SUBJECT: Washington Post Article on Army Equipment Shortages

You annotated a copy of a December 14 Washington Post article entitled "Army Study Warns of Possible Equipment Shortages" asking for amplification. The article, written three weeks ago, refers to a study that was prepared over a month earlier (in early November) to help the Army present its case for a larger share of the Defense budget. Army Chief of Staff, General Sullivan, and several congressmen have voiced concern that we may be downsizing the Army below the minimum level required to execute the two Major Regional Contingency (MRC) strategy outlined in the Bottom-Up Review.

The Army, along with the other Services, is being asked to execute very painful cuts in its modernization accounts. In November, Secretary Aspin provided some fiscal relief to the Army after it presented its case based, in part, on the analysis outlined in this article. Had the Secretary not increased its share of the budget, the Army would have had to terminate 57 programs over the FY95-99 FYDP and reduce 77 others. The programs affected range from the Multiple Launch Rocket System to harbor tugs used by the Corps of Engineers on inland waterways. General Sullivan acknowledges the \$2 billion relief in the FY95 budget topline awarded by the Secretary (at the expense of the other Services). Nevertheless, he remains concerned that there are still important programs that remain underfunded in the outyears. This is the case with all of the Services and is an issue that must be dealt with on an ongoing basis.

In your meeting with the Joint Chiefs of Staff on Monday, several of the Service chiefs referred to this issue when they noted that the two nearly simultaneous MRC strategy remains viable, but that they hope that if there are two MRCs before the end of the decade one of the two is a "little" war if the other is a "big" MRC. Until the various force enhancements and "enablers" come on line in several years (e.g., improved airlift and new precision-guided munitions) there is a 'trough' where our capabilities to fight two "big" MRCs at once would be stressed.

Army Study Warns of Possible Equipment Shortages

Ability to Sustain Combat Forces Abroad in a Crisis Could Be Undermined, Report Says

A secret Army study has warned of a looming shortage in the unglamorous essentials of modern war—such as fuel trucks, chemical weapons detectors, medevac helicopters and mine-clearing equipment—that it says could undermine the Army's ability to deploy and sustain combat forces in an extended crisis.

The study says, moreover, that spending cuts will force the Army to concentrate its limited modernization funds on those active-duty combat divisions slated to respond first to crises abroad. Follow-on forces—including other active divisions, National Guard and reserve units—will have to make do with older weapons, becoming in effect a second-class Army incompatible with the better-equipped "contingency corps," the study says.

Perhaps most significant, the study says, future logistics and transportation capabilities will be "inadequate for force projection [and] sustainability" of the follow-on forces. The study predicts shortages of such products as fuel trucks, portable pipelines, amphibious barges for unloading gear on undeveloped coastlines and even scenarios for sending bar codes on ammunition shipping containers.

In that regard, the classified study by the Army's Training and Doctrine Command challenges the Clinton administration, which has pledged to preserve enough combat power to fight and win two nearly simultaneous regional wars. Until now, the Army has largely gone along with post-Cold War spending cuts, but the tone of the new study suggests that resistance within the service may be hardening.

"I think the pain is really starting to show," said an Army officer who is familiar with the study's conclusions.

That we're starting to come apart, that you're not able to equip the force with what it would take to be "ready" across the board.

Independent analysts suggest that the service's problem is not so much fiscal as structural. In-

stead of trying to preserve a force of 50 active divisions and roughly 500,000 soldiers, they argue, the

service should accept a smaller force for fully modernized hardware, sufficient funds for training and operations. The Army has

shrunk from 790,000 troops in 1990 to about 570,000 today.

Senior Pentagon officials, for their part, note that spending cuts are bound to be unpopular with the services and suggest that the Army has not gone as far as either the Navy or Air Force in paring unneeded infrastructure and bureaucracy. "These are self-inflicted wounds," said a senior Defense Department official who requested anonymity.

Maj. Mark Samich, an Army spokesman, described the study as a "subjective analysis" that does not necessarily reflect the views of the Army chief of staff, Gen. Gordon R. Sullivan, whose public statements

on the future of the Army have been somewhat more sanguine.

The study, however, appears to reflect widely held views within the Army leadership. Contributors included commanders of the service's major combat schools, planners in the Army operations directorate and the military's regional commanders, among others. The study was sent to Army headquarters in mid-November and is due to be completed on Feb. 15, according to a schedule furnished with the draft.

The study attempts to forecast the effects of the Clinton administration's planned spending cuts on Army research, development and

aquisition programs from 1996 through 2010. The study was first described in a defense-industry newsletter, Inside the Army; a draft copy was obtained independently by The Washington Post.

The study is generally optimistic on the prospects for the so-called contingency corps—such as the 82nd Airborne Division—describing it as "the most technologically advanced, most capable five-division combat force in the world." But the study is somewhat less sanguine when it comes to the Army's other main components, categorized as Force Package One (mostly units based in Europe and Korea); Force Package Three (U.S.-based divisions not in the contingency corps); and Force Package Four (National Guard and Army Reserve units).

Force Package Two, for example, is "losing [its] close-combat edge" and becoming "incompatible" with the contingency corps; Force Package Three is "not maintaining land-force dominance" and is "difficult to project and sustain"; Force Package Four is "not maintaining the edge in any area. Force will have little relevance except in operations other than war or total mobilization," according to the study.

The study also forecast a number of across-the-board deficiencies in the Army's modernization plans. These include funding shortfalls for equipment to detect chemical weapons attacks, computers and scanners to keep track of material and supplies, floating cranes for unloading cargo and even an improved heavy-duty towing vehicle for tanks and other machinery.

Some defense analysts suggest that the Army's anxiety over looming equipment shortages is an inevitable byproduct of the administration's two-war strategy. That strategy, they contend, requires the Army to retain more force structure than it can afford, siphoning resources that would be better spent on modernization, training and other key aspects of military readiness.

Sullivan is being asked to fit a five-pound force structure into a three-pound budget bag," said Andy Krepinovich, a former Pentagon strategist who now directs the non-profit Defense Budget Project. "What that means is you cut procurement below necessary replacement levels, you cut operations and training and erode readiness, or you cut research and development and eat away at the seed corn of your potential."

SUBJECT: Letter from Senator Lieberman Re. Sale of M1A2
Tanks to Sweden

Purpose

To respond to a letter from Senator Lieberman asking the Administration to do all that it can to advance the sale of M1A2 tanks to Sweden.

Background

Sweden is planning to upgrade its armored forces with a major purchase of main battle tanks. The Swedish government has narrowed the competition to the American M1A2 and the German Leopard tanks. Senator Lieberman, citing the job implications of the sale, urges you to do everything you can to persuade the Swedish government to purchase the American tank. He also thanks you for bringing this matter up with the Swedish Prime Minister during his visit to the White House.

The Swedish purchase of a main battle tank is tied to their plan also to purchase 200 used tanks. Over the Christmas holidays, Deputy Secretary of Defense William Perry wrote his Swedish counterpart with a new lower price on used M1A1 tanks in an effort to sweeten the deal. Your proposed response to Senator Lieberman expresses your strong support for the sale and informs him that your Administration is doing everything it can to close the deal successfully.

Dear Mr. President:

On November 19th I joined twenty-five of my colleagues in writing you to ask for your personal involvement, and that of key members of your Administration, with the government of Sweden. As you know, Sweden is on the verge of selecting a new main battle tank for its Army and the U.S. M1A2 tank is one of the principal competitors.

I have been told that you spoke to the Swedish Prime Minister about the competition during his visit to the White House and Deputy Secretary of Defense Perry raised the issue during his recent visit to Sweden. Further, I have seen press reports that Secretary of Defense Aspin has written his counterpart in Stockholm about the competition. I greatly appreciate your personal involvement and your efforts to have the Defense Department become actively involved. In light of the political efforts being mounted by our European competitors and the thousands of jobs at stake in the U.S., these were critical efforts. Reportedly, the ongoing discussions between the U.S. bidder and the Ministry of Defense have been serious and constructive. My understanding is that the Prime Minister is expected to make the final decision some time in January.

I believe it would be helpful if the Administration would continue to be engaged with the Swedish government on this issue since we can be sure that French and German officials are in frequent contact with their Swedish counterparts. The focus of the issue will shift at the beginning of the year from the Ministry of Defense to the Prime Minister's office. As we approach the point where the political decision will be made in early January, your support for this superb tank and American industry, reiterated to the Swedish Prime Minister at the proper time, can only be helpful.

Again, thank you for your interest and help. Because of your continued support, the M1A2 sale can be a victory for your proposed national export strategy and a signal that your Administration, unlike its predecessors, plans to take export promotion very seriously.

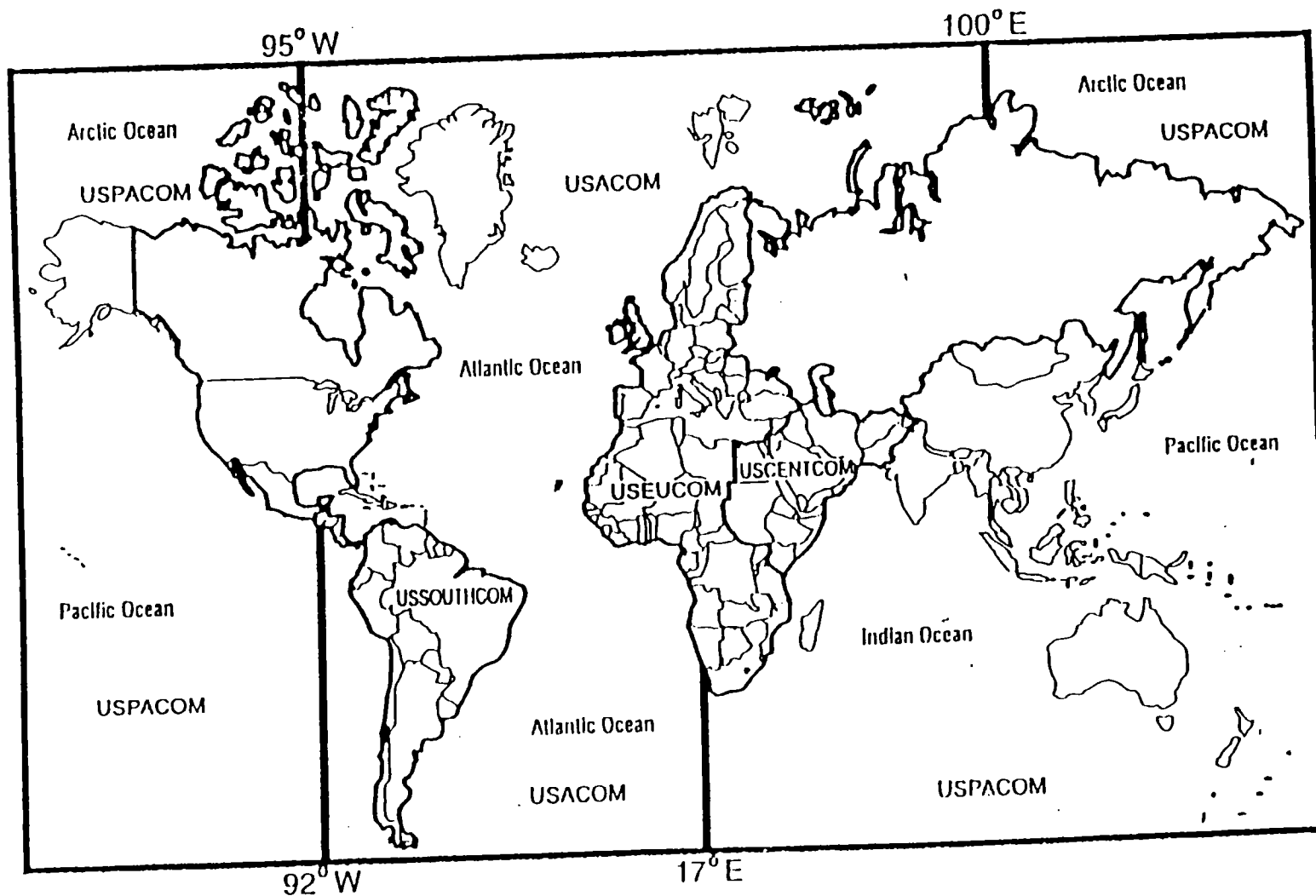

It is now scheduled to take place May 1 through August 13 and will involve approximately 450 U.S. personnel.
