SUBJECT: Korean War Memorial Dedication

Presidents Clinton and Kim will attend the dedication of the Korean War Memorial on July 27. Veterans from at least 15 of the 20 other nations allied with U.S. and ROK forces during the war will be in attendance. The **Presidential Commission of the Korean War Veterans Memorial** has invited the **Ambassadors** of the 20 nations (see Tab A), and also is aware that the **Crown Princes of Belgium and Luxembourg** are interested in attending the dedication.

However, the participation of President Kim raises the issue of the desirability of **inviting foreign leaders** of all Korean War allied nations. There are four options:

1. Invite to Heads of Government. Inviting heads of government avoids any criticism of excluding other leaders from nations which were involved in this UN war effort.

However, the ceremony is not the occasion of a "milestone" commemorative date (e.g., 50th) for which foreign leaders normally gather; indeed, the event is for the **dedication of a memorial to U.S. veterans**, and President Kim is present to represent the nation the veterans defended. It also would be difficult to avoid bilateral meetings with leaders who attended during a period when the President is already committed to Kim's visit.

2. Invitation by either Secretary Perry or Secretary Brown to their counterparts. This option provides the opportunity for high-level representation by all nations involved in the war.

However, since the combat contribution of nations varied significantly (e.g., five nations provided medical units only), Ministers of Defense might not be the most applicable representatives. At the same time, some nations which provided considerable combat troop support might deem their MOD a more

appropriate representative than their secretary of veteran affairs.

3. Invite unspecified Foreign Representation by the Secretary of State. Permitting each nation to choose its appropriate non-Head of Government representative avoids any possible sensitivity about various nations' level of participation (e.g., Sweden is not particularly keen on emphasizing its participation in the war). An invite by Secretary Christopher also will emphasize our acknowledgment of the contributions other nations have made to past coalition efforts.

4. Leave Invite at Ambassadorial level. This is the easiest for all concerned. However, there already have been indications from Belgium and Luxembourg that there exists a higher level of interest in attending. Inviting their Crown Princes exclusive of a similar offer to other nations may cause some disgruntlement.

The NSC staff recommends option 3, followed by option 4. Option 3 combines sufficient import to the contribution of other nations to the war, with the flexibility for each nation to determine its level of participation.

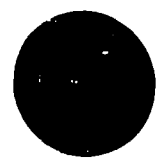

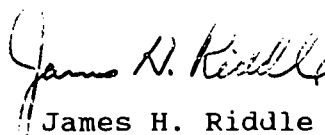

SUBJECT: Funding for Nuclear Material Control Initiatives

Pursuant to the NSC Deputies Committee meeting on Wednesday, December 21, 1994, the following arrangements have been made for FY 1995 and FY 1996 funding of high-priority nuclear material control initiatives with Russia and other FSU states.

For FY 1995:

- Government-to-Government Materials Control and Accounting (MC&A) Assistance: DOD has allocated \$29 million in prior-year unobligated balances from the Nunn-Lugar account to cover the costs of the U.S.-Russia government-to-government MC&A agreements. Another \$15 million in Nunn-Lugar prior-year unobligated balances was allocated for assistance to non-Russian NIS for MC&A.
- Lab-to-Lab: DOD has allocated \$15 million from FY 1995 Nunn-Lugar appropriations for DOE's Lab-to-Lab program of MC&A assistance to Russia. DOE has allocated \$6.8 million of its own funds in FY 1995 for this activity.
- Mutual Reciprocal Inspections and Stockpile Transparency/Irreversibility: DOD and DOE have allocated \$1.0 million and \$5.7 million respectively for these activities to develop with Russia mutual confidence in nuclear weapon dismantlement, a regime to promote confidence that newly produced plutonium from certain reactors is not used in new weapons, and other related purposes.
- Export Control Assistance: DOD has allocated \$24 million in prior-year unobligated balances from the Nunn-Lugar account for this activity. No FY 1995 Nunn-Lugar appropriations have been allocated for export control assistance.

For FY 1996:

- Government-to-Government MC&A Assistance: DOE is requesting \$20 million in its FY 1996 Budget for this activity to expand the effort begun with Nunn-Lugar funds to additional sites in Russia. The FY 1996 DOD budget request was reduced by \$20 million to reflect this transfer of responsibility to DOE.
- Lab-to-Lab: DOE is requesting \$40 million in its FY 1996 budget for this activity.
- Assistance to GAN(Russia's nuclear regulatory agency): DOE is requesting \$10 million in its budget to assist GAN in strengthening its primary regulatory and nuclear materials control functions. This builds upon activities begun by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission with DOD (Nunn-Lugar) funds. The FY 1996 DOD budget request was reduced by \$10 million to reflect this transfer of responsibility to DOE.
- Mutual Reciprocal Inspections and Stockpile Transparency/Irreversibility: DOE will request \$5.8 million for these activities, while Defense will request \$5.1 million.
- Export Control Assistance: State Department will request \$15 million for FY 1996 in the foreign assistance Nonproliferation and Disarmament Fund (NDF) for this activity.
