SUBJECT: DEDICATION OF KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL IN
WASHINGTON

1. SUMMARY. PREPARATIONS ARE WELL ADVANCED FOR THE DEDICATION OF A MEMORIAL TO VETERANS OF THE 1950-53 KOREAN CONFLICT ON JULY 27, 1995 ON THE MALL IN WASHINGTON BY THE PRESIDENT AND PRESIDENT KIM YOUNG SAM OF THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA. GENERAL RAYMOND DAVIS USMC (RET.), THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRESIDENTIALLY-COMMISSIONED KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL ADVISORY BOARD, HAS WRITTEN TO THE AMBASSADORS OF THE TWENTY COUNTRIES THAT, IN ADDITION TO THE UNITED STATES AND THE ROK, CONTRIBUTED TROOPS TO THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND, INVITING EACH AMBASSADOR (OR OTHER OFFICIAL EMBASSY REPRESENTATIVE) TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEDICATION AND RELATED EVENTS. ACTION POSTS MAY ASSURE HOST GOVERNMENTS THAT THE US GOVERNMENT FULLY SUPPORTS GENERAL DAVIS'S INITIATIVE, AND HOPES THAT EACH WILL BE OFFICIALLY REPRESENTED BY RESIDENT AMBASSADORS OR OTHER APPROPRIATE EMBASSY REPRESENTATIVES. END SUMMARY.

2. ON OCTOBER 28, 1986, CONGRESS PASSED LEGISLATION

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AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL ON THE MALL IN WASHINGTON, D.C. THE LAW CREATED A PRESIDENTIAL BOARD, THE KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL ADVISORY BOARD, TO IMPLEMENT THIS LEGISLATION. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRESIDENTIAL BOARD IS MARINE CORPS GENERAL RAYMOND G. DAVIS {RET.}

3. THE MEMORIAL NOW NEARING COMPLETION NEAR THE LINCOLN MEMORIAL WILL BE JOINTLY DEDICATED BY THE PRESIDENT AND PRESIDENT KIM YOUNG-SAM OF THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA ON THURSDAY, JULY 27TH, 1995. PRESIDENT KIM WILL BE IN THE UNITED STATES ON A STATE VISIT AT THAT TIME.

4. TWENTY NATIONS BESIDES THE U.S. AND THE ROK SENT UNITS IN SUPPORT OF THE UNITED NATIONS CAUSE DURING THE KOREAN WAR {SEE PARAGRAPH 10, BELOW}. FIFTEEN OF THESE NATIONS CONTRIBUTED GROUND FORCES. SOME OF THESE UNITS SUFFERED HEAVY CASUALTIES. THE KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL WILL INCLUDE INSCRIPTIONS COMMEMORATING THE CONTRIBUTION OF EACH OF THE ALLIED NATIONS.

5. OTHER KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL DEDICATION EVENTS INCLUDE A RECEPTION FOR KOREAN WAR VETERANS HOSTED BY PRESIDENT KIM, AND A GALA PERFORMANCE AT THE KENNEDY CENTER, FEATURING U.S. AND KOREAN ENTERTAINERS. A "PUSAN TENT CITY" WITH EXHIBITIONS AND VETERANS GROUP CENTERS WILL BE ESTABLISHED ON THE MALL, AND THERE WILL BE A "MUSTER" OF VETERANS UNITS {INCLUDING FOREIGN UNITS} ON THE GROUNDS OF THE WASHINGTON MONUMENT.

6. THERE WILL ALSO BE A PARADE ON CONSTITUTION AVENUE ON SATURDAY, JULY 29. IT WILL INCLUDE REPRESENTATIVE VETERANS UNITS FROM ALL OF THE ALLIED COUNTRIES; IN ADDITION, SIXTEEN OF THE ALLIED NATIONS HAVE INDICATED THAT THEY WILL SEND ACTIVE DUTY BAND, HONOR GUARD, AND/OR OTHER MILITARY UNITS TO PARTICIPATE. OVER 200,000 U.S. KOREAN WAR VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES, IN ADDITION TO SEVERAL THOUSAND VETERANS FROM KOREA AND OTHER ALLIED COUNTRIES, ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND THE MEMORIAL DEDICATION ACTIVITIES.

7. GENERAL DAVIS HAS WRITTEN TO THE RESIDENT AMBASSADORS OF EACH COUNTRY THAT CONTRIBUTED UNITS TO THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND, INFORMING THEM OF THE DEDICATION AND INVITING THEIR GOVERNMENT TO DESIGNATE AN OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVE TO THE CEREMONIES.

{BEGIN TEXT}

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DEAR MR. AMBASSADOR:

PRESIDENT CLINTON AND REPUBLIC OF KOREA PRESIDENT KIM YOUNG-SAM WILL DEDICATE A KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL ON THE MALL ON JULY 27, 1995. THE MEMORIAL HAS BEEN CONSTRUCTED PURSUANT TO 1986 LEGISLATION WHICH ALSO ESTABLISHED THE KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL ADVISORY BOARD, OF WHICH I AM THE CHAIRMAN.

ALTHOUGH THE MEMORIAL IS PRIMARILY INTENDED TO RENDER A PROUD SALUTE TO MEMBERS OF THE U.S. ARMED FORCES WHO SERVED IN THE KOREAN WAR, IT WILL ALSO RECOGNIZE THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE OTHER 21 NATIONS WHO CONTRIBUTED FORCES TO THE U.N. COMMAND DURING THE KOREAN CONFLICT. THE NAMES OF EACH OF THE ALLIED NATIONS ARE ETCHED INTO GRANITE STONE ALONG THE ENTRANCE WALKWAY, SEPARATED BY A REPLICA OF THE U.N. LOGO.

MY COLLEAGUES AND I WOULD BE HONORED IF YOU (OR YOUR EMBASSY DESIGNEE) WOULD REPRESENT YOUR NATION AT THE DEDICATION OF THE MEMORIAL. THE ENCLOSED MATERIAL PROVIDES MORE COMPLETE INFORMATION ON THE EVENTS WE ARE PLANNING TO HONOR THE VETERANS FROM ALL OF THE COUNTRIES WHICH DEFENDED THE CAUSE OF FREEDOM ON THE KOREAN PENINSULA. OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ROBERT HANSEN, IS LOOKING FORWARD TO WORKING WITH YOUR STAFF. HE MAY BE REACHED AT (202) 208-3561 FOR FURTHER DETAILS.

MR. AMBASSADOR, I LOOK FORWARD TO YOUR NATION BEING REPRESENTED AT THIS HISTORIC EVENT, AND SHARING IN THIS TRIBUTE TO ALL OF THE VETERANS WHO BRAVELY FOUGHT AND SERVED TOGETHER IN KOREA.

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DAVIS'S INITIATIVE. WE HOPE THAT EACH WILL BE OFFICIALLY REPRESENTED AT THE JULY 27 DEDICATION OF THE KOREAN WAR MEMORIAL IN WASHINGTON BY RESIDENT AMBASSADORS OR OTHER APPROPRIATE REPRESENTATIVES.

9. POSTS ARE REQUESTED TO CHECK THAT APPROPRIATE FOREIGN AND/OR DEFENSE MINISTRY OFFICIALS ARE AWARE OF THE INVITATION, ANSWER QUESTIONS AS NECESSARY, ADVISE THE DEPARTMENT HOW THE HOST COUNTRY GOVERNMENT EXPECTS TO BE REPRESENTED AT THE DEDICATION OF THE MEMORIAL, AND CONFIRM THAT THE HOST COUNTRY'S EMBASSY IN WASHINGTON IS THE APPROPRIATE POINT OF CONTACT FOR THE KOREAN WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL ADVISORY BOARD. YOU SHOULD NOT ENCOURAGE REPRESENTATION FROM CAPITALS, PBUT PLEASE REPORT INFORMATION, IF AVAILABLE, ON ANY HOST COUNTRY VIP'S {APART FROM THE OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVE} WHO PLAN TO ATTEND THE MEMORIAL DEDICATION. PLEASE SLUG REPLIES FOR EAP/K {RICHARD MCCRENSKY}.

10. FYI: IN ADDITION TO THE UNITED STATES AND THE ROK, FIFTEEN OTHER NATIONS PROVIDED COMBAT UNITS TO THE U.N. COMMAND DURING THE KOREAN WAR: AUSTRALIA, BELGIUM, CANADA, COLOMBIA, ETHIOPIA, FRANCE, GREECE, LUXEMBOURG, NETHERLANDS, NEW ZEALAND, PHILIPPINES, SOUTH AFRICA, THAILAND, TURKEY, AND THE UNITED KINGDOM. DENMARK, INDIA, ITALY, NORWAY, AND SWEDEN DID NOT PROVIDE COMBAT TROOPS, BUT FURNISHED MEDICAL UNITS. YY

SUBJECT: Commerce Secretary Brown's Upcoming Trips

Thank you for soliciting the NSC's thoughts on the two upcoming trips by Secretary Brown to South Korea/China in July and to Africa in October. The NSC had not been informed previously by Commerce of either trip.

I have some serious concerns regarding the timing of the trip to China. The trip is scheduled in the same timeframe as the Hill debates on China MFN and risks giving additional fodder to those Members and others who already accuse the Administration of putting economic and business interests ahead of human rights concerns. I have asked Commerce to determine whether the trip could be delayed until August or September.

Regarding the October trip to Africa, you should discuss this with Ab Mikva, who expressed concerns.

SUBJECT: Secretarial Conversation Follow-up

The Secretary appreciates your helpful intervention in resolving the situation surrounding the Senegal Mission. At his request, I am writing to confirm his agreement with you concerning the provision of Presidential Mission designation and military aircraft support for our July Asia mission and our October Africa mission.

On July 12 - 21, 1995 the Secretary will lead a Delegation of U.S. business and government leaders to Seoul, South Korea and the People's Republic of China. The mission, comprised of 25-30 senior corporate executives and 5-10 U.S. government officials, is a follow-up to our highly successful trip to China last August, and will include the annual meeting of a U.S.-China Joint Commission on Commerce Trade as well as comprehensive advocacy efforts.

In October, Secretary Brown plans to lead another high-level mission to five African countries including Cote D'Ivoire, Ghana, Uganda, Botswana and South Africa where he will participate with the Vice President in the Gore-Mbeki Binational Commission meeting. Again, we expect to have a delegation of 25-30 senior corporate executives and 5-10 U.S. government officials.

Your prompt confirmation of the Presidential Business Development Mission designation for both trips and your commitment of C-137 aircraft on a non-reimbursable basis for both missions is essential to the success of our trips. Once again, thank you for your invaluable assistance and I look forward to speaking with you early next week.
