SUBJECT: Nomination of William H. Tobey for the Department
of Defense Medal for Distinguished Civilian
Service

This is to nominate William H. Tobey for the Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Civilian Service, in recognition of his exceptional service while on detail from the Office of the Secretary of Defense to the National Security Council Staff from October 1986 to January 1993.

As Director for Defense Policy and Arms Control under the administrations of both President Reagan and President Bush, Mr. Tobey has led the interagency effort on a range of policy areas of vital importance to the Department of Defense and to the nation. All are areas of exceptional complexity as well as importance, involving many Executive Branch agencies, the Congress, the public, the former Soviet Union, and our Allies.

Over the years, Mr. Tobey has played a central and critical role in U.S. strategic defense policy, including the growth of the Strategic Defense Initiative to a major defense program, the reorientation of the SDI to the Global Protection Against Limited Strikes system, and the more recent effort to forge a Global Protection System. Mr. Tobey has had the lead within the National Security Council Staff on strategic defense policy issues. As Chairman of the Policy Coordinating Committee Sub-Committee on the Defense and Space Talks, he worked to ensure that U.S. arms control policy was consistent with our strategic defense policy goals, and over the past year was untiring in his effort to advance cooperation with Russia, our allies and friends on a Global Protection System.

Mr. Tobey played an equally important role in U.S. policy on arms control verification and compliance. As Chairman of the Policy Coordinating Committee Sub-Committee on Verification and Compliance, he oversaw U.S. arms control compliance policy, including the annual reports to the Congress on compliance with arms control agreements. It is in no small measure due to Mr. Tobey's dedication and skill that the Administration policy to insist on scrupulous compliance with arms control agreements led to dramatic successes, including the Soviet decision to destroy the illegal Krasnoyarsk radar. Those successes in turn played an

important part in encouraging increasing openness in the Soviet Union, and ultimately, its replacement by independent states.

Mr. Tobey also chaired the Arms Control Policy Coordinating Committee Sub-Committee on the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty. In that capacity, he oversaw implementation of the INF Treaty, including completion of the destruction of the entire class of intermediate-range ballistic missiles.

Mr. Tobey's accomplishments have also been noteworthy in the field of U.S. space policy. He has led the interagency effort on all space activities with national security implications, including both defense programs such as anti-satellite arms control policy, and broader issues such as commercial space launch policy. In the commercial space area in particular, he has pioneered efforts to develop a cohesive policy out of the widely diverse interests of different agencies and public groups -- all with the aim of ensuring that national security interests are fully protected in U.S. commercial space policy decisions. Mr. Tobey led U.S. efforts to develop the U.S.-Russia Space Cooperation Agreement which Presidents Bush and Yeltsin signed at the June 1992 Summit.

Mr. Tobey's work at the National Security Council has been invariably characterized by exceptional dedication, integrity, commitment to a fair and open interagency process, and ability to forge cooperation and consensus out of controversy. Mr. Tobey has served two Presidents and the Nation with exceptional distinction. I strongly recommend him for the Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Civilian Service. A proposed citation is attached.

This is to nominate Dr. Susan J. Koch for the Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Civilian Service, in recognition of her exceptional service while on detail from the Office of the Secretary of Defense to the National Security Council Staff from December 1991 to January 1993.

As the Deputy in the Defense Policy and Arms Control Directorate of the National Security Council Staff, Dr. Koch oversees the development of national security policy across the full range of nuclear, conventional, chemical and strategic defense arms control and defense issues. Her work involves constant interaction with national security agencies, requires fair and balanced presentation of agency views, and the careful preparation of issues for the most senior-level decision.

Dr. Koch chairs the most senior interagency steering group meetings in the absence of the Senior Director. She effectively leads the Nuclear Testing Sub-Committee of the Arms Control Policy Coordinating Committee. In addition, in the complex environment of the breakup of the former Soviet Union, Dr. Koch effectively leads various ad hoc interagency groups to address new issues that span the traditional interagency policy structure.

Dr. Koch has played an important role in the conclusion of important arms control agreements with the new Russian Federation and the other new states of the former Soviet Union, including the recently-completed START II Treaty. She has also been a central figure in the novel process of granting assistance, under the Nunn-Lugar Act, to Russia and other newly independent states to ensure the safe and secure dismantlement of nuclear weapons, strategic nuclear delivery vehicles, and chemical weapons.

Dr. Koch has been one of the most effective and dedicated members of the National Security Council Staff. Her contributions to the development and implementation of the nation's policies involving

the breakup of the former Soviet Union and the control and reduction of nuclear weapons have truly been superior. Those achievements continue Dr. Koch's consistent record of exemplary public service, evidenced by her receipt in both 1989 and 1990 of the Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Civilian Service. 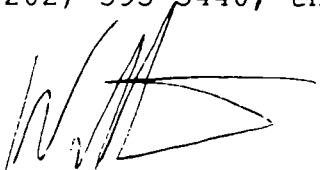

SUBJECT: Timing of Secretary of Defense Resignation to Maintain Continuity of Chain of Command Over the Armed Forces During Transition Hours

By memorandum of December 23, 1992, the Assistant to the President and Director of Presidential Personnel requested the resignations of all heads of executive departments and other Senate-confirmed presidential appointees to become effective not later than noon on January 20, 1993. I have submitted my resignation effective at noon on January 20, 1993 in accordance with that request. I recommend, however, that you instead accept my resignation to take effect upon the appointment of the new Secretary of Defense, to ensure that we avoid any gap during which no-one can exercise the powers of the Secretary of Defense.

The General Counsel of the Department of Defense (DOD) has advised me that simultaneous effectiveness at noon on January 20, 1993 of the resignations of all DOD Senate-confirmed Presidential appointees would leave the United States with no Acting Secretary of Defense for the (hopefully few) hours between noon and the time at which the new President can appoint his new Secretary of Defense. The absence of an Acting Secretary of Defense would occur because all DOD officers qualified under Executive Order 12787 to act as Secretary of Defense are Senate-confirmed Presidential appointees covered by your staff's instruction to submit resignations effective at noon on January 20.

It is important to have a person legally qualified to exercise the powers of the Secretary of Defense at all times. Although we would hope and expect that nothing requiring Secretary of Defense instructions to the armed forces would occur during the brief gap that day between noon and the appointment of a new Secretary of Defense, it is prudent that there be an individual legally qualified to exercise the powers of the Secretary of Defense during that brief gap. Thus, with your approval, I would propose to remain in office for the hours between inauguration of the new President and his appointment of a new Secretary of Defense.

It is my understanding that Secretary of Defense-designate Les Aspin's confirmation hearing is scheduled for January 7, 1993, that the new President is expected to sign and transmit to the Senate Mr. Aspin's nomination with other cabinet nominations very shortly after being sworn in, that the Senate is expected to consent to Mr. Aspin's appointment shortly after he is nominated, and that the new President should be in a position to appoint Mr. Aspin as Secretary of Defense before the day is out on January 20, 1993.

Your signature below will indicate your acceptance of my resignation effective upon the appointment of my successor as Secretary of Defense, to ensure that we maintain continuity of the chain of command over the armed forces during the transition.

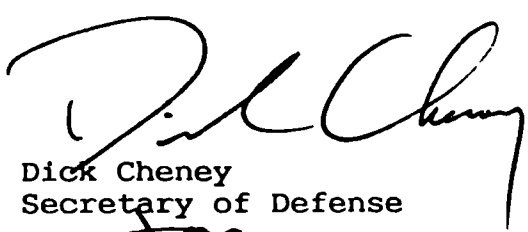

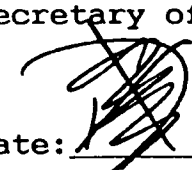

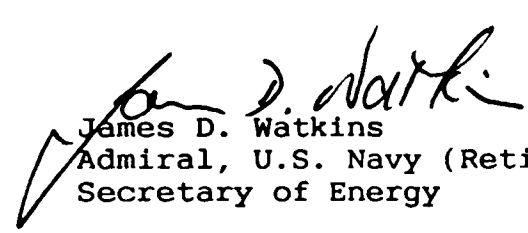
SUBJECT: Joint DOD/DOE Nuclear Weapons Surety Report for 1991

Attached is the Joint Department of Defense/Department of Energy Annual Report to the President on Nuclear Weapons Surety for 1991. It summarizes progress made during 1991 and reports issues where appropriate. The Department of Defense and the Department of Energy will continue to emphasize improvements in safety, security, and control of nuclear weapons.

As we note in the Annual Surety Report, the United States needs to maintain a modest, but effective, nuclear testing program. The FY 1993 Energy and Water Appropriations bill contains provisions that place limits on the numbers and purposes of nuclear tests, which could prevent us from continued certification of the safety and reliability of the nuclear weapons stockpile. These provisions assume that for highly complex weapon systems only three types of older safety technologies are adequate to protect the health and safety of the public. They prevent us from developing newer and markedly improved safety technologies and would even prohibit testing to verify the existence of some safety deficiencies or to confirm corrective actions. We urge your continued support of the nuclear testing program as an indispensable vehicle for improving and maintaining the surety of the nuclear weapons in the United States stockpile.

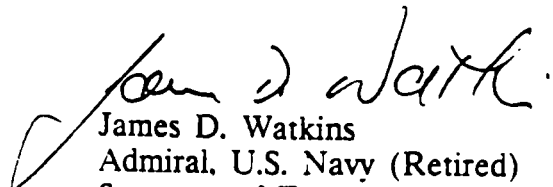

I am writing to express my deep concern regarding the recent threat of nuclear attack on the Republic of Armenia.

As you are well aware, On November 13th, during a speech before the Musavat Party Congress, Azerbaijani Interior Minister, Iskander Gamidov, threatened Armenia with nuclear attack. Interior Minister Gamidov warned, "unless the Armenians come to their senses," he would authorize the use of nuclear weapons against the capital of Armenia.

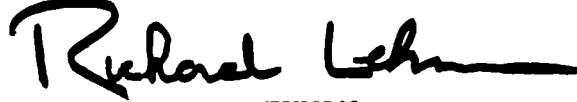
In light of this highly provocative statement, I recommend that the United States immediately contact President Boris Yeltsin and impress upon him the need for a thorough investigation into Azerbaijan's offensive nuclear capabilities. If such an investigation reveals that Azerbaijan indeed has nuclear weapons, we should urge President Yeltsin to remove such weapons from Azerbaijani soil. Until such steps are taken, Azerbaijan's nuclear threat will further destabilize this most volatile region and may lead to a tragic escalation of this conflict.

The United States must ensure that the collapse of the Soviet Union does not lead to the proliferation of nuclear weapons in the former republics. We must take the necessary steps to minimize the threat of an all out war so that the republics, such as Armenia, may continue developing their democratic and economic institutions.

Therefore, I firmly believe that the United States must take immediate steps to minimize the threat of nuclear catastrophe by working with President Yeltsin to remove any and all nuclear weapons from Azerbaijan.

I am following this situation closely and I am hopeful that the United States will demonstrate strong leadership in diminishing this serious threat.

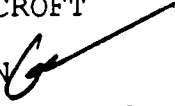

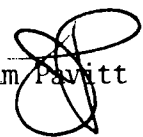

I am writing to express my concern over recent statements by Azerbaijani Interior Minister Iskander Gamidov that they held six nuclear weapons and were willing to use them against Armenia.

The possibility of a nuclear attack by Azerbaijan threatens to further destabilize an area that is already collapsing under civil strife. I urge you to investigate this matter and determine the offensive nuclear capabilities of Azerbaijan.

The United States should make every effort to discover the validity of the Azerbaijan claims and to aid in efforts to gain their removal. The United States should also seek the cooperation of the Russian republic in any efforts to have any remaining nuclear weapons removed from Azerbaijan.

I would also ask that the United States request and receive official confirmation from the government of Azerbaijan that they do not have or intend to use nuclear weapons.
