BRAIN AWARENESS WEEK is a national public information campaign created by the Dana Alliance for Brain Initiatives to unite scientific institutions, educational organizations, and patient outreach groups in a common effort to excite the public and policy makers about the progress and promise of brain research: the treatment, cure and prevention of brain diseases and disorders that affect more than 50 million Americans.

THE PARTNERS IN BRAIN AWARENESS WEEK include 15 government entities, including 11 of the National Institutes of Health, the Library of Congress, the Department of Education-National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and over 125 scientific, educational, and patient outreach groups.

As part of the campaign, people of all ages across the country will be able to visit brain research laboratories, take a brain quiz, see exhibits on the brain, hear lectures from prominent scientists, find information about the brain through an Internet web site, and participate in many other national and local activities.
