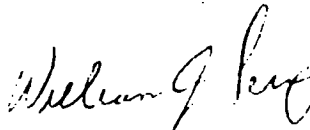

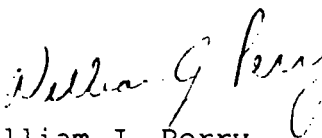
SUBJECT: Air Force General Officer Nomination

This position comes from the Air Force's recent reorganization of Air Force Systems Command. Consequently, the position of Commander, Electronic Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command, should no longer be designated as a position of importance and responsibility. Your signature on this memorandum will constitute your approval.

I also recommend the duties of Commander, Electronic Systems Center, Air Force Materiel Command, be assigned to Major General Charles E. Franklin, and that you nominate him for appointment to the grade of lieutenant general. General Franklin, who is 54 years of age, is currently serving as Program Executive Officer for Tactical/Airlift Systems, Office of the Secretary of the Air Force.

In order to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the proposed assignment, an officer must have demonstrated highly effective performance in a number of senior leadership positions involving research, development, production, and acquisition of command, control, communications, and information systems. 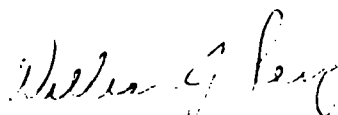

SUBJECT: Army General Officer Nomination

On behalf of the Secretary of Defense, I recommend the assignment of Major General Paul E. Funk, United States Army, as Commanding General, III Corps and Fort Hood, an authorized lieutenant general position, and his nomination for appointment to the grade of lieutenant general. General Funk, who is 53 years of age, is currently serving as Commanding General, United States Army Armor Center and Fort Knox/Commandant, United States Army Armor School. He will succeed Lieutenant General Horace G. Taylor, who is retiring.

In order to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the proposed assignment, an officer must have demonstrated highly effective performance in senior leadership positions. He must be able to train and maintain for short notice commitment a combat ready combined arms force of up to corps size for employment in worldwide contingency plans. He must be capable of conducting contingency operations planning in support of the employment mission while directing the training, maintenance, logistics, personnel support, and quality of life of the command. He must be an effective warplanner, logistician, and information manager and must be familiar with contracting activities. Major General Funk meets these requirements.

This action will not result in the Army exceeding the number of officers authorized to be serving in the grade of lieutenant general. As required by title 10, United States Code, section 601(d)(1), I have attached an evaluation of General Funk's performance in a joint duty assignment from the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
