TYPES OF PRIMARIES:

Winner-take-all: Candidate winning statewide primary vote gets all the state's delegates.

Winner-take-all by district: Candidate winning in each congressional district wins delegates allotted to that district.

Combination: Delegates go to district winners but at-large delegates go to the statewide winner.

Proportional: Delegates are divided according to candidates' vote shares, statewide or by districts.

Direct election: Delegates are personally elected; their candidate preferences are nonbinding.

NOTE: Dates subject to change. Excludes U.S. territories and possessions. Local caucuses and/or conventions may accompany the main event listed above.

SUBJECT: Communicating Our Economic Message

The NEC hosted a meeting yesterday for CoS's and Communication Directors regarding amplification of Clinton's economic successes.

The NEC has organized an economic message roll-out for July 29th - August 9th. Key dates during this time: August 1st, when the 2nd quarter GDP numbers will be released and they are expected to be very positive; August 2nd, when the July employment numbers will be released (we do not know what they be like); and August 6th, the 3 year anniversary of passage of the President's economic plan.

They have given specific assignments to eight core economic principles: Panetta, Rubin, Reich, Kantor, Tyson, Stiglitz, Lader, and Summers. **They would also like for other administration officials (including you) to incorporate economic successes into events and speeches over the next few weeks, and to consider doing radio or media conference call interviews.**

Some ideas for your participation include:

1. **A thirty minute conference call with women reporters: How women have benefited in the Clinton economy.**
Focus on some basic numbers, as well as EITC, education investment and the minimum wage increase.
2. **Radio interviews on the 3 year anniversary of the passage of the President's economic plan.**

Let me know if you think you will be available for either option or if you have another idea.

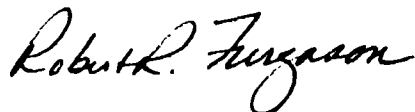

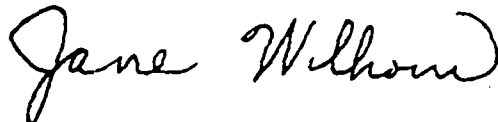

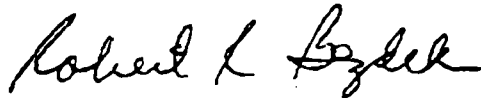
