Dear Mr. President:

We write regarding the Administration's recent decision to approve a request by Switzerland to retransfer U.S.-origin spent nuclear fuel to the United Kingdom's Thermal Oxide Reprocessing Plant (THORP), where plutonium would be separated from the spent fuel. We believe this approval is inconsistent with the Administration's stated policy on nuclear nonproliferation.

Last fall, you put forth a broad policy statement on nonproliferation and export controls. In the section on fissile material, the statement said: "the U.S. will seek to eliminate where possible the accumulation of highly-enriched uranium or plutonium." In an October 20 letter to Congress, you wrote: "The United States does not encourage the civil use of plutonium. Its continued production is not justified on either economic or national security grounds, and its accumulation creates serious proliferation and security dangers."

We understand, however, that it is also the Administration's policy not to breach existing U.S. commitments with Western Europe and Japan regarding their civil plutonium programs. These goals are not mutually exclusive. We believe the United States can work cooperatively with its allies to develop alternatives to the accumulation of plutonium within the constraints of our bilateral agreements. Moreover, the U.S. has no legal commitments in the case of Switzerland. Unlike our nuclear cooperation agreements with Japan and EURATOM, the U.S. has case-by-case consent rights with Switzerland for spent fuel retransfers and plutonium use.

Approval of the Swiss request is, we believe, inconsistent with the Administration's stated policy of seeking to eliminate where possible the accumulation of plutonium. The retransfer will add 420 kg of plutonium to global stockpiles. While the Swiss pose little or no risk of proliferation themselves, their plutonium program will undercut U.S. efforts to prevent plutonium accumulation in regions of greater proliferation concern, such as the Korean peninsula. Additionally, U.S. approval of the Swiss request is likely to be seen as approval of the THORP facility, which would vastly

increase the accumulation of plutonium--by 60 tons over the next ten years. This contradicts the Administration's stated policy that it does not encourage the civil use of plutonium abroad.

Two authoritative recent studies have emphasized the security risks and economic costs of civilian plutonium use. We find it highly significant that in its recently released report, "Management and Disposition of Excess Weapons Plutonium," the National Academy of Sciences went beyond its mandate and considered civilian plutonium as well. It did so because "the difference in proliferation risk posed by separated weapons-grade plutonium and separated reactor-grade plutonium is small in comparison to the difference between separated plutonium of any grade and unseparated material in spent fuel."

The RAND report released last November was even more explicit about the hazards of civil plutonium: "The widespread use of plutonium will greatly increase the risk of diversion by terrorist groups and seizure by host nations. There is little justification for introducing plutonium massively into the economy, when the benefits are nonexistent but the proliferation risk is real." To the RAND authors, the policy implications were clear: "The United States should urge other countries to join in activities to terminate or drastically scale back plutonium separation and use."

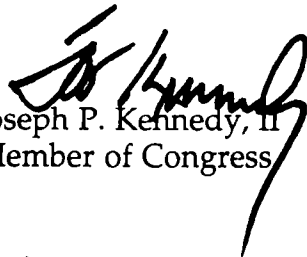
Any viable nuclear nonproliferation policy must include efforts to find alternatives to the separation and use of civil plutonium. We urge you to withhold approval for any further requests for retransfer and reprocessing of U.S.-origin spent fuel while working cooperatively with our allies to develop such alternatives.

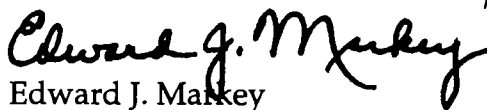

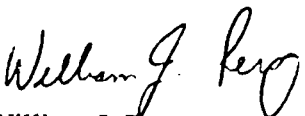

The primary topic that Secretary Perry and General Shalikashvili would like to discuss is military plans in the event of expanded U.S. involvement in Bosnia. We believe that this topic, while important, is too narrow for this meeting and does not engage the President in the broader range of issues that the CINCs must address. We recommend that each CINC spend approximately 5 minutes describing his major concerns followed by a short question and answer period. We would provide the President with a list of questions to ask each CINC on issues in his area of responsibility.

RECOMMENDATION

That you forward the memorandum at Tab I to the President.
