REQUEST: TV PSA on Drunk Driving Prevention-

PURPOSE: For the first time in a decade, drunk driving fatalities rose last year.
This TV PSA will warn against drunk driving as we approach the
New Year's holiday. The video will be made available to ABC,
CBS, NBC, Fox, and cable networks to aire before the holiday.

DATE AND TIME: Video to be aired before January 1, 1997.

SOURCE OF PAYMENT: The Harvard Alcohol Project, Harvard School of Public Health.

BACKGROUND: Each year in December, the President has taped similar PSAs
sponsored by the Harvard Alcohol Projects's Designated Driver
Campaign. These messages received extensive exposure during
prime time television viewing. The President did not tape a
message last year because of the upcoming election.

DURATION: PSA spot is less than one minute.

DRUNK DRIVING TELEVISION PSA, THE HARVARD ALCOHOL PROJECT

Video Sponsor

The Harvard Alcohol Project will cover all production expenses associated with the video taping. The PSA will be viewed on ABC, CBS, NBC, Fox, and cable networks before the New Year's holiday.

Video Decision

It is very important that the President maintain his ongoing commitment to prevent drinking and driving in 1997. The President did not tape a message in 1995, the exact year fatalities turned upward for the first time in a decade. This TV PSA will enable the President to demonstrate his strong commitment. Jay Winsten, a friend of the President and professor at the Harvard School of Public Health, is advocating this video taping on behalf of The Harvard Alcohol Project.

Video Background

This PSA will encourage people to be responsible drinkers during a time when many drinking and driving accidents occur -- the holidays. This message is particularly important as we begin the New Year.

PRESIDENT'S SCRIPT FOR DRUNK DRIVING PREVENTION TELEVISION PSA

The PRESIDENT:

Between 1988 and 1994, we reduced drink driving fatalities by 30 percent, saving 25,000 lives, thanks to tough laws, strict enforcement, and the voluntary actions of 65 million designated drivers.

Last year, for the first time in years, fatalities increased. It's time to re-double our efforts.

This holiday season, if you choose to drink alcohol, please be responsible. Drink in moderation and choose a designated driver who doesn't drink at all. One life is too many to waste.

Sports Events

There are numerous sports team that have won championships over the past few months that have not been invited to the White House. Most of these teams were told that we would address the issue at the completion of the campaign.

With the campaign over, we need to decide whether we are going to invite all, some or none of these teams to the White House.

College World Series Champions: Louisiana State University -- June 8, 1996

- We invited the team and scheduled a date however due to their schedule, it was postpned.

Stanley Cup Champion: Colorado Avalanche -- June 10, 1996

- After they won the cup, we extended an invitation. They have expressed a strong desire to come to the White House. Their season is currently underway.

NBA Champion :Chicago Bulls -- June 16, 1996

- We extended an invitation for a date TBD in the future. Initially there seemed not to be much interest on behalf of the team to come to the White House.

Florida Braves Girls Softball Team - August 17, 1996

- The Braves won their 11th championship in the last 16 years last August. The Braves are a girls softball team (13-15 year olds). They won the World Championship the last 8 years in a row. We have had numerous requests to bring them to the White House over the last four years, however with all of the other requests, we have never extended an invitation.

Solheim Cup Winner: The United States Team -- September 24, 1996

- The American team defeated the European team to retain the Solheim Cup. The Solheim Cup is the LPGA equivalent of the Ryder Cup. A team of 12 women golfers plays a team of 12 European golfers. This years competition took place at the St. Pierre Golf Club in Chepstow, Wales. The President has hosted the 1994 team for an Oval Office visit.
- No invitation has been extended, the team however has strong interest.

Major League Soccer Champions: DC United -- October 20, 1996

- This is the first season of Major League Soccer. No invitation has been extended but the team is very interested.

World Series Winner: The New York Yankees -- October 26, 1996

- No invitation has been extended.

Please designate a staff person to compile a list of all the scheduling priorities no later than December 1.

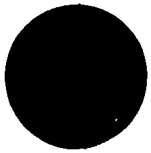
