Dear James:

Thank you for your letter citing the need to do everything possible to meet the needs of the Kosovar refugees.

I fully agree that accurate information on refugee needs is the first step towards meeting their requirements. For this reason, we have placed AID Disaster Assistance Response Teams in Macedonia and Albania to assess refugee needs and request assistance on a daily basis. The disaster teams are communicating the requirements directly to the Coordination Council that I asked Brian Atwood to lead.

We have provided almost \$130 million in humanitarian assistance in the past two months, including food aid, humanitarian daily rations, and health, water and sanitation programs. Through non-governmental and international organizations, we are providing services in refugee camps and transit centers, and the Defense Department is constructing new camps. The continued flow of refugees, the strain on the neighboring states and the plight of the people who remain inside Kosovo all require that we continue to do more, in partnership with other nations. My supplemental budget request will help significantly in this regard.

I look forward to your continued support for our assistance efforts.
