Senator Mitchell has written the President (Tab B) requesting that he express his support of the defense export loan guarantee program provided in PL 103-160, the Fiscal Year 1994 Defense Authorization Act. This letter is similar to the one recently received from Senator Kempthorne, et al (Action #1734).

During debate on the defense authorization and appropriations bills last year the subject of a defense export loan guarantee program was a major issue. Senator Kempthorne's Amendment proposed a \$25 million (for \$1 billion in loan guarantees) program. As stated in his letter, Senator Mitchell sponsored an amendment requiring NSC review of each proposed sale.

While various positions were argued within the Executive Branch, the official Administration position was opposed to this proposal. This opposition was procedural, based upon the fact that we had not yet completed our arms transfer review and did not want to prejudice its outcome with regard to the export loan guarantee option. The final outcome on the Hill was that the \$25 million program was authorized, but made contingent on (1) appropriations (which were not provided) and (2) a certification by the President within 180 days of enactment that the Administration supported the program.

The Administration position on this issue is being considered as part of the PRD-41 Conventional Arms Transfer Policy review currently underway. There are still diverging opinions on the use and form of such a loan guarantee program that must be resolved in the interagency process. We expect this review to be completed in April.

SUBJECT: Letter to Senator Mitchell, RE: Defense Export  
Loan Guarantee Authority

Purpose

To respond to Senator Mitchell's request that you express your support for the defense export loan guarantee program provided in PL 103-160, the Fiscal Year 1994 Defense Authorization Act.

Background

This issue, led by the Kempthorne Amendment proposing \$25 million (for \$1 billion in defense export loan guarantees) was hotly contested during last year's defense authorization and appropriations bill debates. As part of this debate, Senator Mitchell's proposed an amendment requiring National Security Council review of each proposed sale.

The final legislative outcome on the Hill last year was that the \$25 million was authorized, but made contingent on (1) subsequent appropriations for this purpose (which were not provided) and (2) a certification by you within 180 days of enactment of the defense authorization bill that the Administration supported the program.

We are currently reviewing our position on this issue as part of the PRD-41 Conventional Arms Transfer Policy review. We expect this review to be completed in April.

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing in regard to the Administration's use of the defense export loan guarantee authority provided in PL 103-160, the Fiscal Year 1994 National Defense Authorization Act.

As you know, the sale of certain U.S. defense products and services to our closest allies can support U.S. foreign policy, defense and economic security objectives. Defense sales to these allies can also help maintain critical elements of the industrial base and partially offset the loss of U.S. defense jobs and unique skills while programs are implemented to assist the difficult but important process of defense transition. However, the government export financing available for the sale of European defense products and services has placed U.S. defense companies at a competitive disadvantage.

Last year the Senate supported the establishment of a defense export loan guarantee program available only for financing sales to our closest allies -- NATO, Australia, Israel, South Korea and Japan. I had concerns about the arms control and proliferation implications of such a program, and consequently sponsored an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act which requires the National Security Council to review each proposed sale for which loan guarantees are requested to determine if it is in accord with broader U.S. policies on conventional arms sales and non-proliferation goals. This amendment, along with other restrictions, was included in the final version of the loan guarantee authorization.

Giving U.S. companies and their workers the ability to compete more effectively for defense sales to our closest allies can advance important national policy objectives and complement defense conversion and reinvestment initiatives. Before proceeding with the loan guarantee program, however, you must first determine whether it is consistent with the objectives of the Arms Export Control Act and U.S. policy regarding conventional arms sales and nonproliferation goals. If you conclude that the program meets these criteria, I encourage your early expression of support for implementation of the defense export loan guarantee program.

"(c) **SEIZURE OF MANUFACTURING PLANTS UPON NONCOMPLIANCE.**—In time of war or when war is imminent, the President, through the Secretary of Defense, may take immediate possession of any plant that is equipped to manufacture, or that in the opinion of the Secretary of Defense is capable of being readily transformed into a plant for manufacturing, arms or ammunition, parts thereof, or necessary supplies for the armed forces if the person or industry owning or operating the plant, or the responsible head thereof, refuses—

"(1) to give precedence to the order as prescribed in subsection (b);

"(2) to manufacture the kind, quantity, or quality of arms or ammunition, parts thereof, or necessary supplies, as ordered by the Secretary; or

"(3) to furnish them at a reasonable price as determined by the Secretary."

"(d) **USE OF SEIZED PLANT.**—The President, through the Secretary of Defense, may manufacture products that are needed in time of war or when war is imminent, in any plant that is seized under subsection (c).
