment.

To Be More Effective

The more we know who is truly important, the more effective we can be in the Personnel process. Since the " HRC Office" list has served as the umbrella for good and able candidates from several advisors, we do not know who is personally very important to HRC.

We recommend that:

- 1) HRC designates the importance of people on existing lists by marking "1" or "2"

and

- 2) we, therefore, use 2 lists--"HRC Office" as the sponsored umbrella for talented candidates and "OFL Clinton,H"(or another designation) for people who are very important to HRC.

This would give direction to our efforts as well as to those who wish to work on our behalf.

Under Tab B are 5 lists which would be extremely helpful if HRC could:

- * mark "1" for " Very Important," defined as people we must find a place for,
- * mark "2" for "Important," defined as talented people, perhaps personally known by HRC and we would like them in the administration if possible
- * cross through names for deletion

or

- * add any relevant comments

Status of Certain People

Under Tab C are updated status reports of particular individuals with specific questions.

Boards and Commissions

Janet Blanchard has only been in the administration for ten days and appears to be doing a good job, although there were no historical records left behind. She has already replaced all of the Chairs of the Regulatory Agencies and is in the process of moving forward with those Boards and Commissions that are astriked (see Tab D). These have been chosen because they reflect the priorities of the campaign, such as education, health, children, etc., or national need, such as disaster. Following is a small list of people who would like to be on a Board or Commission and have emerged from HRC lists and phone calls.

We would like to take a proactive stance on this since Boards and Commissions are a good way to bring people into the Administration. In discussions with Maggie we agreed to start with Skip Rutherford and Millie Alston to get a list of friends. The ones we are seriously considering calls can be made to find out their interests, if unknown. I have already talked with Skip. He will be getting me a list early this coming week of people mainly from Arkansas.

Ambassadors

Also under Tab D is a list of the State Department's Priority 1993 Ambassadorial Vacancies, a list of OPP names for Ambassador and U.N. Posts, and a small list of 3 people who have emerged from the lists we now have. Additional names who HRC may wish to

put forward would probably emerge from the working with Skip and Millie.

Question: Are there other approaches we should be taking regarding Boards and Commissions and Ambassadors?

Ongoing Communication

One of the most effective tools in placing our people is timely communication. Under Tab E are two suggested forms.

The first is designed for Millie and Pam to use as letters and resumes come in for HRC to give us direction and priority. The second is a suggested format for the daily, sometimes urgent, situations and inquires that arise. These can be communicated through daily meetings with Maggie.

Clinton Presidential Records Digital Records Marker

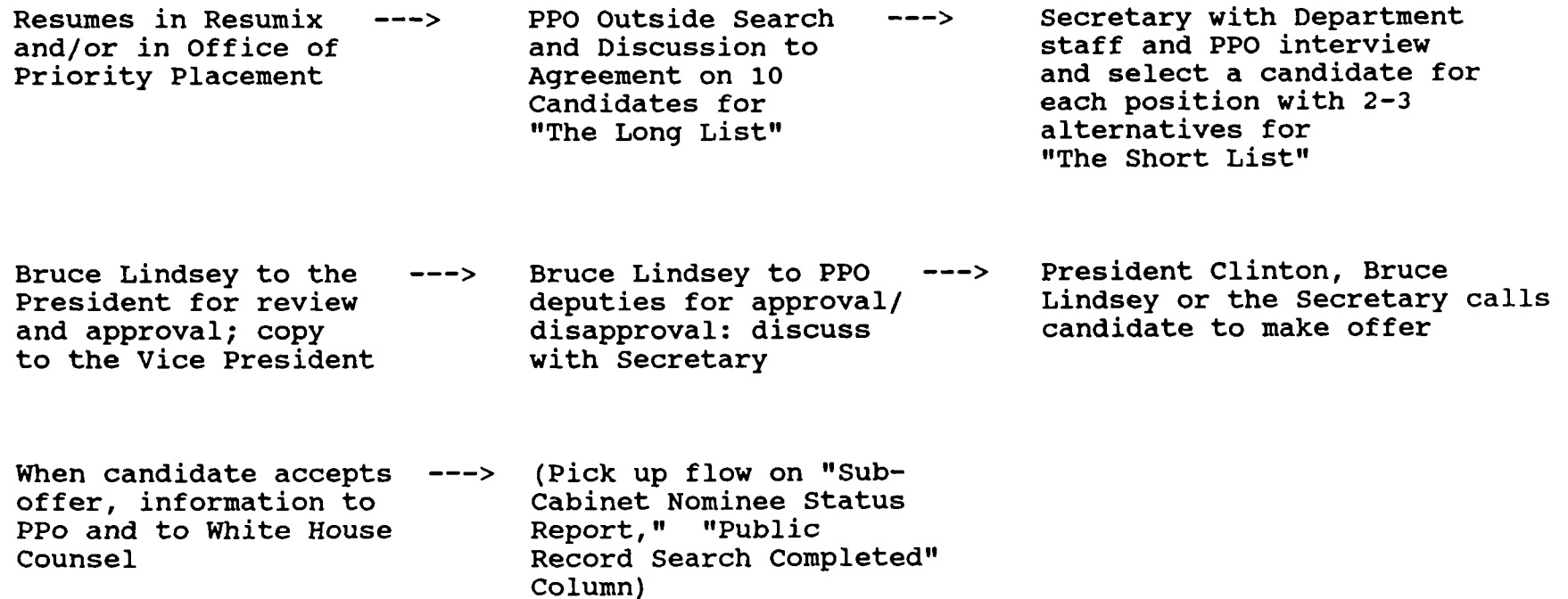

Selection and Appointment Process for Sub-Cabinet Nominees

1. Presidential Personnel (PPO) approves a list of 10 candidates for each position for submittal to the Secretary. This list includes a short biography on each candidate, the list of also considered candidates, a position analysis and the list of individuals and constituent groups contacted for outreach.

2. The Secretary and his/her staff work with the PPO search team to interview and select a recommended candidate for each position.

3. The Secretary submits a memo with recommended candidates to Bruce Lindsey via the Deputies. This memo includes the Secretary's recommended candidate for each position, 2-3 alternative candidates, the candidate's current position, their home state and ethnicity information. (See attachment A - Form to be used by Secretaries for recommended candidates.)

4. The memo is reviewed with the search team for comments.

5. Bruce Lindsey presents the Secretary's recommendations to President Clinton for his review and approval. A copy is submitted to Vice President Gore. The President approves the recommendation for each position or requests further consideration be made.

6. Bruce Lindsey, the Deputies or the Associate Directors will discuss President Clinton's decision with the Secretary.

7. President Clinton, Bruce Lindsey or the Secretary will call the candidate to make the offer. Who calls the candidate will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

8. When the candidate has accepted the offer and the the Secretary's office has provided the necessary information to PPO (Candidate's Social Security #, date of birth, place of birth, phone #'s and addresses), PPO sends a memo to White House counsel informing them that the President has approved such candidates and instructing them to send the forms to candidates and then to interview them. The memo also goes to Personnel counsel to initiate the defensive public record search. (See attachment B - Counsel Transmittal Form)

9. Personnel counsel submits the defensive public record report to PPO. White House counsel submits the preliminary approval memo to PPO upon successful completion of the interview and receipt and review of FBI and financial disclosure forms. White House counsel informs the Secretary and PPO of any problems. (See attachment C - Counsel Preliminary Approval Memo)

10. White House counsel initiates the FBI field investigation.

11. PPO sends a memo with a biography of the candidate to White House Communications office approving the release of the name of the nominee in 24 hours. Copies of the memo are sent to Congressional, Political, and Intergovernmental Affairs, Public Liaison, the First Lady's office and the Vice President's office for review and discussion with relevant parties.

12. At the onset of the FBI investigation, the appropriate committee is contacted to begin the nomination process.

13. Upon successful completion of the FBI investigation, the nominee's name is sent to the Senate for confirmation.
