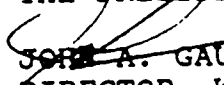

Forwarded for your approval and signature is the nomination of Lieutenant General Leon E. Salomon, United States Army, for appointment to the grade of general and a recommendation for his assignment as Commanding General, United States Army Material Command.

The Secretary of Defense additionally recommends that you defer the mandatory retirement date of General Salomon, from June 30, 1994 to February 29, 1996, under the provisions of title 10, United States Code, section 637(b)(2). This will allow General Salomon to complete the proposed assignment. General Salomon is the best qualified senior Army logistician to replace the incumbent. Your signature on the attached memorandum will constitute your approval of the mandatory retirement date extension.

SUBJECT: General Officer Nomination

I recommend the assignment of Lieutenant General Leon E. Salomon, United States Army, as Commanding General, United States Army Materiel Command (AMC), a position previously designated to carry the grade of general, and his nomination for appointment to the grade of general. General Salomon, age 57, is currently assigned as Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics, United States Army. He will succeed General Jimmy D. Ross, who is retiring.

In order to carry out the duties of the proposed assignment, a general officer must have demonstrated highly effective performance in a number of senior leadership positions, both in his own Service and in the joint arena. He must possess a thorough understanding of the Army's materiel acquisition process, including developing, programming, budgeting, funding, accounting, and all other fiscal and financial activities relating to the management of Army materiel. General Salomon meets these requirements.

I further recommend you defer the mandatory retirement date of General Salomon from June 30, 1994, to February 29, 1996, under the provisions of title 10, United States Code, section 637(b)(2). This will allow General Salomon to complete the proposed assignment. General Salomon is the best qualified senior Army logistician to replace General Ross in AMC. He was previously assigned to AMC as the Deputy Chief of Staff for Readiness where he developed the groundwork for restructuring the command. This nomination and MRD extension enable him to return as the commanding general to continue implementation of these plans. He is completing two years of service as the senior logistician on the Army staff and in this position has gained in-depth appreciation of the restructuring tasks facing the Army and AMC. He is the best prepared officer in the Army for the challenges inherent in commanding AMC. His intimate knowledge of acquisition, downsizing the Army, force changes, and world-wide logistical commitments will result in a smooth transition between commanders. Your signature on this memorandum will constitute your approval of the MRD extension.

This action will not result in the Army exceeding the number of officers authorized to be serving in the grade of general.

As required by title 10, United States Code, section 601(d)(1), I have attached an evaluation of General Salomon from the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff while assigned to joint duty assignments.

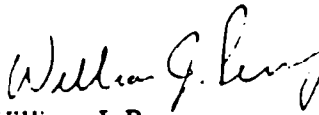

Purpose

To approve the award of the Presidential Medal of Freedom, With Distinction for General Colin Powell.

Background

General Powell will retire from active duty in a ceremony at Fort Myer, Virginia on September 30 at 4:00 p.m. Secretary of Defense Les Aspin has proposed that you present General Powell with the Presidential Medal of Freedom, With Distinction for his more than 35 years of service.

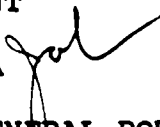

Attached is a note from Rod von Lipsey, forwarded through Mack suggesting a second Medal of Freedom for General Powell.

General Powell received the Medal of Freedom on July 3, 1991 from President Bush (citation attached). He has also received the other high non-combat Defense awards.

The Executive Order establishing the Medal of Freedom makes provision for awarding it "with distinction" as proposed by von Lipsey. Only one person, Ellsworth Bunker, has been awarded two Medals of Freedom, both "with distinction." The first was selected by President Kennedy, but awarded by President Johnson. The second was from President Johnson.

An alternative to the Medal of Freedom is to award the General an additional oak leaf cluster on his Defense Distinguished Service Award, the highest non-combat military award. The General has previously received that medal with two oak leaf clusters.

Defense has also requested that the attached letter be signed so that it can be framed and delivered to the General next week.

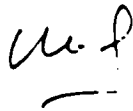

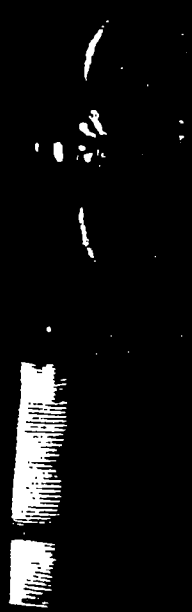

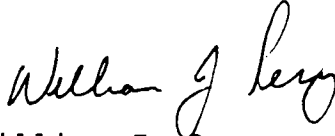

Dear Barney:

I want to respond to your letter of August 3 in which you strongly urged me to reject an alleged proposal from General Lee Butler, the Commander-in-Chief (CINC) of Strategic Command, calling for the United States to aim nuclear weapons at Third World countries. You cited this reported suggestion as an example of military leaders looking for a substitute for Cold War activity because they find it in their institutional interest to do so.

I want to assure you that General Butler has made no such nuclear targeting proposal. Nonetheless, General Butler and his colleagues at the other combatant commands are seized with the challenge of thinking about effective means for dealing with the new dangers and opportunities the United States, its allies and friends face in the post-Cold War world, including the threat posed by the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction. No one appreciates more than the CINCs the importance of reshaping our fighting forces and military strategy to meet today's dangers to our security, particularly as reductions in defense expenditures continue. All of this planning, though, takes place within the parameters of U.S. policy on the "first use" of nuclear weapons, as articulated by then Secretary Vance in 1978: "the United States will not use nuclear weapons against any non-nuclear-weapons state party to the NPT or any comparable internationally binding commitment not to acquire nuclear explosive devices, except in the case of an attack on the United States, its territories or armed forces, or its allies, by such a state allied to a nuclear-weapons state or associated with a nuclear-weapons state in carrying out or sustaining the attack."

I am told that the confusion about General Butler's views on this subject stems from General Butler's being misquoted in a February 25 article in the New York Times. In any event, I am confident that our senior military commanders will continue to work with Secretary Aspin to reorient our military strategy and forces to guarantee the future security of the United States, and not seek to preserve Cold War institutions.

Dear Mr. President:

You received a letter on the letterhead of Boston Mobilization for Survival on June 29, 1993, signed by wide variety of peace oriented organizations. They were writing to object to the proposal of General Lee Butler and others at the Strategic Command for aiming nuclear weapons at Third World nations. Given the priority we should be giving to the principle of nuclear non-proliferation and the negative effects such a targeting would have on our ability to achieve that principle; given the lack of any military necessity for such targeting given America's overwhelming conventional superiority; and given the moral implications of this proposal, I strongly urge you to make it very clear to the Strategic Command that you have no interest in such a proposal.

As you know, many of those who strongly supported you were very gratified when you overruled those in the military who were pressing you to break the nuclear test ban. I believe this is a similar example of a situation in which military leaders are seeking to find some substitutes for cold war activity, not because our national security justifies it but because it is in their institutional interest. I strongly urge you to act as decisively in the interest of a peaceful world now as you did when you said no to nuclear tests.
