Biographic Statement of Paul M. Cleveland

Ambassador Paul Cleveland serves as President of the United States-New Zealand Council.

Prior to taking on leadership of the Council in October, 1994, Ambassador Cleveland served for thirty seven years as a Foreign Service Officer, for the most part working on East Asian and Pacific affairs. His most recent Foreign Service assignments were as Coordinator for Export Controls and then as Coordinator for Business Affairs at the Department of State from 1992 to 1994. He was Ambassador to New Zealand and Western Samoa from 1986 to 1989, and Ambassador to Malaysia from 1989 to 1992. Earlier, he was Minister-Counselor and Deputy Chief of Mission in Seoul, Korea, where he also had served as Political Counsellor. Other overseas posts included Canberra, Jakarta and Bonn, interspersed with assignments to the Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs in the Department of State.

Born in Boston in 1931, Ambassador Cleveland attended Yale University, where he earned his B.A. and spent three years following college as a U.S. Air Force pilot. He also has an M.A. degree from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy.

The Ambassador is married to the former Carter Sellwood, and they have four children: Robin, Sandra, James and Peter.

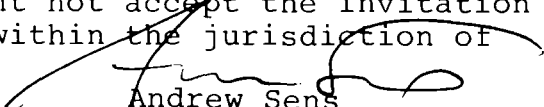

Dear Mr. President:

I write to request your support for a wonderful initiative to honor the brave and heroic veterans of the 65th Infantry Regiment that so valiantly fought for our country in the Korean War.

I have been approached by Mr. Ernie Acosta of the Puerto Rican-American Research Institute, and Mr. Gumersindo Gómez, of the Puerto Rican Veterans Association of Massachusetts, Inc. They have developed a proposal to honor "The Borinqueneers," as this U.S. Army unit comprised of Puerto Ricans was known.

Their plan entails locating the surviving veterans of the 65th and inviting them to a ceremony in Washington to honor the 743 dead, and 2,797 who were wounded defending the highest ideals of our country. I fully support their proposal and respectfully request that you direct the Department of Defense, the Department of Veterans Affairs and other related agencies to explore the possibility of providing some of the resources that would make such activity a reality.

Cognizant of your extremely busy schedule I respectfully ask that you consider attending such ceremony. The date of the ceremony would be established around your schedule.

Along with Governor Rosselló of Puerto Rico, a representative of the people of Korea, and the Puerto Rican Members of Congress you would be invited to place a permanent plaque in memory of the 65th at the Korean War Veterans Memorial.

As you know, Puerto Rican soldiers have fought and died in all wars in which the United States has been engaged during this century.

Unfortunately, the participation and sacrifice of the Puerto Rican soldier has largely been ignored.

As a tested and true friend of the Puerto Rican people, you may be in a position to right this wrong.

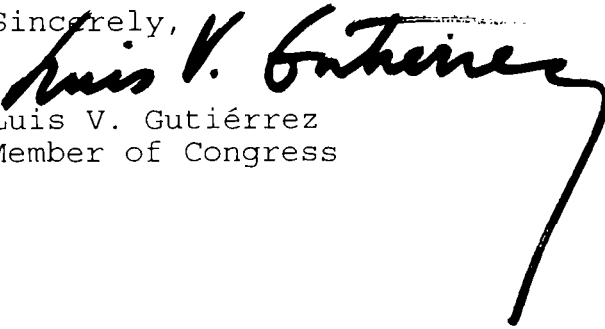

THE 65TH UNITED STATES INFANTRY REGIMENT

On September 20th, 1950 the fighting all Puerto Rican 65th U.S. Infantry Regiment arrived in Pusan, Korea, ready for battle. Nicknamed "The Boringueneers", the regiment was immediately sent north to the front lines.

The 65th rescued the 1st Marine Division from Hagaru-ri where the division had been surrounded by Chinese military forces. The 65th provided a safe corridor for the Marines to escape and formed the protective rear guard during the retreat to Hungnam. After bitter fighting and with Chinese forces on their heels, the 65th, was the last regiment to leave the beachhead in the Christmas Eve evacuation of Hungnam on December 24th, 1950.

During "Operation Exploitation", under the command of General Matthew B. Ridgway, the 65th, at times, provided the forward forces between the Chinese Armies and the American Eighth Army. As General W.W. Harris put it, "The Boringueneers prove to be courageous, determined, self-reliant, and effective combat soldiers. They were fearless."

One hundred and twenty-five soldiers of the 65th were awarded the Silver Star and four the Distinguished Service Cross. For their heroism in battle the men of the 65th were showered with accolades, but the most famous and important letter came from General Douglas MacArthur.

The 65th had been ordered into R&R behind the front lines and chose to relocate near the Command Post (CP) of the Third U. S. Infantry Division. During the night the CP was attacked by over a thousand North Korean troops who had penetrated the front line without being detected. One wonders how such a large enemy force was able to do this. Once alerted the 65th went into action and attacked and destroyed the North Korean force, thereby, saving the 3rd Division Commander and his entire staff from being killed or captured. Two Generals wrote Letters of commendation citing the Third U.S. Infantry Division but they neglected to mention the 65th Regiment. A few days later the men of the 65th received a letter from General MacArthur.

On February 10, 1951, General MacArthur, who had rejected the 65th for combat in World War II wrote, "The Puerto Ricans forming the ranks of the gallant 65th Infantry on the battlefields of Korea by valor, determination and a resolute will to victory give daily testament to their invincible loyalty to the United States and the fervor of their devotion to those immutable standards of human relations to which the Americans and Puerto Ricans are in common dedicated. They are writing a brilliant record of

achievement in battle and I am proud indeed to have them in this command. I wish that we might have many more like them."

Prior to the Korean War the assignments of the 65th Infantry were not those given to units with a reputation as fighters. In fact, the Pentagon brass referred to the 65th as the "rum and Coca Cola" regiment. It seems the Pentagon was unaware that the people of Puerto Rico were fierce fighters who had driven-off the English, French, Dutch, and Danish would-be invaders from their island long before the American Revolution. In the Spanish-American War Puerto Ricans welcomed the Americans as liberators from Spain's oppression. They chose a flag that stands for independence, freedom, and democracy rather than one that stood for oppression and colonialism.

The 65th Infantry Regiment casualties were 743 killed and 2,797 wounded. To put it in a more meaningful perspective there was one casualty for every 660 island inhabitants, compared to one casualty for every 1,125 inhabitants of the United States.

In his book, "Puerto Rico's Fighting 65th U.S. Infantry," Brigadier General W.W. Harris (Ret.) writes, "No ethnic group has greater pride in itself and its heritage than the Puerto Rican people. Nor have I encountered any that can be more dedicated and zealous in support of the democratic principles for which the United States stands. Many Puerto Ricans have fought to the death to uphold them." General Harris was the commanding officer of the 65th during the Korean War.

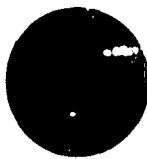

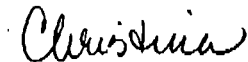

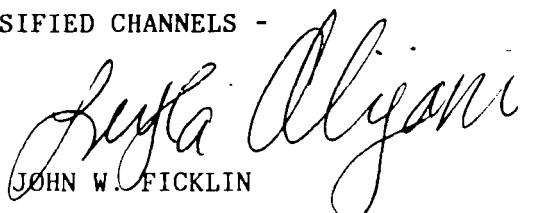
