Just thought I would drop you a note to tell you what a terrific speech your boss gave in Independence on Saturday, and to congratulate you for being forthright and stout in your congressional testimony.

I was very pleased to be at the health care rally Saturday. Not only did the First Lady deliver her speech in compelling fashion, but it was very nicely crafted. I especially liked the line about creating a health care system that didn't have a hole in its heart. In fact, the letter she read was from the daughter of a co-worker of my sister-in-law. I told my sister-in-law whom to get the letter to and it worked out perfectly. By using the girl's letter in the speech, Ms. Clinton provided both a dramatic reason for health care reform and a real boost to a family in crisis.
