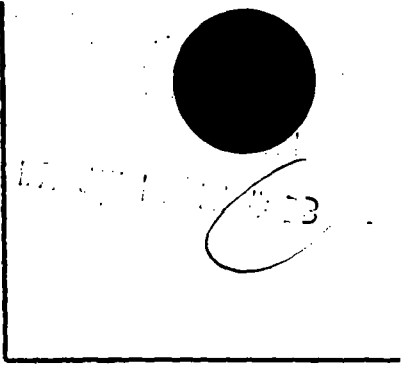

The 2.1 million members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States are surprised, indeed shocked, by the recent turn of events at Panmunjon. The breakdown of POW/MIA talks, occasioned by unjustified and exorbitant demands by the KPA negotiators, have left America's veterans questioning the efficacy and sincerity of your government's August 25, 1993 agreement with the UN side concerning the bilateral effort to recover our POW/MIAs.

We cannot understand how the DPRK would not willingly resolve this minor issue in order to move forward on this humanitarian issue. Your country had everything to gain by keeping this agreement and a failure to return to the principles embodied in the August 1993 agreement will depreciate the stature of the DPRK and will damage world opinion of your country.

On behalf of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, I urge you to communicate our views to the leadership of your country and to express our shock and dismay at the position the KPA negotiators have taken concerning the POW/MIA issue. We certainly hope the Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea will soon change the KPA position for your country has everything to gain -- or to lose -- by helping to resolve this high priority humanitarian issue.
