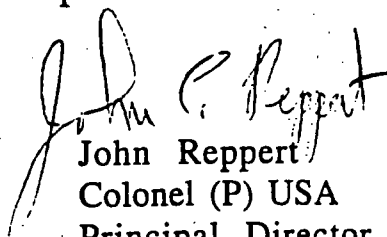

Defense is sharply critical of the BENS report, citing errors of fact and methodology. Some examples:

-- Two bases the report says are staying open are in fact closing completely.

-- In ten cases the report alleges that we are "reopening" a base scheduled for closure when all we are doing is placing a Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) facility in one building at that location.

-- The report arrives at its \$15 billion estimate by including payroll costs for functions that will have to be performed somewhere, independent of the closure.

-- Finally, almost one-third of the \$15 billion in "lost savings" is attributable to Federal decisions to use two former bases for non-defense purposes: (1) retaining NASA's Ames Research Facility at the former Moffet Naval Air Station and (2) transferring parts of the Presidio Army base in California to the National Parks Service. NASA has no plans to close Ames, one of its premier research facilities, and the Presidio land transfer was mandated by Congress.

We believe the base closure process is working well and have confidence that projected savings will in fact be realized. We were particularly disappointed that the report took no note of your July 1993 "five point program" for speeding the economic recovery of communities where military bases are scheduled to close.

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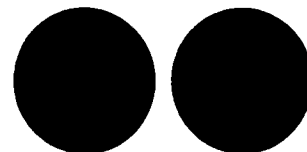

The Defense Policy & Arms Control Office has a number of SP's pending. They include a master list of WWII Commemoration Events through V-J Day next November at which NSC is recommending POTUS participation, a lunch hosted by POTUS for the 25 admirals and generals who supported him during the campaign, a proposed visit to three military bases in California where the President could observe training and field exercises, and the medal ceremony for Fisher and St. John. In addition, we have established a pattern of quarterly POTUS meetings with the CINCs and Joint Chiefs, as well as POTUS participation at Arlington Cemetery on Memorial and Veterans Days, all of which should be continued in 1995/1996. The only item this office would now add to this list in response to Erskine's request would be a POTUS trip out to Andrews in May to inspect the Boeing 747 National Airborne Operations Center (formerly called the National Emergency Airborne Command Post - or "NEACP") to see first-hand how we have successfully broadened the mission of what was before called the "doomsday plane" to now include support of FEMA in catastrophic disaster relief missions. FEMA will be using the NAOC in support of a major hurricane exercise in May, and there has been a long-standing request from Defense that the President acquaint himself with the capabilities of this aircraft..

Purpose

To thank General Hoar for his years of military service to the country and for the contributions he made as Commander in Chief, Central Command.

Background

General Hoar retired in August after 37 years of commissioned Marine Corps service. During that period he served in a variety of positions, beginning with command of a platoon of Marines, and culminating as Commander in Chief of the Central Command. During these last three years at Central Command, he was responsible for the planning and conduct of all US military activity in a 19 state region encompassing the Middle East, Persian Gulf, Horn of Africa, and South Asia. It is largely through his foresight that we were able to respond to the current Gulf crisis in such a rapid and smooth fashion.

You asked about news articles concerning a recent Business Executives for National Security (BENS) report critical of the base closing process. BENS charges that of the 67 bases or facilities slated for closure by the first three base closure rounds, "over one third never closed or have quietly reopened under a new name or function," at a cost to the Federal Government of \$15 billion over five years.

Defense is sharply critical of the BENS report, citing errors of fact and methodology. Some examples:

-- Two bases the report says are staying open are in fact closing completely.

-- In ten cases the report alleges that we are "reopening" a base scheduled for closure when all we are doing is placing a Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) facility in one building at that location.

-- The report arrives at its \$15 billion estimate by including payroll costs for functions that will have to be performed somewhere, independent of the closure.

-- Finally, almost one-third of the \$15 billion in "lost savings" is attributable to Federal decisions to use two former bases for non-defense purposes: (1) retaining NASA's Ames Research Facility at the former Moffet Naval Air Station and (2) transferring parts of the Presidio Army base in California to the National Parks Service. NASA has no plans to close Ames, one of its premier research facilities, and the Presidio land transfer was mandated by Congress.

We believe the base closure process is working well and have confidence that projected savings will in fact be realized. We were particularly disappointed that the report took no note of your July 1993 "five point program" for speeding the economic recovery of communities where military bases are scheduled to close.

I understand that you were briefed on September 16, 1994 concerning options for our strategic nuclear forces. Like you, I believe that the size and mix of our strategic nuclear forces are of fundamental importance to the national security of the United States.

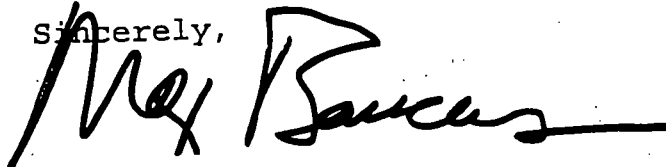
I have talked personally with Secretary Perry on several occasions about this issue. During our discussions, I made it clear that I believe we need land-based ICBM's as part of our strategic nuclear forces. As I explained, and as you are well aware, ICBM's provide unique capabilities for our nuclear deterrent posture. I believe that those capabilities remain as valid today as they did during the height of the Cold War.

In his September 12, 1994 letter to the Secretary of Defense, the Commander-in-Chief of Strategic Command, Admiral Henry G. Chiles, Jr., identified the correct mix for our nuclear forces: 20 B-52H's for strategic war planning, 14 Trident II SSBN's, and 500 Minuteman III's. Admiral Chiles noted that decreasing our ICBM force below 500 missiles will not produce any significant savings in the near-term. Beyond this, he noted that 500 Minuteman III's provide stability in a crisis. His professional judgment and personal responsibility merit special attention.

I believe that Admiral Chiles' views are very much in the interest of our national security. I want to assure you that I will be working in Congress to support this size and mix of our strategic nuclear forces. I therefore strongly urge you to support a force structure including 500 Minuteman III ICBM's.

I am writing to you to express my concern over reports that the Nuclear Posture Review's final recommendations will include a significant reduction in the number of land-based intercontinental ballistic missiles (ICBMs).

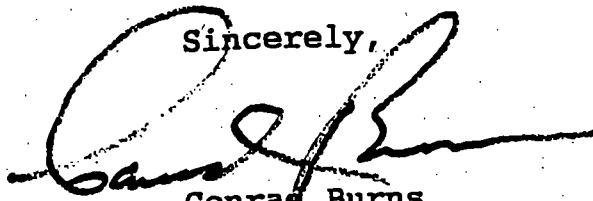
I have written to you previously about the necessity of a strong ICBM component to the Triad, not only because Malmstrom Air Force Base in my state is the home to Minuteman missiles, but also because ICBMs are a cost-effective, strategically important deterrent. We need to look no further than the situation in North Korea to see that continued vigilance is necessary.

I am also concerned that the US may be considering further reductions in its total number of warheads at this time. The US has made great gains in meeting the goals set forth in START I. The former Soviet Union, on the other hand, has not. I believe the former Soviet Union should make additional progress toward meeting its original commitment first.

I realize the challenges that you face in allocating scarce defense resources. Frankly, however, I think we are reducing our nation's defenses much too quickly. Despite the continuing drawdown of forces and reductions in defense budgets, our military continues to be called upon for peacekeeping and humanitarian missions. There are signs of strain already.

Mr. President, in considering the several options before you, I would strongly encourage you to maintain the number of land-based ICBMs at 500.

Background

Secretary Perry and General Shalikashvili recommend in a memorandum at Tab B that you authorize a call-up of individuals and units of the Selected Reserves in conjunction with the on-going Iraq contingency. While the statute being invoked authorizes an ordering to active duty of up to 200,000 reservists, Defense is planning to call up only a first increment of about 11,000 needed for transportation support activities at this time. The Secretary's memorandum also requests that you delegate to him (and to Secretary Pena for Coast Guard personnel) your authority under Title 10, United States Code, Section 673c to suspend laws regarding the promotion, retirement or separation of certain members of the Armed Forces. A similar delegation of authority was exercised by President Bush during Operation Desert Shield in August, 1990.

Section 2. The authority delegated to the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Transportation by this order may be redelegated and further subdelegated to subordinates who are appointed to their offices by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.

Purpose

To (1) authorize the ordering to active duty for a period of 270 days units and individuals of the Selected Reserve required to conduct or support operational missions around the Arabian Peninsula (2) and delegate to the Secretary of Defense your authority to suspend any laws regarding promotion, retirement or separation of members of the Armed Forces determined to be "essential to national security" pursuant to the 10, United States Code, Section 673c.

Background

Secretary Perry and General Shalikashvili recommend in a memorandum at Tab B that you authorize a call-up of individuals and units of the Selected Reserves in conjunction with the on-going Iraq contingency. While the statute being invoked authorizes an ordering to active duty of up to 200,000 reservists, Defense is planning to call up only a first increment of about 11,000 needed for transportation support activities at this time. The Secretary's memorandum also requests that you delegate to him (and to Secretary Pena for Coast Guard personnel) your authority under Title 10, United States Code, Section 673c to suspend laws regarding the promotion, retirement or separation of certain members of the Armed Forces. A similar delegation of authority was exercised by President Bush during Operation Desert Shield in August, 1990.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

ORDERING THE SELECTED RESERVE OF THE
ARMED FORCES TO ACTIVE DUTY

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including sections 121 and 673b of title 10 of the United States Code, I hereby determine that it is necessary to augment the active armed forces of the United States for the effective conduct of operations in and around the Arabian Peninsula. Further, under the stated authority, I hereby authorize the Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to the Coast Guard when the latter is not operating as a service in the Department of the Navy, to order to active duty units and individual members not assigned to units of the Selected Reserve.

This order is intended only to improve the internal management of the executive branch, and is not intended to create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law by a party against the United States, its agencies, its officers, or any person.

This order shall be published in the Federal Register and
transmitted promptly to the Congress.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

DELEGATING THE PRESIDENT'S AUTHORITY TO SUSPEND
ANY PROVISION OF LAW RELATING TO THE PROMOTION,
RETIREMENT, OR SEPARATION OF MEMBERS
OF THE ARMED FORCES

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including section 673c of title 10 of the United States Code and section 301 of title 3 of the United States Code, I hereby order:

Section 1. The Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to Coast Guard when it is not operating as a service in the Department of the Navy, are hereby designated and empowered to exercise, without the approval, ratification, or other action of the President, the authority vested in the President by section 673c of title 10 of the United States Code: (1) to suspend any provision of law relating to promotion, retirement, or separation applicable to any member of the armed forces determined to be essential to the national security of the United States, and (2) to determine, for the purposes of said section, that members of the armed forces are essential to the national security of the United States.

Section 2. The authority delegated to the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Transportation by this order may be redelegated and further subdelegated to subordinates who are appointed to their offices by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.

Section 3. This order is intended to improve the internal management of the executive branch and is not intended to create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforcement at law by a party against the United States, its agencies, its officers, or any person.
