SUBJECT: Replies to President Clinton's October 15 letter to Counterparts on Support for Russian Involvement in the Space Station

On October 15, President Clinton wrote to his counterparts in Canada, Japan, and the European Space Agency member states (Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Sweden, and the United Kingdom) participating in the Space Station program asking for their support of Russian participation in the Space Station program. To date, four replies have been received (Belgium, Denmark, Germany, and Italy). We expect others.

No Presidential replies are needed to these letters at this time because they are simply conveying expressions of support which the President asked for and which we are seeing made manifest in the actions of the government and cooperating agency officials with whom we are dealing on this issue.

A second Presidential letter making clear our desire to proceed with inviting the Russians into the Space Station partnership is under consideration at the White House, and we are taking action to insure that individual drafts take account of the replies received from counterparts by that time.

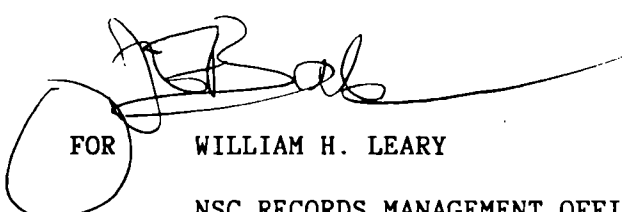

Mr. President,

Thank you for your letter of October 15 in which you request our support for Russian participation in the International Space Station Programme.

The Netherlands Government welcomes this initiative. Involving Russia as an equal partner in this international programme will contribute to peaceful use of outer space and foster global scientific and technological advances.

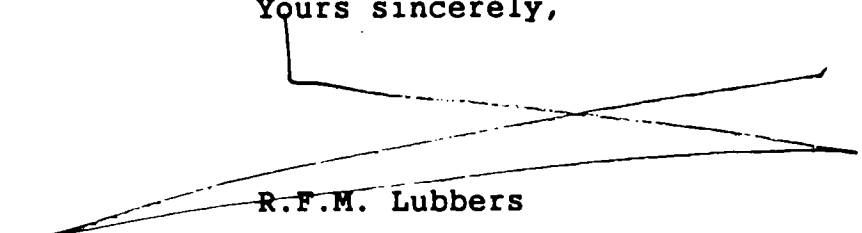
Russia has a long tradition of successful space flight. Russian spacecraft and launch technology are of reliable quality. Moreover, Russia has significant experience with permanently-manned space flight. The International Space Station Programme therefore stands to benefit from Russian participation, not least from the technological viewpoint.

In the coming months, the United States and its partners have to examine how the enlarged Space Station programme is affecting existing co-operative space activities. The Netherlands Government is particularly concerned with external robotics. Following earlier European decisions on co-operation with Russia, the European Space Agency ESA, together with its Russia counterpart RKA, has worked out a plan to use the European External Robotic Arm (ERA) on the Russian MIR-II station.

We trust that the United States will, given the prominent part it plays in the Space Station Programme, help ensure a role for the European robotics effort in the new Global Space Station.

I can ensure you that, at the forthcoming intergovernmental meeting on the Space Station Programme, which is to be held in Washington DC on 6 December 1993, the Netherlands will take a positive stance on Russian participation.

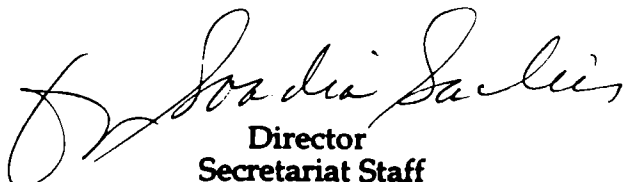

Dear Mr. President,

Thank you very much for your letter of 15 October 1993 concerning potential Russian involvement in the space station.

Let me assure you that the Danish Government fully supports the efforts to involve Russia in the space station programme. Cooperation with the Russians in space is of great importance both politically and scientifically.

At the Space Intergovernmental Agreement Coordinating meeting in Paris on October 16 partners issued a joint statement on potential Russian involvement in the space station and agreed a text defining the next steps to be taken. The Danish Government finds these measures as very important steps towards a possible Russian partnership in the international space station programme.

Through our membership of the Europaen Space Agency the Danish Government will see to that this project succeeds.

INDEED, YOUR LETTER OF NOVEMBER 18 WENT ON TO EXPRESS THE HOPE THAT A SUCCESSFUL OUTCOME COULD BE ACHIEVED IN THE URUGUAY ROUND. I, TOO, RECALL THE USEFUL DISCUSSIONS YOU AND I HELD ON THIS SUBJECT DURING DENMARK'S EC PRESIDENCY, AND I SHARE YOUR CONCERN THAT WE NOT LET THIS HISTORIC EFFORT FAIL. THE COMING WEEK WILL BE DECISIVE. THE UNITED STATES AND THE EUROPEAN UNION HAVE MADE EXTRAORDINARY PROGRESS OVER THE LAST FEW DAYS IN ADDRESSING THE ISSUES THAT SEPARATE US. WITH SUFFICIENT POLITICAL WILL ON BOTH SIDES, I AM CONFIDENT THAT WE CAN BRIDGE THE REMAINING GAPS. YOUR FIRM SUPPORT IN THESE AND OTHER AREAS SIMPLY CONFIRMS THE FACT THAT OUR BILATERAL RELATIONSHIP CONTINUES TO BE MARKED BY A CONSIDERABLE CONVERGENCE OF VIEWS. THAT RELATIONSHIP, I WANT TO EMPHASIZE, REMAINS AS IMPORTANT AS EVER TO THE UNITED STATES. WE BOTH FACE NUMEROUS CHALLENGES IN THE POST-COLD WAR ERA, AND DENMARK'S ROLE AS A MEMBER OF BOTH NATO AND THE EUROPEAN UNION MAKES YOUR COUNSEL ALL THE MORE VALUABLE TO US IN OUR CONSULTATIONS ON POLITICAL, SECURITY AND ECONOMIC ISSUES.

IN THAT REGARD, I ALSO WANT TO ASSURE YOU THAT, IN SENDING EDWARD ELSON TO DENMARK AS THE UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR, I AM CONFIDENT OUR ALREADY GOOD RELATIONS WILL CONTINUE TO IMPROVE. THROUGHOUT A SUCCESSFUL BUSINESS CAREER AND A LIFETIME OF PUBLIC AND COMMUNITY SERVICE, AMBASSADOR ELSON HAS DEMONSTRATED THE TALENTS THAT ARE CRUCIAL TO MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING. I KNOW THAT IN THE DIALOGUE HE WILL BE ESTABLISHING WITH YOU AND FOREIGN MINISTER PETERSEN, AMBASSADOR ELSON WILL WELCOME HEARING DENMARK'S CONCERNS AND SPECIAL INSIGHTS WITH REGARD TO THE ISSUES WE FACE TOGETHER.

AGAIN, I AM GRATEFUL FOR YOUR EXPRESSIONS OF SUPPORT, AND LOOK FORWARD TO SEEING YOU AT THE NATO SUMMIT IN JANUARY.
