Sister Helen Prejean is a writer, lecturer, and community organizer whose book and subsequent movie, *Dead Man Walking*, is an eyewitness account of the application of the death penalty in the United States. She has lectured extensively about capital punishment and has been featured on ABC World News Tonight, 60 Minutes, BBC World Service radio, and a NBC special series on the death penalty. As a 1995 recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship, she is conducting research for a forthcoming book on women.

Gary Bellow

Gary Bellow is the Louis D. Brandeis Professor of Law at Harvard Law School and Director of its Legal Services Institute and the Jamaica Plain Legal Services Center. He was an early leader of the Legal Aid Society for the District of Columbia and California Rural Legal Assistance. Professor Bellow was a pioneer in clinical education in law school, inspiring thousands of students, lawyers, and law professors. Throughout his career, he has led the way in improving the quality and effectiveness of the day-to-day practice of law on behalf of the poor and disenfranchised.

The Leadership Conference on Civil Rights is pleased to present a joint Award to the new leadership of the NAACP, Myrlie Evers-Williams, Chairperson of the National Board of Directors, and The Honorable Kweisi Mfume, President and CEO, and to The Honorable Norman Y. Mineta, for his leadership in Congress.



An activist and author, Myrlie Evers-Williams has been a vigorous participant in the struggle for justice and equality. A role model for young people, she has lectured extensively before civil rights groups, women's organizations, social groups and at universities. A leader in voter registration campaigns, she continues to participate in grassroots work with numerous organizations.



Born and raised in Baltimore, Maryland, Kweisi Mfume represented Maryland's 7th Congressional District from 1986 until February 1996, when he took over the helm of the NAACP. The former Chairman of the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC), he consistently advocated landmark minority business and civil rights legislation during his years in Congress. Mr. Mfume served as Chair of the CBC Task Force to Preserve Affirmative Action and as the Vice Chairman for Communications in the House Democratic Caucus.



Norman Y. Mineta, a native of San Jose, represented California's 15th Congressional District for 21 years. He was one of 120,000 Americans of Japanese ancestry interned during the War. While in Congress, he was the driving force behind passage of the Civil Liberties Act of 1988, which redressed these injustices. Mr. Mineta was the House Democratic Deputy Whip. A founder and first chair of the Congressional Asian Pacific American Caucus, he is currently Senior Vice President of Lockheed Martin.

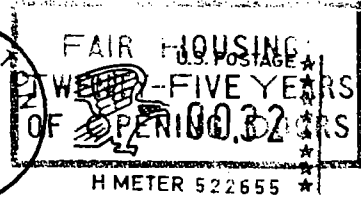

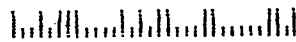

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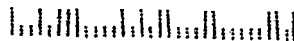

Since 1940, Translating Rights Into Realities

Many of the freedoms cherished by all Americans — black and white, rich and poor — have the force of law thanks to the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund (LDF).

LDF was founded in 1940 under the leadership of the late Thurgood Marshall (although initially affiliated with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, the Legal Defense Fund was always an independent organization. Since 1957, LDF has been an entirely separate organization with its own budget, board of directors, staff and program.)

LDF is America's oldest civil rights law organization and pioneered the concept of public interest law by demonstrating how effective advocacy in the courts can be. For more than half a century, LDF has used the law as a powerful tool to pry open doors of opportunity long closed to African Americans, other people of color, women and the poor.

With a fundamental mission of transforming the promise of equality into a social, economic and political reality for all people, LDF continues to fight for equal rights and empowerment for African Americans and other disenfranchised groups in the areas of education, employment, criminal justice, voting rights, housing, health care and environmental justice.
