Attached at Tab I is a proposed memorandum to the Executive Secretary, Department of Defense, concurring in military exercise DYNAMIC GUARD 94. At Tab II Defense recommends approval and State concurs.

DYNAMIC GUARD 94 is a NATO air, sea and amphibious exercise in Turkey, Greece and the Aegean and Mediterranean Seas from September 26 - October 16. The exercise reinforces the U.S. commitment to NATO's southern flank and consists of live-fire and command post exercises.

The critical cancellation date is August 24, 1994.

BRIEFING SHEET

- I. Organization**
- NAME:** Association of Military Surgeons of the United States. **ACRONYM:** A US
- A.** Organized in 1891. Incorporated by Public Law No. 39, U.S. Congress, 1903.
- B.** A Medical Health Collegium devoted to the advancement of all aspects of Federal medicine - professional, scientific, educational, and administrative, within the Federal health agencies.
- C.** Maintains liaison with the Department of Defense, the Military Medical Departments, the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Public Health Service, the American Medical Association, the Society of Medical Consultants to the Armed Forces, the Council of Military Organizations, and the Military Coalition.
- D. Officers:**
Constitution and Bylaws, Article V, Section I, the officers shall be as follows: a President, a First Vice-President (who shall be President-Elect and shall succeed the President), and a Second Vice-President, all of whom shall be elected from and to represent in rotation the constituent services. The Federal Medical Chief of each constituent service normally would serve, in rotational order, in the positions of Second Vice-President, First Vice-President, and President.
- E.** The Executive Council consists of these officers and other representatives of the constituent services, and the chairmen of the following sections: AMA Section Council on Federal and Military Medicine - Chapters Section - Dental Section - Auxiliary Section - Medical Service Corps Section - Nursing Section - Pharmacy Section - Health Care Provider Student Section - Sustaining Membership Section - Veterinary Medicine Section - Optometry Section.
- F.** Organization: The medical services of the following agencies form the constituency of the Association: U.S. Army - U.S. Army Reserve - U.S. Navy - U.S. Navy Reserve - U.S. Air Force - U.S. Air Force Reserve - Department of Veterans Affairs - U.S. Public Health Service - Army National Guard - Air National Guard.
- II. Objectives**
- The objectives of the Association are to advance the knowledge of Federal Medicine and to increase the efficiency of its membership by mutual association and by the consideration of matters pertaining to constituent services both in and war. The Association is dedicated to the fulfillment of the following purposes:
- improve health care by providing a forum for discussion of common ideas and problems and by providing continuing education for its members.
 - contribute to the improvement of health care in the nation through policy study and appropriate recommendations.
 - represent the Association to the Executive and Legislative Branches, to national professional organizations, and to the public.
 - improve the effectiveness, cohesiveness, and esprit de corps of the Federal Health Care Services.
- III. Membership**
- A. Classification:**
- Members shall be classified as Active, Student, Life, Ex-Officio, Honorary, and Sustaining.
 - Only Active, Student, Life, and Ex-Officio members are entitled to vote and to hold office.
 - Persons and industrial firms become members only after approval by the Executive Council as defined in the Bylaws.
 - The following are eligible to achieve Active membership:
 - Those who are, or have been at any time, commissioned officers (either Regular, Reserve, or National Guard) or GS-9 and above civilians in the constituent agencies, including comparable positions in the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS) and Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA).
 - Officers of the military medical services of other nations.
 - Individuals who are, or have been, medical consultants to the Federal Medical Services.
 - Student Membership:** Students enrolled in the Health Professional Scholarship Program (HPSP), Medical, Optometry, Dental, Veterinary-Army (MODV), Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU), ROTC, or other Federally funded students in medical, nursing, dental, etc. school may apply for student membership and take advantage of all the benefits of Active membership. Graduate, post-graduate, doctoral, etc. pursuits *do not* entitle one to student membership.
 - Life memberships may be conferred upon Active members who have paid dues continuously for 30 years or upon payment of 50% of the sum of *rs'*d payment.

REQUEST: September Summit WWII Commemoration

PURPOSE: For Presidents Clinton and Yeltsin to
jointly honor the U.S. merchant seamen
who made the dangerous WWII convoy runs
across the North Atlantic to Murmansk
and Archangel.

BACKGROUND: During our planning for the D-Day 50th
anniversary events, the President
expressed regret that France had not
included Russia in those commemorations.
On September 27, 1944, a U.S. convoy was
navigating treacherous U-boat infested
waters on a return leg of a New York -
Archangel convoy. On September 29,
1944, a U-boat sunk a U.S. Liberty ship
in the convoy, the SS EDWARD H.
CROCKETT, killing the First Assistant
Engineer. Between 1941 and 1945, these
convoys were crucial in providing the
Soviet Union with the equipment and
supplies it needed to remain in the war.
The Russian Government has approved the
award of a special medal to U.S.
veterans of the northern convoys. This
event affords an opportunity to
underscore the U.S. alliance with Russia
during the war and honor the U.S.
veterans who manned these convoys.
