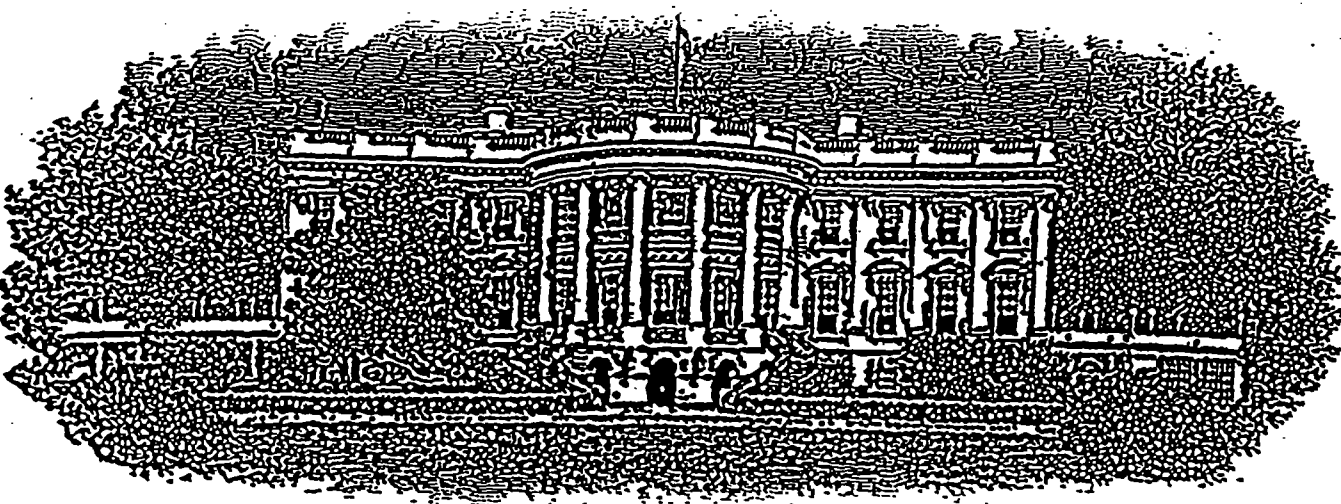

- I. **Regulatory Issues** (convened by Elena Kagan). This group will look at: (a) FDA regulation of product content, including nicotine; (b) FDA regulation of access, advertising, and labeling; and (c) restrictions on environmental tobacco smoke in public buildings and workplace settings. Participating White House offices are DPC, OMB, OVP, NEC, and OSTP. Participating agencies are HHS, DOJ, DOL, GSA, EPA, and Treasury.
- II. **Program and Budget Issues** (convened by Chris Jennings). This group will examine proposed uses of settlement funds, including programs to reduce smoking and expand children's health care coverage. In particular, the group will consider the use of settlement funds for: (a) children's health care; (b) education efforts (including grass roots programs); (c) smoking cessation programs; and (d) investments in health research, including nicotine research. White House offices are DPC, OMB, NEC, OVP, and OSTP. Participating agencies are HHS, Treasury, DOL, USDA, Interior, VA, and DOD.
- III. **Legal Issues** (convened by Elena Kagan). This group will review the settlement's provisions on liability, damages, and document disclosure, and will consider constitutional, antitrust, and other legal issues raised by the settlement. White House offices are DPC, OVP, NEC, and Counsel. Participating agencies are DOJ, HHS, Treasury, EPA, and Interior.
- IV. **Industry Performance and Accountability** (convened by Bruce Reed). This group will analyze the economic effects of a settlement. The group will assess: (a) the economics of the industry and the settlement's effects on industry performance, international markets, federal revenues, consumers, farmers, etc.; and (b) the set of incentives and penalties in the settlement to reduce tobacco use, especially by children. On a separate track, Dan Tarullo will oversee a look at Administration policy on tobacco-related trade and international issues, which the settlement does not directly address. White House offices are DPC, NEC, CEA, OVP, OMB, and OSTP; participating agencies are: HHS, Treasury, DOL, USDA, USTR, State, and DOD.

STATEMENT OF THE PRESIDENT

Today the Department of Justice filed a notice in the Greensboro U.S. District Court appealing the part of Judge Osteen's order that invalidated the Food and Drug Administration's tobacco advertising restrictions. The Department is asking for an expedited appeal, because every day of delay matters to our children's health. Each day, 3,000 children and young people become regular smokers, and 1000 of them will have their lives cut short as a result of their smoking. And this problem of youth tobacco use is getting worse. The percentage of eighth and tenth graders smoking has risen for four consecutive years. The FDA's common sense advertising restrictions would reverse this trend.

We will continue to work to protect our children from tobacco, and we will not stop until we succeed.

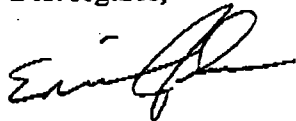

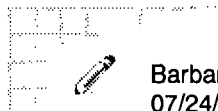

Purpose: To hear from state and local officials who have been fighting on the front lines, and to hear from experts on anti-smoking "counter-advertising" campaigns.

1. **Gregory N. Connolly, D.M.D., M.P.H.** of Massachusetts.

Gregory Connolly is **Director of the Massachusetts Tobacco Control Program**. Massachusetts, along with California, has received national recognition for reducing tobacco use, especially among young people, by enacted a tobacco excise tax that has generated funding for a statewide counter advertising campaign. Dr. Connolly is also credited with passage of the 1986 federal law on smokeless tobacco, and was awarded the Surgeon General's Medallion for National Leadership by Dr. C. Everett Koop in 1987. He has testified before Congress on numerous occasions, and appears regularly on major national news shows.

2. **Donna Grande, M.G.A.** of Arizona.

Donna Grande is **Director, of Full Court Press** in Arizona -- a 5 year, \$3.5 million, program funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, to develop a successful prototype to reduce youth smoking by 10 percent. From 1991-1996, Ms. Grande ran Project ASSIST in Arizona.

3. **Sally Herndon Malek, M.P.H.** of North Carolina.

Sally Herndon Malek is **Manager of Project ASSIST** in the North Carolina Department of Health. She has been with the project since its inception. Sally serves as Chair of the Association of State and Territorial Health Officers' (ASTHO) Tobacco Prevention and Control Network.

4. **Randy Schwartz, M.S.P.H.** of Maine

Randy Schwartz is **Director of Community and Family Health**, with the Maine Bureau of Health, and has run Project ASSIST in Maine since it began in 1991. Mr. Schwartz has worked with numerous federal, state, and local tobacco control efforts.

5. **Peter Zollo** of Illinois

Peter Zollo is **President** and Co-founder of **Teenage Research Unlimited** the first market research firm to specialize exclusively in teenagers. Peter has worked extensively on teenage cigarette smoking cessation and the development of counter-advertising. He is on the Columbia University School of Public Health, Tobacco Counter-Marketing Panel, and has conducted research and consulted for the State of Massachusetts in its counter-advertising campaign.

ASSIST

NCI's American Stop Smoking Intervention Study for Cancer Prevention (ASSIST) project, represents a joint effort among NCI, the American Cancer Society, and health departments in 17 states. During the first 24 months of the project (1991-1993), each state conducted a detailed site analysis and needs assessment. Following a careful review of these findings, each state developed its own comprehensive 5-year smoking control plan. In the intervention phase (1993-1998), each state has been implementing their plan. State programs rely on proven interventions in work sites, health care settings, schools, community groups, and mass media. Detailed guidelines and extensive training has been continually provided to ensure that all interventions used in ASSIST are consistent with current scientific knowledge. While prevention and cessation services are an integral component of any comprehensive effort, in ASSIST emphasis is placed on the strategic use of media and the adoption and implementation of those smoking control policies that support nonsmoking as the accepted community norm. ASSIST also relies on a coalition based model. To date, more than 2,000 community organizations have

The following constitutes a proposed "expert consultation" process, designed to elicit effectively and efficiently the opinions about the tobacco proposal of interested individuals and groups and to ensure that the public is aware of how the Administration is conducting its review of the proposal. There are still a number of open questions.

TYPES OF MEETINGS: process should include all of the following:

I. Small meeting(s)

- A. Secretary Shalala, Bruce Reed, the Vice President and/or other senior-level Administration officials would hold small meetings with "VIPs" interested in the issue.
- B. Currently, we would suggest either one or two such meetings.
 - 1. Koop and Kessler.
 - 2. Sullivan and Califano (optional).
- C. PRESS: not open to public, but publicized.
- D. AGENDA: need not be structured -- open dialogue.
- E. TIME: 2 hours.

II. Larger meeting(s) (approx 10 people).

- A. These meetings, also chaired by senior-level Administration officials, would be larger to get more views on the issue, while ensuring a high degree of interaction.
- B. We would recommend two such meetings.
 - 1. The first would focus on the public health implications of the proposal and would be with the heads of the key national health groups (e.g., AHA, AMA, ACS, ALA, APHA).
 - 2. The second would be a meeting with 5-10 Attorneys General who are supporting the proposal. Perhaps we would ask AG Moore to recommend the list of invitees.
- C. PRESS: Need not be open to public entirely, but should be publicized and

provide stakeouts.

- D. AGENDA: should be structured but should allow for some flexibility.
- E. TIME: 2-3 hours.
- F. Other outstanding issues:
 - 1. Who from Administration should attend?
 - 2. How large?
 - 3. Should discussion go beyond the 4 corners of the proposal?
 - 4. Do we want to solicit views before the meeting(s)?

III. Summit-Type Meeting

- A. Full day "summit". Table would be arranged in a horseshoe with the Secretary, Bruce Reed, and the Vice President at the head and 10-15 individuals surrounding them.
- B. We see three different ways to structure such a meeting:
 - 1. **OPTION 1:** The 10-15 individuals at the horseshoe would stay the same. They would represent a diverse range of interests:
 - a. Public health
 - b. International tobacco (WHO)
 - c. Agricultural interests
 - d. Advertisers
 - e. Retailers
 - f. Business interests (re: ETS policies)
 - g. Grassroots organizations (non-Washington types)
 - h. State/local government officials (e.g., NGA, NCSL, Mayors, NAACHO)
 - i. Tobacco control experts (ASSIST)
 - 2. AGENDA: would be broken down into themes, perhaps loosely in the same manner as the WH/HHS review:
 - a. FDA regulatory authority
 - b. Advertising/Access/Labeling
 - c. Use of revenue generated by a proposal
 - d. Economic impact (on tobacco industry and other industries)

- e. Penalties/incentives.
3. **OPTION 2:** The day is divided into two distinct sessions, morning and afternoon:
- a. Morning: seat 10-15 individuals from the "public health" side at the horseshoe (e.g., public health organizations, national and local grassroots tobacco control organizations, physicians, academics, state/local public health officials). Focus would be on the public health concerns (e.g., FDA regulatory authority, access and advertising provisions, education, research, international), but other issues should be on the table.
 - b. Afternoon: seat 10-15 individuals representing other "interested" sectors of the economy at the horseshoe (e.g., retailers, advertisers, economists (to present a view regarding economic impact), farmers).
 - c. Panelists would be invited to sit in the audience for the part they are not on the panel.
4. **OPTION 3:** Hybrid. As in option 1, the panel members would stay the same throughout the day. But all 10-15 panel members would represent "public health interests" (as in the Option 2, morning session). The audience would include representatives of other "interested" sectors who would have an opportunity to make comments and engage in Q & A. As in option 1, the agenda would be divided in themes.
- C. **AUDIENCE:** In either case the audience would include 30-50 individuals with expertise/interest in one or more of the areas described above. Audience would have an opportunity to engage in some discussion and Q & A, and perhaps, depending on the option we choose, make comments.
- D. **PRESS:** Open.
- E. **TIME:** 3/4 - full day.
- F. **Other outstanding issues:**
- 1. Should discussion go beyond the 4 corners of the proposal?
 - 2. Do we want to solicit views before the meeting(s)?
 - 3. Ratio between structured discussion and open mic, etc?

You are invited to participate in an inter-agency meeting focusing on international trade and other policy issues pursuant to the Administration's review of the proposed tobacco industry settlement. Our goal will be to prepare a brief paper outlining international policy issues for use by a Working Group to be chaired by Dan Tarullo. (The Tarullo group will meet next week.)

In addition to a brief overview of the review process, topics to be addressed include:

1. Current USG policies re: tobacco:
 - trade & investment
 - health
 - economic development
2. The proposed settlement:
 - international activities of the U.S. tobacco industry; export trends
 - international policy implications of the proposed settlement
 - possible USG policy responses

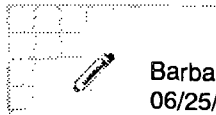

Hi Elena. Yesterday on the Senate floor, Harkin and others offered an amendment to the Ag appropriations bill to provide full funding for the FDA's efforts to prevent youth smoking. (The offset for the \$34 million was obtained by increasing the tobacco marketing assessment, which the sponsors said would be ultimately borne by the purchasers of tobacco, ie not the tobacco farmer.) The amendment lost 52-48, with 11 Democrats voting against it (including folks like Moseley-Brau, Landrieu, Moynihan, Inouye and Reid) They are going to take a revote today. Harkin and other sponsors contend that without this amendment, the Greensboro case outcome is nullified. The sponsors are hoping that someone in the White House would call some of the Ds above and persuade them that this amendment is worth fighting for. I'm not sure who is following this issue in the White House, but I thought you and Bruce might be interested. I have some material I will fax you on it. Let me know if there are others I should contact. Thanks. Kay
